Amidst the continuing debate on the constitutional and political status of Gilgit Baltistan, the European Parliament recently criticized the resolution adopted by the Gilgit Baltistan Assembly on the issue of according the region a provincial status. The members of the Friends of Gilgit Baltistan group in the European Parliament alleged that the resolution was adopted under the influence of the ruling Pakistan Peoples' Party (PPP). The statement noted that any attempt by Pakistan to dilute the regions' link to Kashmir was a violation of democratic and diplomatic principles and would act contrary to the larger Kashmir cause.

The current issue includes a number of reports on the controversial Diamer Bhasha dam project. Due to an inordinate delay in the project, the total cost of the dam is noted to have escalated. The financial crunch resulting from the perceived unwillingness/lack of interest of the multilateral agencies in providing funds has compelled the President of Pakistan, Asif Ali Zadari to intervene and urge Asian Development Bank (ADB) to agree and lead the consortium.

An interesting report brings to notice the illegal transfer of turtles to China from across Gilgit Baltistan. A Chinese national was caught carrying turtles in cardboard boxes from Gilgit Baltistan to China at the Sost check post. These endangered species are smuggled allegedly for consumption in restaurants and for medicinal purposes in China.

GB govt takes notice of delay in promotion of senior officers

GILGIT: Gilgit-Baltistan government has taken a serious notice of delay in promotion of senior officers and directed secretaries in charge to carry out their assigned role efficiently. In a circular issued on 24 October, 2012, the GB government stated it has been observed that despite repeated instructions during the last two meetings of Secretaries, the processes of timely submission of matured cases before DPC is very slow.

The secretaries in different ministries in GB have been reminded that it is their responsibility to conduct business of the department allocated to them efficiently. Timely promotion of deserving/eligible officers is an integral part of running the department smoothly. It pointed out that delay in submission of cases results in retirement of eligible officers, lack of incentive and demoralization.

Zahid Gishkori, PTI delays G-B, AJK elections till next year

With serious differences among the party leadership, Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) has decided to postpone intra-party elections for its Gilgit-Baltistan (G-B) and Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK) chapters till next year. PTI leaders dealing with intra-party elections noted on October 19 that the party will not be able to hold elections for its office-bearers in G-B and AJK till next year since the party's constitution is under scrutiny as there are differences among leaders over the election mechanism. "We have decided to postpone intraparty elections in G-B and AJK for two main reasons- firstly, because of differences among leaders over the exact framework in formulating a party hierarchy and, secondly, due to the ongoing study of PTI's constitution by legal attorneys," a senior official of the party informed. The decision came after PTI's announcement that it will hold intra-party elections on November 2, 2012 in Islamabad.

Mushtaq Ghumman, Diamer-Bhasha dam: Pakistan must get NOC from India, insist multilaterals

ISLAMABAD: Pakistani officialdom has failed to grasp the fact that multilaterals such as the Asian Development Bank (ADB) and World Bank will not support the construction of the 4,500-megawatt Diamer-Bhasha dam in what is considered a disputed territory unless both countries party to the dispute approved the project, sources noted on October 20. It is for this reason that both multilaterals are insisting that Pakistan gets a No Objection Certificate (NOC) from India before financing of the \$13.5 billion project would be considered.

Peace process between India & Pak taken a forward stride: Nayyar Malik

MUZAFFARABAD: The peace process between India and Pakistan has taken a forward stride, as both governments have accorded approval to Azad Jammu & Kashmir Women for Peace Organization (AJKWfPO) in organizing a 3 days Intra-Kashmir, Cross-LoC Women Dialogue at Muzaffarabad in November 2012. The GOP has also, for the first time, allowed cross LOC movements of women delegates from Jammu & Kashmir, which initially was allowed only to the members of separated families. This is another CBM measure extended by GOP.

