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#### Herat Airport under Missiles Target

## **Taliban Spokesman Arrested??**

Zabiullah Mujahid, the spokesperson of the Taliban was arrested on 15 November 2011 in Paktia province, southern Afghanistan by Afghan security forces. #### Abdullah: Loya Jirga was Illegal

On 16 November 2011, many mujahideen leaders, parliamentarians, religious scholars and political elites announced their opposition to the traditional Loya Jirga which started in Kabul the same day. Abdullah said, "The agenda of the Loya Jirga indicates the government's future policies but I view it as a smokescreen." He also held that the government was "disregarding the basic institutions in Afghanistan and wasting time, energy and national funds for an unlawful purpose." The leader of change and Hope Coalition also said that the outcome of the Loya Jirga will not be taken seriously by anybody in Afghanistan.

# 1000 Animal perish in heavy snow in Kunduz

Beside the shortage of livestock food, more than 1000 goats and sheep died because of the unexpected heavy snowfall in Kunduz province, northeastern Afghanistan. # Abdullah: The Military Base will not benefit Afghanistan

# Interview with Hanif Atmar

*Q.* Before we ask you about the Loya Jirga, let's talk about your political party that you formed recently under the name of Haq-o-Adalat Party. Would you please tell us its view about the Loya Jirga?

In the name of God, we have supported the idea of Jirga as a consultative council. There is no doubt that the president of Afghanistan has the right to consult the people of Afghanistan. We do hope that now he would take the Jirga seriously. **However, we do not support the transfer of power from parliament to this council which was illegal and unconstitutional.** Our participation was only on the condition that the Jirga would only be an informal consultative mechanism/body. In general I **congratulate the people of Afghanistan for this Jirga which ended with some good suggestions.** We hope that these suggestions would be taken seriously not only by the government of Afghanistan but also by the international community.

Q. It seems that majority of the representatives opposed the idea of a strategic partnership between Afghanistan and the US in the context of permanent military

base of the US but at the same time, they supported this idea when it meant a partnership which could give economic benefits to Afghan people. What do you think about this strategic partnership?

At first, let me tell you that this strategic partnership agreement is wider than the issue of US seeking permanent military bases in Afghanistan. It has many dimensions which involve security of the Afghanistan state. Secondly, we have to make sure that such programmes and agreements serve our national interests. I hold that it is in our national interest to sign this strategic agreement with the US.

I feel tensions brewing up inside and outside Afghanistan. It is in our interest to have relationship of mutual trust and goodwill with all our neighbours. However, we should never reject such agreements because of the illegitimate demands of our neighbours. We have to sign this agreement somehow.

Q. The second important issue taken up for discussion in this Jirga was reconciliation with the Taliban. Some of the Jirga members said that they would have to continue peace process with the Taliban and some others emphasized that there should not be any peace talk with the Taliban until they stopped their armed struggle against Kabul government. They also spoke about Pakistan. What do you think?

I still emphasize three conditions for reconciliation with the Taliban; firstly, the Taliban will have to respect Afghanistan's constitution entirely. We should not cut the length of this constitution even by one centimetre. Secondly, the Taliban will have to stop killing innocent people. And thirdly, any attempt at talking to the Al Qaeda elements and the TTP should be stopped. We cannot accept any reconciliation initiative with these groups. By all means we want to have peace in country. We will negotiate with those who respect constitution of Afghanistan. The only thing that I strongly reject here is the rebirth of the Taliban regime in Afghanistan. This we can never accept.

*Q. Just after the formation of Haq-o-Adalat party, you travelled to the United States; did you want to introduce your party to people in Washington or you had some other objectives?* 

No. I have a research centre there and I had promised some of the US universities to give lectures to them. Besides there, I also had some meetings with the US Congress and US Government officials and academic friends on many aspects of US-Afghan relations. Then there was also an important investment project by the US government in Afghanistan and they wanted to consult me on this. It is also true that I

acquainted the people of America with the programmes and principles of the Haq-o-Adalat party.

Q. Mr. Atmar, Are you planning to run for the coming presidential election?

This will depend on the decision of our party. If they decide to have a candidate for the coming presidential then their view will be respected. Nobody can ever make himself a candidate without the support of his party.
