In this Edition

The situation in Gilgit Baltistan is relatively normal after a prolonged period of sectarian unrest and instability. Few mosques in the area which were closed in the aftermath of the sectarian violence have been re-opened and this came across as a welcome sign. The Gilgit Baltistan Legislative Assembly (GBLA) passed a resolution to this effect after which these mosques were re-opened by representatives of the other sects as part of the goodwill gesture, to restore normalcy in the violence-struck region. A Judicial commission has been appointed after months on violence to probe into the outbreak of sectarian violence in the region.

Meanwhile, the controversial Diamer Bhasha dam in Gilgit Baltistan was recently embroiled in yet another controversy- it is alleged that some turbines of the dam were deliberately placed in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa which would entitle the latter to a large share in the royalty. As the report included in the current issue indicates, the Water and Power Development Authority (WAPDA) and the federal government of Pakistan were both urged to look into the matter and resolve it.

The jail authorities in Gilgit jail were accused of torturing inmates. The Human Rights Commission of Pakistan (HRCP) took serious note of the alleged atrocities committed by jail authorities. Some prominent activists have been imprisoned in Gilgit Baltistan including Baba Jan Hunzai and there is growing popular demand all across to secure his early release along with others.

GB Code of Conduct, Government in gridlock

The government of Gilgit-Baltistan presented the Code of Conduct in the Legislative Assembly where the members raised a number of objections during a heated debate. Later, the speaker referred it to a select committee of the house for further deliberation and vetting. Whatever is its future, it has now become very clear that the government has put itself in a blind alley as far as the Code of Conduct and maintenance of peace and sectarian harmony in the region are concerned. The government's headache had almost come to an end after head of the Shia community Agha Rahat signed the code but as the chief of the rival community Qazi Nisar raised objections and demanded modifications in the documents.

Shabbir Mir, Diamer-Bhasha Dam: G-B lawmaker demands probe into 'misplaced' turbines

GILGIT: A legislator of Gilgit-Baltistan Legislative Assembly (GBLA) has asked the government to verify reports of a few turbines of Diamer-Bhasha Dam being purposefully fixed in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (K-P) territory. "This is a cause of concern for Gilgit-Baltistan (G-B)," stated Didar Ali, an independent lawmaker, who alleged that it is an attempt by K-P government to get a share of the dam's royalty. He stated that if the reports are true,

the federal government and the Water and Power Development Authority (Wapda) should undo the act immediately. Ties between the K-P and G-B were strained after the former passed a resolution claiming rights of over 8km land near the Diamer-Bhasha Dam. According to experts, if the claim is accepted, K-P will be entitled to 50 per cent of the dam's royalty.

Shabbir Mir, Riots in central jail Gilgit: Denied cell phones, inmates set 15 barracks on fire

GILGIT: A prisoner of Central Jail Gilgit was injured and over 15 barracks were gutted in a fire set by rioting inmates on May 23, sources stated. Sources further noted that the fire broke out in an under-construction portion of the jail and spread quickly. It took fire-fighters more than two hours to bring the flames under control. "I first saw a huge cloud of smoke over the jail at about 2pm," stated an eyewitness. The smoke cloud could also be seen from Jutial, about 12km from the jail, where the inmates were previously kept in a makeshift arrangement when the central jail was short on space.

Law on animal rights: Minister calls for more power to GBLA

Gilgit-Baltistan lawmakers for review of code of conduct for Pak clerics

GILGIT: Lawmakers in Gilgit-Baltistan (G-B) have demanded a review of the new code of conduct for clerics by the Islamic Ideology Council (IIC). The suggestion was made during the G-B Legislative Assembly session after Law Minister Wazir Shakeel tabled the code in the house. The document binds prayer leaders of central mosques of different sects from using harsh language and maligning each other's beliefs.

"The matter is sensitive and it should be referred to the IIC before approval," stated Maulana Sarwar Shah of Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam-Fazal (JUI-F). His stance was supported by lawmakers Didar Ali, Rehmat Khaliq, Mirza Hussain and Sheikh Sirbaz, who opined that the code was prepared in haste and should be reviewed by IIC.

