Multiple reports in the current issue indicate that the United States has finally agreed to participate in funding the controversial Diamer Bhasha dam project. Statements given by the US Ambassador to Pakistan, Richard Olson, that the issue would be taken up during the US-Pakistan Economic Working Group meeting to be held in Washington in December 2012 hint at growing interest of US in such projects. Pakistan is keen to have US on board so as to induce other international agencies such as the IMF (International Monetary Fund) and the World Bank to provide funds for raising this ambitious project. Besides, the US has already given \$ 150 million for the expansion of the Mangla Dam located in the so called AJK. Given that the Chinese presence in PoK is already entrenched, the emerging interest of US in the region is likely to unfold interesting geopolitical dynamics in the coming days.

A two-day conference comprising delegates from both J&K and PoK was held at Muzaffarabad on November 6-7, 2012. The symposium jointly organised by the AJK Women for Peace Organization and sponsored by a German organization, Friedrich Naumann Foundation (FNF) caught media attention as it was first of its kind- a peace conference comprising only women delegates with a cross section representation from academia and civil society. The conference deliberated on important issues- the focus being on the humanitarian side where participants urged easing up cross LoC movement and setting up of a task force to address such problems.

The dilemma over levying taxes in Gilgit Baltistan continues. There is a raging debate on whether it is appropriate to impose taxes in the region keeping in view its ambiguous political and constitutional status.

Diamer-Bhasha dam still top priority, says Wapda chief

The Nation, November 28, 2012

LAHORE: Wapda chairman Raghib Shah reiterated that construction of Diamer-Bhasha dam is top priority of the government. In a media briefing at Wapda House on November 27, he stated that land acquisition and infrastructure development work in the project area was in progress. "Process to acquire land both in Gilgit Balitistan and KP was continuing. The work on 14 local contracts is in full swing for construction of model villages for affectees, Wapda offices and colonies, contractor's camps, road, etc. in the project area. Expression of Interest (EoI) had also been called for consultancy of the project," he noted. So far, no international lending agency has committed funding for \$13 billion Bhasha project owing to Indian propaganda that the dam is being constructed on disputed territory. There are reports the government is losing interest on the construction of the dam.

"World Bank has not directly refused funding for the Diamer-Bhasha," replied Raghid Shah on a question about the project but he refused to comment when asked why India was opposing the construction of the dam.

Wapda welcomes investment in Diamer-Bhasha dam project

ISLAMABAD: The Water and Power Development Authority (Wapda) has welcomed investment in construction of Diamer-Bhasha dam by any local financial institution as the government attaches high priority to execution of the project. Central Directorate of National Savings (CDNS) Director General Zafar Iqbal recently stated that CDNS was ready to invest in Diamer-Bhasha dam.

A Wapda spokesman has clarified that sometimes back the CDNS DG had expressed desire for investment of CDNS funds in Diamer-Bhasha dam project. However, during the course of meetings with Wapda officers, CDNS DG subsequently expressed his inability to make direct investment of funds in Diamer-Bhasha dam project.

Pak-US strategic dialogue resumption with energy talks

ISLAMABAD: American diplomats hint at some big news on Diamer-Bhasha dam financing when Pak-US strategic dialogue resumes with joint working group on Energy meeting in Washington next month. A senior US diplomat on November 26 stated, "You should anticipate some big news," when asked what was extent of American interest in financing the mega hydropower project.

The meeting of the joint working group would take up all areas of energy sector cooperation between Pakistan and United States, stated Ambassador Richard Hoagland, Deputy Head of the US mission in Islamabad. He was chatting with journalists at the 'Independence of Lebanon' ceremony. Dr Asim Hussain, Advisor to the Prime Minister on Petroleum and Natural Resources was chief guest at the event. Hoagland asked to comment on US Ambassador Olson's meeting with Federal Minister for Water and Power Ahmad Mukhtar on very next day of Iranian President Mehamood Ahmedinejad's presser in the capital, he stated it was mere coincidence.

In Gilgit Sunnis hold Muharram procession in defiant of TTP

GILGIT: The religious harmony apparent at a Muharram procession in Gilgit on November 23 suggests the scars left by bloody sectarian strife do not have to haunt the region and its people forever. Dozens of Sunnis led a mourning procession in the heart of the city, where until recently Shias and Sunnis were victims of violent incidents stagemanaged by extremist elements. The move is also a blow to the Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP), which had threatened to attack Muharram processions in Gilgit-Baltistan. G-B s administration was informed of these threats in a letter by the interior ministry last week. A Sunni delegation comprising elders and the youth from Kashrote and Yadgar areas convened at the Imambargah in Majini Muhalla, where they joined hundreds of mourners.

Shabbir Mir, IED explodes near Gilgit Police Lines

GILGIT: Panic swept through Gilgit town on November 23 evening after a homemade explosive device, exploded in a house situated close to the Police Lines. "There were no casualties whatsoever," DIG Police Ali Sher noted soon after the blast. While there was no fresh congregation, morning processions were returning to their respective mosques when the blast occurred. "And let me tell you the blast had nothing to do with sectarianism," the DIG clarified, saying that a property dispute had led to the blast as certain people from Gilgit Baltistan wanted possession of the house. The house bombed was located near the Police Lines at Konodas area.

