IMPORT OF RAW SILK

- *395. SHRI SAN DA'NARAYANAPPA: Will the Minister of FOREIGN TRADE be pleased to state:
- (a) whether in view of the shortage of silk productio in the country the State Trading Co poration is importing raw silk to meet the demand in the country;
- (b) if so, when uch orders were placed for import; and

THE MINISTER OF RADE (SHR) B. R. **FOREIGN** TRADE BHAGAT): (a) to (c) Impor of raw silk is allowed only by way of replenishment against export of materia's containing mulberry silk. Import thu taking place fills, correspondingly, the gap between the demand and the indigenous production of raw silk. Import of ra v silk has been canalised through the Central Silk Board from ist April, 1970 and arrangements are underway to effec imports. The quantum of raw silk to be imported during 1970-71 will depend upor the export performance of mulberry silk oods during the current financial year.

British passport-holders born in India

THE DEPLTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHEI SURENDRA PAL SINGH): (a) The British Government

have not officially disclaimed their responsibility towards British passport-holders of Asian origin from East Africa on the ground of their birth in India. However, a very large number of such persons are experiencing difficulties in finding entry into U. K.

(b) Government of India are of the view that it is the obligation of U. K. Government to allow their nationals to enter Britain without any discrimination.

ALL INDIA HANDLOOM BOARD

- (a) whether there is any proposal under Government's consideration for making the All India Handloom Board a Statutory Board; and
