In this Edition

The controversies revolving around the Diamer Bhasha Dam refuse to die down. In September 2012, reports surfaced suggesting that Japan and the United States are keen to invest in this mega project. According to initial reports, Japan had shown interest in providing machinery for the Diamer Bhasha dam worth \$ 4 billion and also assist in upgrading the capacity of the Mangla Dam in the so called 'AJK'. Later however, the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) came out denying any such funding plan. The agency clearly stated that it has given no such promise to Pakistan on the dam project. On the other side, there were reports that Asian Development Bank (ADB) has raised objections on Pakistan seeking funds from China for the Diamer Bhasha dam without competitive bidding. The bank made it clear that it would not be able to provide funds for the project if Pakistan does not exercise transparency in the funding procedures. There was a possibility that the bank could walk out of the project. However, subsequent reports suggested otherwise.

Meanwhile, the section of population affected due to the raising of the Mangla dam has demanded that a detailed schedule for the rehabilitation process must be outlined by the government of the so called AJK. There has been growing resentment over the inordinate delay in the rehabilitation process and people have threatened to launch protest movement against the state authorities in AJK.

Amidst growing concerns that Gilgit Baltistan might turn out to be another Balochistan, as indicated by reports included in the current issue, there are rising fears on the overall security situation in the PoK region. Transporters in the area have demanded that sensitive stretches leading towards Gilgit Baltistan be manned by security forces to ensure safe transit for the trucks.

Appointment of DG LG&RD: AJK Service Tribunal suspends notification

MUZAFFARABAD: The AJK Service Tribunal on September 3 suspended an allegedly controversial official notification whereby the charge of the post of Director General (DG) Local Government and Rural Development (LG&RD) department was given to an officer from the engineering unit, triggering a strike by administration unit officials. On August 10, the government transferred LG&RD department's in-charge DG Ghulam Murtaza as an officer on special duty (OSD) and assigned the additional charge of the post to Kamran Hafeez, a superintending engineer (SE) of the department. The order, which was stated to be in violation of an earlier judgment of the Service Tribunal and the Supreme Court, created a state of chaos in the LG&RD department as officers of administration unit not only went on strike but also formed an 'action committee' to fight it tooth and nail.

Amendments in AJK interim constitution after consensus: Wattoo

ISLAMABAD: Kashmir Affairs and Gilgit-Baltistan (GB), Minister Manzoor Ahmad Wattoo stated that the amendments in Interim 1974 Constitutional Act of Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK) will be made after taking all political parties on board. He was addressing a press conference after chairing a meeting of AJK All Parties Conference (APC) held on August 30. The conference was attended by heads of all parties of Azad Jammu and Kashmir to discuss the matter of amendments. Wattoo noted before the media that the meeting decided to gather all recommendations

and dispatched them to already formed parliamentary committee having representation of all parties. He stated the committee would submit its report within two months to leadership in Pakistan, which would take the final decision on amendments.

Zafar Bhutta, Diamer Bhasha Dam: Govt to approach China, local banks for financing

ISLAMABAD: With power shortage increasing continuously in the face of rising consumer demand, the government has decided to seek financing from China for the mega \$13 billion Diamer Bhasha Dam with power production capacity of 4,500 megawatts and also take loans from domestic commercial banks by offering guarantees.

According to sources, Prime Minister Raja Pervez Ashraf would place a request before his Chinese counterpart during the visit on September 10 for financing the Diamer Bhasha Dam, for which multilateral donors including the World Bank and Asian Development Bank (ADB) had sought no-objection certificate (NOC) from India due to the dam "being situated in a disputed territory".