Two intra-Kashmir Women Conferences were previously held at Srinagar and Gulmarg in 2007 and 2012, 'we were extremely distressed through the narrations of victimized women folk, the atrocities women folk had suffered, during indigenous Kashmiri up-risings. The Kashmiri women have been subjected to gender based violence and suffer deep psycho-social trauma'.

Twelve accused of inciting violence released

GILGIT: Amid cautions of possible terrorist attacks on passenger buses travelling between Gilgit and Rawalpindi, the Gilgit-Baltistan (G-B) Police on October 18 released 12 people, including four clerics, who had been detained three months back on charges of inciting violence.

G-B Deputy Inspector General (DIG) Police, Ali Sher stated the men were among the 20 people arrested under Section 16 of the Maintenance of Public Order (MPO) after over 20 people were killed in G-B in target killings. He stated the men were detained for three months and were released after they provided written assurances that they will remain peaceful in the future and not incite people towards violence.

Andrew Buncombe, Birmingham's bus ride to Pakistan

A 12-day bus service linking Birmingham with a city in Pakistan has been floated as a means of strengthening ties between the two communities. Promising a "thrilling ride", Tahir Khokher, the Transport Minister with Pakistan's Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK) Regional Government, has suggested a 6450km link between Mirpur and England could be particularly popular with young people and those with a sense of adventure.

The West Midlands has long-established links with the AJK region - the capital, Mirpur, is sometimes called Little England or Little Brum. Birmingham is reputed to be home to the largest population of Pakistani Kashmiris outside the country, many having left in the 1960s after the construction of a major dam. The route would pass through at least seven countries and cost about \$250, a considerable saving on the \$1170 of an average flight. "It could be popular, especially with the young. It would be an experience, an adventure," stated Hamza Waris, who works in his family-owned travel company, Pak Travels, in Birmingham's Small Heath area. "It would depend on how things were in Pakistan and in the countries on route".

Terrorism threat: Suspects held for tailing passenger bus

GILGIT: A group of suspected terrorists has been arrested by security forces near Kohistan. A security official noted that the men were arrested after they were found tailing a passenger bus heading towards Gilgit from Rawalpindi on the Karakoram Highway (KKH). The official stated that the men were travelling in a private car in an area between Kohistan and Mansehra, Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa (K-P). However, when contacted, the Gilgit-Baltistan Police expressed ignorance over the development. "We are not aware of any such incident," stated G-B Deputy Inspector General of Police Ali Sher.

The G-B Police have ensured sufficient security to all passenger buses passing through their territory, he added. Meanwhile, in a meeting in Chilas on October16, district officials of Diamer and Kohistan discussed ways to make travelling on the KKH safe for passengers. The officials agreed to set up checkpoints on all unmanned areas besides conducting surveillance of the area between Chilas and Kohistan. They also decided to seek help of a jirga from Kohistan to ensure safe journey for passengers over the KKH.

Mushtaq Ghumman, Diamer-Bhasha dam project: Centre blames ADB for \$2 billion loss

The federal government has accused the Asian Development Bank (ADB) of causing \$2 billion (Rs 190 billion) loss to Pakistan in four years because of its dilly dallying on 4,500-megawatt Diamer-Bhasha dam, sources close to Chairman Wapda noted on October 17. Secretary Cabinet Division, Nargis Sethi, who is holding the additional charge of Secretary Water and Power, will hold a meeting with ADB's Board Group on energy vision, ongoing project and new proposal on October 18. "ADB has a portfolio of \$2 billion for Pakistan's energy sector and we are discussing existing and future projects with the ADB delegation," stated an official. "ADB has reversed its commitment of providing lead financing and support for Diamer-Bhasha dam and the ADB President and new Director General Klaus Gerhaeusser have adopted a hostile approach to this project in line with the thinking of the World Bank," sources added. Sources further stated a senior official of ADB on June 28 this year met the Minister for Water and Power wherein the key issue discussed was the lead financing role for the project.