Human rights in Gilgit-Baltistan

GENEVA: As the general security situation

deteriorates in South Asia, and particularly in Pakistan, the world is becoming increasingly aware of the, as yet, relatively unknown area of Gilgit-Baltistan of Jammu and Kashmir a region which is administered from Islamabad despite the wishes of the region's peoples.

The increasing presence of Chinese personnel further complicates the situation, adding another dangerous component with the involvement of a third nuclear power in a volatile region. Jurgen Creutzmann, Member of European Parliament and Chairman of the Friends of Gilgit-Baltistan European Union, slammed Pakistan for numerous reports of Human Rights Violations in Gilgit-Baltistan area. He particularly showed concern over incidents of terrorism and sectarian violence perpetrated by armed groups. There has been a major escalation of sectarian violence because of Islamabad's encouragement to fundamentalist Sunni groups. There has been an increase in violence against women and political groups seeking self-rule.

He specifically asked Vice-President/High Representative of the Commission in European Parliament that "why can't International Media and Human Rights Organizations get easy access to Gilgit-Baltistan?" He slammed the Pakistan Government for not giving access to them. He further added, if this continues then Gilgit-Baltistan, heaven on earth, would turn into hell sooner or later.

The committee I propose should be headed by the Leader of the Opposition and should not include any legislator from my party (PPP)," he stated while talking to a group of reporters on November 18.

"If I am proven guilty, I will step down as minister and even quit politics," he added. Mr Zaman reiterated that the artefacts were gifted to him by a former AJK minister and a schoolteacher, belonging to the Neelum valley, and were transported to Muzaffarabad by his staff in his absence.

G-B govt asked to lift ban on gemstones transport

GILGIT: The Trade Development Authority Pakistan (TDAP) has asked the Gilgit-Baltistan (G-B) government to lift its ban on transportation of gemstones. In a letter to the G-B chief secretary, TDAP maintained that the ban should be lifted as it is "illegal" and a violation of the trade policy, adding that transportation of precious stones is not banned anywhere else in the country.

TADP made the request after receiving a letter from the G-B Gemstones and Mineral Association, in which the association urged the authority to play its role in lifting the ban on the transportation of gemstones from G-B, if not on its mining. The association maintained that the ban has left hundreds of locals associated with the industry jobless. G-B hosts over 500 varieties of gemstones including amethyst, aquamarine, spinel, corundum, emerald, garnet, peridot, ruby, pyrite, moonstone, fluorite, pargasite, quartz and tourmalines.

Last year, the G-B Legislative Assembly (GBLA) imposed a ban on mining and transportation of

gemstones from G-B on grounds that the stones are being taken away at throwaway prices, causing great loss to the national exchequer and to the locals. In the ruling, the speaker also noted that a committee comprising members of the Gilgit-Baltistan Council and GBLA will be set up to legislate on the issue.

When contacted, an official of the G-B government, requesting anonymity, noted that the ban on mining and transportation of gemstones will be discussed soon to formulate a policy.

Mohammad Kashif Murtaza, a retired BPS-22 federal secretary who had served as AJK chief secretary from December 2004 to March 2007, will get "perks and privileges in accordance with Management Professional-1 package." It includes Rs 350,000 monthly salary and other benefits, such as official transport and fuel. His job description, according to an S&GAD notification, is "management and development of property and real estate of the AJK government and the AJK Council situated in the jurisdiction of the government of

Pakistan; welfare, improvement of livelihood and settlement of Kashmiri refugees in Pakistan and AJK and any other tasks, the government may assign to him, from time to time."

Zafar Bhutta, Neelum Jhelum project: Pakistan looks to new Chinese leadership for funds

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan hopes that the new Chinese leadership will help clear a \$448 million loan pledged for the strategically important Neelum Jhelum Hydropower project located in Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK). A loan for the 969 megawatt (MW) project had previously been put on the backburner due to a controversy regarding the award of a multibillion rupee project to a Chinese firm. In August 2012, the Supreme Court (SC) of Pakistan had annulled the Rs14 billion 'Safe City Project' for Islamabad due to allegations of corruption. The former Chinese leadership had linked the disbursement of the loan with the award of the Islamabad Safe City project to a Chinese firm. The cancellation of the project meant the loan was withheld.

Tahir Khalil, Senate body now says Pakistan has six provinces

ISLAMABAD: In another blatant blunder after the Interior Ministry declared Kashmir as part of India in its statement in the Supreme Court, a parliamentary body on November 6 declared the Azad Jammu and Kashmir and Gilgit-Baltistan as provinces of Pakistan.

The Senates Standing Committee on Inter-Provincial Coordination on November 6 issued the agenda for its meeting, in which AJK and Gilgit-Baltistan were declared provinces of Pakistan. Besides that, the official communiqué of the committee meeting also says that affairs of six provinces were discussed in the committee. It is interesting to note that the meeting chaired by Senator Farrukh Aqil was also attended by Minister for Inter-Provincial Coordination Mir Hazar Khan Bijarani, PPP Senator Mukhtiar Ahmed and JUI-F's Senator Ghulam Ali, but none of them objected as to when these six provinces were created. Pakistan has never declared AJK as its province nor Gilgit-Baltistan was declared as Pakistan's province.