Ahmed Ali-Aafani, Sectarian imbroglio

Nestled in the northern Karakoram-Himalayan region of the subcontinent, Gilgit and Baltistan remained a strategic part of Dogra-ruled Jammu and Kashmir prior to the territory's self-generated independence in 1947-48. When a local group led by Col Hassan Khan of Kashmir's Fourth Regiment in Gilgit revolted against Maharaja Hari Singh, the then ruler of Kashmir, they initially desired to set up Gilgit and Baltistan as an independent state. Impressed by the leadership of Mohammad Ali Jinnah and because of religious affiliations, the region opted to accede to Pakistan hoping to achieve greater spiritual and religious freedom. In terms of commerce, the markets of Srinagar and Leh in Jammu & Kashmir were geographically closer and more accessible to the

area than Abbottabad and Rawalpindi. Yet ever since the 1988 massacre of Shia Muslims in Gilgit and Jalalabad during the military regime of Gen Zia ul Haq, journeying on the Karakoram Highway (passing through Kohistan and now Naran) has over time become a perilous exercise.

Non-duty paid vehicles: FBR launches recovery drive for generating Rs 50 billion

The Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has launched country-wide recovery drive against non-duty paid smuggled vehicles for generating additional revenue of around Rs 50 billion during 2012-2013. Sources noted that the FBR has started cross matching of data with the provincial excise and taxation departments.

The FBR will be able to trace the owners of such vehicles with the help of provincial database. In this regard, the FBR has also approached the government of Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK). Out of every 500 imported vehicles, duties and taxes have been paid on 200 vehicles and remaining 300 are mostly non-duty paid smuggled cars. This is not any kind of amnesty scheme as the duties and taxes alongwith redemption fine would be recovered from the date of registration or import of the non-duty paid vehicle. The FBR has not offered any special concessions in taxes to the owners of the non-duty paid smuggled cars, sources stated.

An ambitious project to start a bus service, travelling nearly 6,500km from Mirpur, the largest city in Azad Kashmir - a self-governing territory under the control of Pakistan and part of the larger state of Kashmir administered by Pakistan - to Birmingham has been announced.

Mirpur, located in the north-east of Pakistan, at the

foothills of the Himalayas, has a large expatriate community in Birmingham and the city is therefore often referred to as Little England or Little Birmingham. The bus service, if established and when it is started, will easily be Britain's longest bus route, taking 12 days to cross five countries (Afghanistan, Iran, Turkey, Serbia and Belgium). Passengers will be charged £130 for a ticket, as reported. Mirpur's transport minister, Tahir Khokherc, added that arrangements for sightseeing could also be made and he called the journey a "thrilling" ride.

He also stated there would be two stopovers - one at Quetta, near the Afghan border and in the Iranian capital of Tehran.

Zafar Bhutta, Seeking brownie points: Govt seeks to earn carbon credits on Kohala project

ISLAMABAD: The government has decided to earn carbon credits under the United Nationssponsored clean development mechanism on the 1,100-megawatt Kohala hydropower project located in Muzaffarabad, Azad Kashmir.

In a report submitted to the Ministry of Water and Power, the Water and Power Development Authority (Wapda) stated it had hired consultants to register the Kohala project with the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change in an attempt to claim carbon credits as provided under the clean development mechanism (CDM) of Kyoto Protocol.

The CDM allows rich countries to offset some of their carbon emissions by investing in climate-friendly projects, such as hydroelectric power and wind farms, in developing countries. This has resulted in collective investments of \$215 billion in about 4,500 projects in 75 developing countries. According to reports, these projects have reduced carbon dioxide emissions by one billion tons, which would otherwise have gone into the atmosphere.

