In this Edition

The festival of Eid in Gilgit Baltistan was marred by grief and shock over the killings of 19 innocent people in Mansehra on August 16. These people travelling in buses were on their way to Gilgit from Rawalpindi. According to reports, the victims were Shias and they were forced to disembark from the buses before being shot dead. They were identified as belonging to a particular sect from their identity cards before the assailants dressed in military fatigue killed them mercilessly. The attack appears pre planned as it occurred during the holy month of Ramzan when people travel back to their hometowns for celebrating the festival. The government of Pakistan ordered probe and few arrests had been made, as reports claim. However, the real culprits are far from being apprehended and the government has once again resorted to the Jirgas for helping maintain peace and order in the region. It raises serious questions on the administration's intention to secure the lives of the innocent people who have been targeted incessantly due to their religious affiliation.

The incident is a grim reminder of the attacks on Shias in February and April earlier this year. The modus operandi was similar to the previous attacks. The sequential unfolding of the events is absolutely similar to what is in the earlier incidents when the government and the administrative machinery was caught napping. The claims of certain arrests being made, involving Jirgas in help restoring order, statements regarding launching operations in the region to arrests trouble makers and ultimately making no headway: all this bears striking resemblance to the earlier incidents of target killings in Gilgit Baltistan.

The controversial Diamer Bhasha dam project is mired in huge financial difficulties due to unwillingness of the donor agencies to fund a project which is located in a disputed region. Pakistan is exploring other options to finance the ambitious project and it seems to have pinned its hope entirely on China. Notably, China is already funding a huge number of infrastructural and hydro power projects in the PoK region.

Nisar Ahmad Khan, 19 pulled out of buses, shot dead in sectarian attack

MANSEHRA: Terrorists ambushed four buses, pulled out the passengers and shot at least 19 of them dead in the Babusar Top area of Mansehra district on August 16. Before killing the passengers, the assailants had checked their identity cards and shot them because they were Shia. "More than 50 terrorists wearing commando uniform intercepted a convoy going from Rawalpindi to Gilgit-Baltistan before 7am, hauled off passengers from four vans, identified them through their national identity cards and shot 19 of them dead," District Coordination Officer Dr Amber Ali Khan stated. He noted several CNICs had been found at the place in the mountain range where the attack had taken place.

COAS visits forward locations in Gilgit Baltistan to celebrate Eid with troops

ISLAMABAD: Chief of Army Staff (COAS), General Ashfaq Parvez Kayani, visited forward locations in Gilgit-Baltistan on August 22 to celebrate Eid with troops. According to an ISPR press release, COAS visited Gayari to meet troops busy in the recovery operation. The operation started as a relief and rescue effort, immediately after the disastrous avalanche that caused Shahadat of 140 soldiers and civilians. It has continued without any let off for the last four and a half months despite severe terrain and climatic conditions. COAS lauded the perseverance and motivation of troops involved in the rescue effort which has resulted in the recovery of 79 bodies to date.

Shabbir Mir, 'Undeclared curfew' imposed in Gilgit

GILGIT: All entry and exit routes were sealed and markets closed on August 22 after three people were killed and two others were injured a day earlier in a fresh wave of sectarian violence that erupted in reaction to the Naran bus attack. "The step has been taken to overcome target killings," Ali Sher, a senior police official noted. "This is understandably a reaction to the Naran bus killings," he stated of the violence that left three people dead and two others seriously wounded in different incidents of target killings in Gilgit on August 21. The recent incidents came four days after 19 passengers, mostly Shias, were shot dead by terrorists at point blank range in the Mansehra district.

Hussain Abbas, Emergency declared in Gilgit

It is pertinent to mention that the Shiite killings on Rawalpindi-Gilgit route has sparked clashes three times claiming hundreds of lives in Gilgit.

Naran massacre: In Gilgit, fear mars Eid preparations

GILGIT: Residents of Gilgit are gripped in fear and forced to remain indoors following the carnage of 19 Shia passengers in Naran valley of Mansehra district. The ruthless killing overshadowed Eid preparation in the town that is still in a state of shock. Roads and markets in Gilgit were deserted in fear of violence since August 17, a day after the passengers were hauled off from four buses heading from Rawalpindi to Gilgit by Tehrik-i-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) terrorists and shot dead. The incident, which is the third in the last six months, is stated to have broken the fragile peace in the region.