KP, GB reach agreement on demarcation of boundaries

PESHAWAR: The governments of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Gilgit Baltistan have agreed for demarcation of bounders between the adjunct areas of both the provinces. The KP government has requested GB government for segregation of the areas after some misunderstandings between two governments on the issue of geographical limits. KP government has established 9 checkposts to safeguards Kohistan district from the miscreants attacks which were objected by Gilgit Baltistan. Similarly KP government paid compensation to the persons, which were killed in the jurisdiction of Gilgit Baltistan.

The demarcation of boundaries would be carried out in the areas of Mansehra, Kohistan, Chitral and Baltistan, for which federal government has given approval. Khalid Mustafa Sethi steps up efforts to collect revenue

Shabbir Mir, Federal tax levy: Lawmakers from G-B vague overtax issue

GILGIT: The top brass of Gilgit-Baltistan's (G-B) government remains vague over whether the federal government's decision to impose an income tax has been fully endorsed in the region. "The decision to impose income tax in the region has not yet been taken," Chief Minister Mehdi Shah noted on November 4 when asked if his government was endorsing the decision to impose income tax in G-B, a region whose constitutional status is still ambiguous.

He stated that tax would not be levied without first signing a written agreement between the regional government and the federal government over certain points. Shah's remarks stood in clear contradiction with officials who had confirmed the decision to impose an income tax.

A member of the G-B Council, Amjad Hussain recently confirmed that the decision to impose income tax has been taken and a notification was also issued to this effect. He, however, stated the decision should have been preceded by a written agreement to avoid legal complications that might surface due to G-B's constitutionally disputed status. When the same question was posed before Governor Pir Karam Ali Shah, he neither denied nor accepted that a decision to this effect had been taken.

He, however, noted that "every respectable nation pays taxes to live with honour and dignity so it shouldn't be an issue if we have to pay taxes." The governor further stated that if an income tax was imposed, then the regional government would have sufficient money at its disposal to invest in development projects.

Gilgit-Baltistan: 2010 Flood Victims Are Due To Receive Compensation

Victims of the 2010 floods in Gilgit-Baltistan, Balochistan and Sindh are among those to receive compensation for their losses. The programme awarding the compensations is part of collaboration between the government of Pakistan and international donor agencies. The National Database and Registration Authority (Nadra) has resolved around 377,526 appeals through 'Grievance Redressal System' under the Citizen Damage Compensation Programme (CDCP) Phase-II, a Nadra official stated on November 1.

The CDCP Phase-II of Nadra is designed to give Rs40, 000 in two tranches to the people whose houses were damaged by the floods 2010, the spokesperson stated. Nadra has so far processed a total of 950,523 Watan Cards in the second phase of CDCP, including 9,403 for Azad Kashmir, 4,039 for Gilgit-Baltistan.

US announces \$150 million for Mangla dam expansion

ISLAMABAD: The United States on November 28 announced a grant of 150 million dollars for the expansion of the Mangla Dam power plant. The project is expected to generate 310 megawatts of electricity. Addressing the inauguration ceremony of the project at Mangla Power House, US Ambassador to Pakistan Richard Olson stated the US would provide 150 million dollars for the expansion of the Mangla power station. Olson stated a meeting of the Energy Working Group would be held in Islamabad in December 2012, adding that, the construction of the Diamer-Bhasha Dam was a priority for the US.

Addressing the ceremony, Chairman Water and Power Development Authority (Wapda) Syed Raghib Abbas Shah stated 400 million dollars would be spent on the expansion of the Mangla power house which would be able to provide additional production for the next 40 years.

"The fourth phase expansion work will begin in March 2012," Shah noted.

Moreover, he stated that the feasibility report of five mega projects was in the process of completion. He also noted that in the next five years, 5,000 megawatts electricity would be added to the national grid which would benefit 1 million consumers. While talking to newsmen after inaugurating Mangla powerhouse expansion project, the US Ambassador Richard Olson stated that joint cooperation between Pakistan and the United States is needed to defeat the common danger of terrorism. He further stated his country acknowledged the sacrifices of Pakistan in the war on terrorism. The ambassador noted the United States is ready to help Pakistan overcome energy

crisis and will provide 150 million dollars assistance for up-gradation of Mangla powerhouse.

As the general security situation deteriorates in South Asia, and particularly in Pakistan, the world is becoming increasingly aware of the, as yet, relatively unknown area of Gilgit-Baltistan of Jammu and Kashmir a region which is administered from Islamabad despite the wishes of the region's peoples. The increasing presence of Chinese personnel further complicates the situation, adding another dangerous component with the involvement of a third nuclear power in a volatile region.

He slammed the Pakistan Government for not giving access to them. He added, if this continues then Gilgit-Baltistan, heaven on earth, would turn into hell sooner or later.