Bhasha, Dasu dams fate in doldrums as IFIs denying funds

ISLAMABAD: Playing with the future of motherland vis-à-vis its pursuits of accomplishing energy needs and goal-oriented food security plans, International Financial Institutions (IFIs) are out to throw Pakistan into the rock-bottom depths of darkness through their sick-minded and ill-conceived conspiratorial policies and devilish demeanours to jeopardise the energy scenario in the country. ISLAMABAD: The Federal Board of Revenue has proposed to the Ministry of Finance an amnesty scheme for legalization of around 800 non-duty paid smuggled vehicles in Gilgit-Baltistan. Sources noted on September 25 that

New financiers: US, Japan pledge assistance for Diamer Bhasha Dam

ISLAMABAD: In related developments, an official of the Economic Affairs Division (EAD) told a parliamentary pane on September 12 that Japan has agreed to provide machinery and equipment worth \$4 billion for the Diamer Bhasha Dam. While addressing the panel, he also stated that Japan had agreed to cooperate in extending the power generation capacity of the Mangla dam. While briefing the Senate Standing Committee on Water and Power, the EAD official added that the US Agency for International Development had committed \$200 million, and the Islamic Development Bank (IDB) had committed \$100 million for the Diamer Bhasha project.

Khalid Mustafa Japan denies it made \$4 bn offer for Bhasha dam

ISLAMABAD: It has now been confirmed that the Senate Committee on Water and Power was misinformed by the Economic Affairs Division (EAD) when it was told that Japan had agreed to provide \$4 billion for the Bhasha dam as Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) has denied it officially. The impression that Japan has taken the lead by agreeing to provide funds of \$4 billion for machinery and equipments including turbines for the much touted Diamer-Bhasha dam was given by EAD officials but a JICA spokesman noted that Tokyo had not given such a nod to Pakistan. The controversy over Japan funding the Bhasha dam emerged when a senior EAD official informed the Senate Committee meeting that Japan had come forward and agreed to help install the electro-mechanical system of the dam which includes the 12 power turbines, each with a capacity of 375MW and to this effect it would provide \$4 billion credit line.

Zafar Bhutta, Neelum-Jhelum: Abu Dhabi Fund withholds \$100 million loan for power project

ISLAMABAD: The Abu Dhabi Fund (ADF) has withheld a \$100 million loan it had pledged for the construction of the 969 megawatt Neelum-Jhelum hydropower project in Azad Jammu and Kashmir, a parliamentary panel was informed on September 28. The ADF provides development aid to developing countries in the form of concessionary loans and grants on behalf of the Abu Dhabi government.

"The loan agreement of \$100 million is pending with the ADF because it has linked it to the resolution of payment issue with Etisalat in the PTCL privatisation process," Lt Gen (R) Muhammad Zubair, the managing director of Neelum-Jhelum hydropower company, noted before the National Assembly Standing Committee on Economic Affairs Division. Zubair informed the committee, which met under the chairmanship of Pirzada Imran Ahmed Shah, that the loan agreement of \$448 million with Exim Bank China was also pending as China State Council was yet to give the go-ahead.

present in Azad Kashmir. "The allegation that Chinese soldiers are present in the Azad Kashmir is entirely groundless," Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman Hong Lei stated. Hong first skipped answering a question on Gen Singh's charge at a media briefing in Beijing, but later sent an e-mail to a news agency denying the allegation. While denying the Chinese troops' presence, Hong stated that China's stand on Kashmir remained clear and consistent that it was an issue to be resolved by India and Pakistan through negotiations. "Kashmir is left over (by history) between India and Pakistan. As a neighbour of India and Pakistan, China maintains that the relevant issue be resolved through dialogue and negotiations between India and Pakistan."

Mangla Dam Raising Project: Affected families to launch protests from September 21

MIRPUR: People affected by the Mangla Dam Raising Project (MDRP) have threatened to launch a protest movement against the Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK) government from September 21 if it fails to give them a schedule for the completion of their rehabilitation. Addressing a news conference at the Mirpur Press Club on September 14, representatives of over 100 affected families and heads of various action committees fighting for their rights announced that they would hold antigovernment rallies across the district and hold a sitin outside the Prime Minister House if development work at New Mirpur City is not resumed and if they are not given a schedule for the completion of their rehabilitation. They also stated they would resist filling of the dam to its maximum level (1,242 feet) if their demands were not met.