No money for dams

The financial constraints facing Wapda are likely to hit another hydropower project Gomal Zam dam. The contractor, the Frontier Works Organisation, has put the authority on notice for immediate clearance of its dues of Rs4bn. In case Wapda fails to do so, the work on the dam will be stopped. It means the commissioning of the project, which was scheduled to be completed five years ago, will be further delayed. The nearly completed dam will produce 17.5MW electricity and irrigate 191,000 acres of land in Tank and D.I. Khan. Gomal Zam is not the first hydropower project hit by the paucity of funds. There are many others, like Neelum-Jhelum, while the work on the 4,500MW Diamer-Bhasha dam is yet to start because of unavailability of financing.

PML-N: high court judge probe worker's killing

MUZAFFARABAD: A senior leader of the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N), AJK chapter, on demanded of the AJK government to appoint a high court judge as head of the commission to probe the killing of a party worker in police firing. Chaudhry Tariq Farooq, who is also deputy leader of the opposition in legislative assembly, expressed his distrust in the 'commission of inquiry' headed by a district and sessions judge and stated the government should take serious steps to establish rule of law in the region.

"Firstly, being civil servants, members of subordinate judiciary are prone to the influence of the government and secondly the district judge whose appointment has been approved by the prime minister has served as public relations officer to a minister in the previous People's Party government and his spouse is also an office-bearer of the ruling party. He should have himself declined to head the commission," stated the PML-N leader at a press conference.

On September 18, hundreds of PML-N workers, led by Mr Farooq, had staged a rally in Bhimber city to protest what they alleged registration of fake cases against their colleagues. As the demonstrators reached at the entrance of the district headquarters complex, the police lobbed teargas shells on them besides resorting to firing, which left one activist dead and two others wounded.

AJK, GB elections, bye-polls in provinces proof of PPP popularity: Kaira

No Public Service Commission present in AJK to recruit people on merit on Gazetted posts

ISLAMABAD: Despite having Legislative Assembly, Supreme Court, High Court and Election Commission there is no institution present in Azad Jammu and Kashmir which could give jobs to people on merit. The whole system of Azad Jammu and Kashmir Public Service Commission was suspended when Chairman of the Commission Sardar Latif and six members of the commission had completed their tenure of three years of service on 16th June 2012; meanwhile the government despiteof passage of five months has not appointed the chairman and members of the commission.

At preset the sitting government is distributing all the Gazetted posts to its workers on ad-hoc basis; meanwhile the Information Minister AJK Bazil Naqvi has claimed to resolve the issue during the next 10 days. He stated that the work is in progress and appointments would be made soon.

Separated in 1971, two brothers from Turtuk haven't seen their parents- Mohammad Ali, just 5 when Indian Army captured his village "Thang" located in Nobra valley near Turtuk block of Ladakh during 1971 India-Pakistan war. Till 1971 Thang was part of Gilgit Baltistan province which is located near famous Askardu city in Pakistan.

Recently I was in Ladakh area in connection with some official work and I met Mohammad Ali through one of my friends, Ghulam Hussain, a social activist who also hails from Nubra valley. Mohammad Ali and his brother Ahmad Shah were just 5 and 3 years of age respectively in 1971 when Indian military personnel reached Thang and the village fell into territorial jurisdiction of India after being captured from Pakistan, but the tragedy was that Ali's parents including grandmother had gone to nearby Franu village (which is under control of Pakistan) in connection with some domestic work and the young children were left at home with the grandfather and when they tried to come back a bloody line "LOC" had been drawn till then thus separating little ones from their parents and grandmother. The grandfather tried a lot to ensure his son, daughter-in-law and wife could come back but they couldn't make it. As on date Mohammad Ali who is now 45 and his brother 43 years of age haven't seen their father, mother and other siblings,

who were born after 1971. The grandma also expired without seeing her husband (Ali's grandfather) and vice versa.