Jon Boone, Post-massacre, Pakistan army flights help Shia exodus

The decision to allocate C-130 Hercules transport planes for the use of civilians travelling between Islamabad and the north-eastern provincial capital of Gilgit follows the killing on August 16 of 20 Shias.

'Govt committed to early completion of Bhasha dam'

LAHORE: The PPP government is committed to early completion of the Diamer-Bhasha Dam, which can generate 4,500MW of cheap hydel electricity and provide over six million acre feet of water for agriculture. In a statement issued here, central leader of the PPP Munir Ahmad Khan stated that dam would be completed with or without foreign funding. Precisely for this reason, the PPP had the project approved from the ECNEC in 2009.

It has already started earmarking money for it, and started acquiring land for the project. The PC-I for the by-pass road, which is prerequisite for the dam construction, has already been approved at a cost of Rs3.8 billion. On the recommendation of the lenders, the PPP government got the project approved by the Council of Common Interest (CCI) and also from the Central Development Work party (CDWP). On top of it all, the prime minister performed ground breaking of the project on October 18, 2011, Khan stated.

Pak alerts foreign diplomats on Eid violence

ISLAMABAD: Fearing terror attacks, Pakistan imposed travel ban on foreign diplomats while Interior Minister Rehman Malik has called for strict vigil at diplomatic missions during the Eid-ul-Fitr holidays to avert any possible incident of terrorism, including suicide attacks. The federal government imposed the ban on travel by foreign diplomats within the country without seeking prior permission. Diplomats will have to seek permission from the Foreign Ministry before any travel, sources in the Interior Ministry noted. Following advice from the Interior Ministry, diplomats in Islamabad were asked not to visit Quetta and Gilgit-Baltistan.

Pakistani Shi'as are 'victims of regional politics'

Pakistani atlas shows PoK as Indian

A new school atlas published by the government of Pakistan's Punjab province has shown Pakistan-occupied Kashmir and the Gilgit-Baltistan region as Indian territories. The education authorities rushed to recall the atlas from all elementary and high school libraries of Punjab province, which has a population of 90 million.

The government of chief minister Shahbaz Sharif

has had to face criticism from academicians over the development."It is a grave mistake that speaks of the inefficiency of our chief minister's team," publisher Khalid Pervez stated. Over 15,000 copies of the atlas had been delivered to school libraries so far. The education department stated it would take action against all those responsible for printing, approving and distributing the atlas. The publisher had been asked to reprint the atlas with correct maps, it stated.

According to reports, the Indian lobby in Washington is vigorously working against the funding of the Diamer-Bhasha Dam, forcing the US and other donors to link its assistance for the Pakistani project with a No Objection Certificate (NoC) from New Delhi given India's claims that the Dam is located in the disputed territory of Gilgit-Baltistan. Washington had earlier agreed to fund the project on the condition of approval from the US Congress. The World Bank, on the other hand, already refused to extend finances for the Diamer-Bhasha Dam, linking the financing of the multi-billion dollar project with Indian concurrence.

UN, US to pressurize Pakistan to open Gilgit-Ladakh trade route

A day after the killing of 21 Shias by militants, the third such sectarian attack in the restive region in six months, an organization representing the people of Gilgit Baltistan has asked the United States and the United Nations to put pressure on Pakistan to open the trade routes with Tajikistan, Afghanistan and Laddakh. "United Nations and USA are requested to pressure Pakistan to open travel and trade routes towards Tajikistan, Afghanistan and Indian Ladakh so that Shias are not forced to travel on the roads that have become killing fields and virtually controlled by ISI-led militants like Lashkar Toiba, Lashkar Jhangvi and Sipah Sihaba," Washington based Gilgit Baltistan National Congress (GBNC) noted in a statement today.

Shahbaz Rana, Diamer Bhasha dam: Japanese aid keeps plans afloat

ISLAMABAD: Japan has agreed in principle to finance the power houses of the Diamer Bhasha dam, renewing hopes that the project will not be suspended. The dam has been designed to generate 4,500 megawatts of electricity, which Pakistan direly needs, besides storing water for agriculture purposes.

According to a senior government official, Japan has agreed to finance the construction of the power houses of the dam through the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA). He stated the move, if it materialises, will create a win-win situation for both parties: it will provide much-needed funding for the project and an opportunity to JICA to sell its equipment. However, the exact amount of the funding has not yet been worked out as modalities will be finalised later on, the official added. Meanwhile, the authorities have informed the premier about this development.