Interior Ministry bans 2 group in GB

Diamer Bhasha "life-line" of Pakistan

ISLAMABAD: Diamer-Bhasha Dam project, a life-line for the national economy, would help meet country future agricultural and power requirements. An official of Water and Power Ministry stated that the dam would generate 19 billion units of electricity annually.

He stated the mega project would store over 8 Million Acre Feet of water to meet country's growing power and irrigation needs. He stated the

Dam would enhance life of Tarbela Dam by over 35 years. To a question he stated, Diamir-Bhasha dam is the first major hydel power project after Mangla Dam built in 1967 and Tarbela Dam built in 1974. To another question, he stated Diamer Bhasha dam with a height of 272 meters, is being built on Indus river, about 300 kilometers upstream of Tarbela Dam, he added. He stated the Dam will be completed in seven to eight years.

Pakistan: Human Rights Defenders Were Tortured During Jail Custody in Gilgit-Baltistan, Asian Human Rights Commission - Urgent Appeals Programme

May 10, 2012

The Asian Human Rights Commission (AHRC) has received information that the human rights defenders, Mr. Baba Jan Hunzai along with four companions were brutally tortured by the police and military intelligence, ISI, officials while in custody of the jail. The victims were not given access to any medical treatment facilities despite being severely tortured. The government has not taken any initiative to investigate the brutal torture of the prisoners detained in jail. It is alleged that a superintendent of police, a deputy superintendent of police, a station house officer (SHO) and the deputy superintendent of Gilgit district jail were directly helping and instigating the torture with the military

intelligence people. The torture victims are kept in a sub section of the jail which is at the top of a mountain where the temperature remains almost at freezing point.

Syed Fazl-e-Haider, Sectarian strife in Pakistan hurts its ties with China

Last month, riots between Sunni and Shia groups in north-east Pakistan claimed at least 20 lives and left 50 others injured, prompting the government to deploy troops and to impose a curfew in the volatile areas. That curfew has since been lifted in the area, which borders western China. But growing sectarian discord in Gilgit-Baltistan and Skardu districts, where the riots occurred, is likely to turn the region into a sectarian flashpoint, frustrating Chinese plans for development of its western region.

The strategically located area of Gilgit-Baltistan - which connects Pakistan to China's western province of Xinjiang - borders Afghanistan, China, India and the strife-torn Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province of Pakistan. The region is seen by both India and Pakistan as part of the larger Jammu and Kashmir issue, which has been one of the most intractable points of contention between the two South Asian rivals since partition.

Shabbir Mir, Paving way for harmony: In Gilgit, re-opening of mosques hinges on accepting new code

GILGIT: The Gilgit-Baltistan (G-B) government has linked the opening of the mosques sealed in the aftermath of sectarian violence with the acceptance of the code of conduct that bars prayer leaders from making hate speeches. The code of conduct, prepared by a parliamentary peace committee, binds prayer leaders of both central mosques not to malign each other's beliefs or to use foul language against the rival sect's revered personalities. It states that prayer leaders and their deputies should not

issue inflammatory decrees, especially during Friday and Eid sermons.

Eight decades after cattle grazers discovered them in undivided India's Gilgit, the famous Buddhist manuscripts are still awaiting proper preservation in Srinagar's SPS Museum. Locked in a fireproof vault, mostly laminated, these scripts are neither displayed nor can they be photographed.

"These are fragile assets and unless we have a proper preservation system, we do not permit people to touch them," museum curator Mushtaq Ahmad stated. "We will launch a formal programme in our own laboratory once we shift to the new museum building." A brand new museum, built for 30 crore, is ready for housewarming.

Gilgit manuscripts date back to the sixth century and are known to be one of the oldest records on Buddhism. These predate Rajtarangni, the oldest "history" that Kalhana wrote on Kashmir. Discovered by cattle grazers near an old stupa, these boxes were immediately transferred to Srinagar durbar.