MUZAFFARABAD: As the entire nation commemorated the 7th anniversary of the October 2005 earthquake on October 8, most of the survivors were still concerned about the pledged reconstruction work, which is still not completed. Like an annual ritual, government functionaries started bragging about their achievements and future plans regarding the reconstruction program, soon after the onset of October, notwithstanding a widely known bitter reality acute scarcity of cash flow.

According to figures obtained from the State Earthquake Reconstruction and Rehabilitation

Agency (Serra), out of 7,984 projects/facilities, 4,693 had so far been completed, while work was "in progress" on another 2,068. Around 1,223 projects were yet to be started. The education sector was still the worst hit, as out of the 2,792 projects, 1,714 were either "in progress" or yet to be started.

According to Sardar Rahim Khan, who was recently posted as Secretary Serra, the reconstruction related bodies Earthquake Reconstruction and Rehabilitation Authority (Erra) and Serra were unable to complete projects according to their Annual Work Plan (AWP) due to acute financial crisis faced by the country.

ISLAMABAD: The Economic Affairs Division (EAD) on October 3 informed a standing committee of the Senate that the World Bank (WB) had refused to extend a loan for the Diamer-Bhasha Dam project, terming it as risk financing. The EAD officials informed the Senate body about the situation, accepting their failure in arranging finance for the \$12 billion Diamer-Bhasha Dam project.

However, there are some commitments for the project, the latest coming from the US of about

\$220 million. As far as the Asian Development Bank (ADB) was concerned, the EAD officials stated it had never committed any loan for the project before. However, there were some estimates that the ADB would extend a loan of \$3-4 billion if there were visible funding for the project, they added.

The ADB is of the view, according to the EAD Additional Secretary Iftikhar Rauf, that in case the government manages funding from other resources in reasonable size, it would not hesitate to fund the project. "No international financial institution and donor bank is ready for risk financing," Rauf stated.

Arrangement of funds a serious problem

European Parliamentarians condemn Pak Govt move

October 4, 2012

BRUSSELS: Members of the Friends of Gilgit Baltistan in the European Parliament on October 3 condemned Pakistani Government's decision to make Gilgit Baltistan as its fifth Province. In a statement a spokesman of Members of the Friends of Gilgit Baltistan, stated, "The resolution was adopted by the Gilgit Assembly at the behest of the Pakistan People's Party (PPP) government in Pakistan. It violates all democratic and diplomatic norms and is also contrary to the spirit of Pakistan's constitution itself, which has since accepted Gilgit Baltistan not as a part of Pakistan but as a part of Jammu and Kashmir". He urged the international community to take note, that the people of Gilgit Baltistan are struggling for their rights and seek international intervention to stop Pakistan from absorbing Gilgit Baltistan and withdrew its forces. He also mentioned that it would have some serious strategic and security implications for the region, as instead of using it for progress and enrichment Pakistan has used the region for the purposes of fashioning an environment of "intolerance and violence" that has hit the lives of people in Gilgit Baltistan.

US asks Pakistan to securitise dams' assets for seeking funds

October 28, 2012

ISLAMABAD: The United States has asked Pakistan to securitise assets of different dams including Tarbela and Mangla in order to seek funds from international donors for the multi-billiondollar Diamer Bhasha Dam. The suggestion came in a meeting between US embassy officials and Federal Water and Power Minister Ahmed Mukhtar.

The diplomats assured the minister that the US would play its role in generating funds to meet the entire cost of \$13bn for the 4,500-megawatt Diamer Bhasha dam and power project by becoming part of a consortium, led by the Asian Development Bank (ADB). Earlier, the ADB had refused to lead the consortium. Pakistani authorities expect to raise \$3bn by securitising assets of Tarbela and Mangla Dam, but the US officials insist that all the cost of Diamer Bhasha project will be covered by implementing the securitisation plan. Securitisation means creation of an investment instrument by combining financial assets and then marketing different tiers of the repackaged instruments to the investors.

