TOP STORY

On 25 July 2022, the Bhartiya Janata Party (BJP) conducted the first ever Tiranga Bikers Rally in Srinagar, flagged off from the iconic Clock Tower area in Lal Chowk. Bikers from across the country travelled to the Kargil War Memorial to celebrate Kargil Vijay Diwas. BJP's National Secretary, Mr. Tarun Chug, and Yuva Morcha National President, Mr. Tejasvi Surya flagged off the event. The flag was hoisted, and patriotic songs were sung far and wide.

This rally is deeply significant, besides the event it commemorated, due to the place it was flagged off from by party leaders. Before August 2019's constitutional reforms, the area surrounding the Clock Tower served as the breeding ground for separatists and militant activities and also experienced several attacks.

This event marked a new and prosperous phase in the union territory's existence with a precedent for similar initiatives to follow suit. It was an important step in the direction of "complete, social, political, and economic re-integration of Jammu and Kashmir... an important civilizational task..."

Lieutenant Governor (LG) of Jammu and Kashmir Manoj Sinha has launched several key initiatives in the education sector of the Union Territory.

He has initiated 119 civil projects, which includes 84 school buildings and has unveiled projects for sports infrastructure in about 100 schools, which covers two residential schools for tribal students in Rajouri and Shopian. He has further rolled out NIELIT courses for six to 12 grade.

In addition, the LG has launched a mentorship programme and introduced TALAASH App for bringing 93,508 out-of-school children into the mainstream.

He has also laid foundation stones for 500 Atal Tinkering Labs (250 each in Jammu and Kashmir regions) and 188 model kindergartens and 1,935 pre-primary sections.

The Mentorship Programme, known as Student Teacher Engagement for Educational Reinforcement (STEER) is meant to revolutionise school education by identifying learning gaps and constraints of the children, thereby allowing teachers to improve teaching methods.

Similarly, the NEP-2020 takes special care of providing students an opportunity to study the subjects according to their own choice and ability. — Financial Express, PTI