A video conference will be held next month in Washington involving a US energy team and officials of the Water and Power Development Authority (Wapda) to discuss the implementation of the plan of securitising assets of dams. The government is facing difficulties in generating funds for Diamer Bhasha Dam as the World Bank has sought no-objection certificate (NOC) from India, which says that the planned dam site is situated in a "disputed territory".

30 freshwater turtles released in River Korung

ISLAMABAD: The Gilgit-Baltistan Forest, Wildlife and Parks Department, the Climate Change Ministry and the Worldwide Fund (WWF) on October 8 jointly released 30 freshwater turtles in River Korung. A consignment of 34 turtles has been confiscated from Gilgit-Baltistan's Sust border area by the GB Forest, Wildlife and Parks Department, being illegally captured and transported from Pakistan's freshwaters to China on October 3, 2012. This trade in wildlife especially in freshwater turtles is on its peak during the last eight years, which has resulted in killing of several hundreds and thousands of these species in order to feed Chinese restaurants and help in preparing traditional Chinese medicines.

Waqas Naeem, No bricks in the wall: 64% of schools in AJK are still heaps of rubble

BAGH: Sixty-four per cent of schools destroyed by

the 2005 tremor in Bagh district of AJK are yet to be reconstructed. In all, 770 state-run schools were damaged or destroyed by the earthquake in Bagh. Of them, only 273 have been reconstructed since, according to Raja Roshan Johar, the district education officer. Interestingly, most of these schools have been reconstructed with funding from foreign and local donors. "Now, there is a feeling of discrimination. While some pupils study in schools reconstructed by NGOs, others are made to sit on the rubble of their schools. This might cause an inferiority complex among them," Johar noted in a ceremony held in connection with the 7th anniversary of the 2005 earthquake at a state-run school reconstructed by USTATED in Dhal Qazian.

Another speaker, Gul Zaman, who led a community-based team to support USTATED's reconstruction of the Dhal Qazian boys' high school, appealed to the AJK government to provide relief to the students and teachers working under difficult conditions at the quake-affected schools.

G-B electricity woes: Winter is coming, and outages are getting worse

GILGIT: With the duration of power outages gradually increasing, people in Gilgit fear that the coming winter might be as worse as the last one. Locals stated they were facing around two hours of power outages a day, but with the start of October the load shedding hours have doubled. "Power goes out for hours sometimes four times a day; if the situation is so bad in the early days of October, just imagine how bad it will be in December and January," stated Mujahid, a resident of Gilgit.

Power outages in Gilgit intensified last year after the area's main water reservoir developed fissures and the 18-megawatt Naltar hydropower station had to be shut down to repair the leakage. Power supply to Gilgit was suspended twice, for over one week each time, bringing life to a standstill.

Shabbir Mir, Threatened species: 34 turtles seized near Pak-China border

GILGIT: The Gilgit-Baltistan (G-B) forest department has seized 34 endangered turtles being smuggled into China. The turtles were seized from the luggage of a Chinese national at a check post in Sost near the Pak-China border, Wildlife Conservator Wilayat Noor stated on October 6. He stated the Chinese national, Chuch Bin, has been arrested and the turtles have been transported to Gilgit. "It is a big achievement as we have recovered all the turtles alive. I appreciate the efforts of all those who made it possible," stated Noor.

Pervaiz Iqbal, a border guard of the G-B forest department, stated the Chinese national's luggage was checked on October 4 after his behaviour "seemed suspicious". Upon inspection, they found the turtles hidden in cardboard boxes and bags. Rehmat Ali, a senior conservationist at WWF Gilgit office stated the man was taken into custody and presented before the court of a civil judge in Hunza. The judge indicted the Chinese national and fined him Rs 2,000 under the Wildlife Act of 1975.

Investigation revealed that the accused spent nearly three months in Rawalpindi, picking up the turtles from various areas of the Pothohar region, including the Kallar Kahar Lake. "These are the freshwater turtles found in the Pothohar region of Pakistan," stated Babar Khan, the head of World Wide Fund for Nature in G-B.
