Work on LOC package under full progress: PM of AJK

The Prime Minister (PM) of "Azad Kashmir" Sardar Abdul Qayyum Niazi has said that the protection of the rights of the people living near the Line of Control (LOC) will be ensured and the government will provide all basic facilities including health, education and infrastructure to the people. He expressed these views while addressing the inaugural function of a separate basic health unit for Dara Sher Khan and Buttal. The AJK PM said that brave people living on the LOC have been facing the "Indian firing" daily with determination. The PM said that the work on the LOC package is in full swing and added that we will not forget the "sacrifices of the soldiers and officers of Pakistan Army who have sacrificed their lives in defence of Kashmiri civilians" at the LOC. 'UNSC apprised of the grave situation in Kashmir'

The Foreign Minister (FM) of Pakistan, Shah Mahmood Qureshi apprised the president of the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) and UN secretary-general of the "continuing grave situation in occupied Jammu and Kashmir." In his letter addressed to the president of UNSC and UN secretarygeneral, the FM pointed to the "deteriorating human rights and humanitarian situation in India held Kashmir" and the persistent "threats to international peace and security posed by India's provocative rhetoric as well as its track record of orchestrating false flag operations."

He demanded settlement of the Jammu and Kashmir dispute under relevant resolutions of the UNSC which guarantee the Kashmiris "right to selfdetermination" through the democratic method of a free and impartial plebiscite conducted under the auspices of the UN.

The FM further drew attention to the recent spate of "extra-judicial killings, arbitrary arrests and illegal detentions India-occupied Kashmir." He in highlighted the recent arrest of "renowned Kashmiri human rights activist" Khurram Parvez on

"trumped-up charges" in complete disregard for basic human rights principles, norms and international law.

'Kashmir body to work with Turkish artiste to project Kashmiris' voice'

The chairman of the parliamentary committee on Kashmir, Shehryar Khan Afridi said that the "Kashmir story" needs to be told to the world through innovative ways and the Kashmir committee would work with the Turkish and Pakistani artists to project the Kashmir cause. Shehryar Afridi expressed these views while talking with the Turkish rights activist and author Turgay Evren at the parliament house. The Kashmiri leader Altaf Bhat and All Party Hurrivat Conference (APHC) representative Khadim Hussain were also present on the occasion.

Afridi further noted that Prime Minister (PM) Imran Khan said that "Kashmir is core of Pakistan's foreign policy" and all avenues would be explored to project the case of Kashmir. While lauding the contribution of Turgay Evren for the "Kashmir cause" Shehryar Afridi said that the Turkish artist had become a voice of the "unheard Kashmiri people" and noted that every Pakistani is in love with Turkey and its people.

The Turkish rights activist Turgay Evren highlighted the contributions from Muslims of the subcontinent to Turkey and noted that Muslims even left India to take part in the struggle for the Ottomans. Shehryar Afridi further said that the "marginalized and oppressed people of Kashmir" need support from Turkey. He noted that "Turkey has raised Kashmir at all global forums" and maintained that "plebiscite is a fundamental right of the people of Jammu and Kashmir and the world must give the Kashmiris their basic right." Turgay noted that he had already composed songs for the oppressed Palestinians, Yemenis and African people. He said that his songs on Kashmir had been translated into English, Arabic, Turkish and other languages.

Punjab Governor 'underlines UN's role to end the oppression of Kashmiris'

'EU closely monitoring IIOJK's human rights situation:' EU VP to Pakistan FM

The European Commission (EC) vice president, Josep Borrell, has said that European Union (EU) is "closely following the human rights situation in Jammu and Kashmir" and stressed resolution of the dispute through dialogue. He underscored the need for restraint, de-escalation of tensions and called for constructive political and diplomatic engagement. He made this statement while co-chairing the sixth round of the EU-Pak Strategic Dialogue along with the Foreign Minister (FM) of Pakistan, Shah Mahmood Qureshi in Brussels.

During the meeting, Qureshi reiterated "deep Pakistan's concerns about human rights violations by India in Jammu and Kashmir, and efforts to demography change the of the disputed territory in violation of United Nation Security Council (UNSC) resolutions." During the talk, Borrell welcomed the agreement of February 2021 between India and Pakistan for observance of ceasefire understanding at the Line of Control (LOC) in Jammu and Kashmir as an important step in the interest of regional peace and stability.

'Academia and Social Media can add value to the national narrative on Kashmir dispute:' Shehryar

The chairman of the parliamentary committee on Kashmir Shehryar Khan Afridi urged the world community to take notice of the "travesty of justice being committed by Indian occupational forces" against the political prisoners of Jammu and Kashmir. He expressed these views while addressing the participants of a seminar titled "The Iconic Prisoners of Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir" held at Pakistan Institute of Development Economics (PIDE). He said that India is "committing crime against iconic political prisoners" including Dr Qasim Faktoo, Syed Shabbir Ahmed Shah, Masarrat Alam Bhat, Dr Asiya Andrabi, Naheeda Nasreen, Fehmeeda Sofi, Yaseen Malick and others.

He said that the academia can play a pivotal role in spreading awareness about the "miserable conditions of the Kashmiri prisoners" who are kept in the jails in mainland India. He said that the silence over Indian steps taken after August 5, 2019, totally exposed the double standards of the global community. He noted that the "Indian occupational forces" were committing "war crimes" against the people of "occupied Jammu and Kashmir" but the world was silent. He said that academia can add value to the national narrative on the Kashmir dispute and they need to spread awareness among the youth on half widows, halforphans, demographic terrorism and other issues faced by the Kashmiri people. He further said that India is distorting history by producing movies under its "nefarious design" to mislead the world and the younger generations by erasing the history of the Kashmiri freedom struggle.

He noted that the successful holding of the Kashmir Premier League (KPL) has proved to the world that in "Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir (IIOJK), tyranny and oppression" is the order of the day while "Azad Kashmir" is a developing and thriving part of Kashmir. He urged the youths to

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become bloggers and storytellers of Kashmir on social media and break "Indian shackles" on social media. During the meeting, Professor Khuram Elahi shared some verses from the poetry of Allama Iqbal on Kashmir and his vision about the Muslims of the subcontinent. CM working on Digital and Aerial Connectivity Vision for GB

The spokesperson (Ali Taj) of Gilgit-Baltistan (GB) Chief Minister (CM) said that the GB CM Khalid Khurshid has a grand Land, Aerial and Digital Connectivity Vision to connect GB with the mainland country and the world. He noted that the GB CM made special efforts at the federal level to get the status of Skardu Airport upgraded as an International one. The GB CM also took special interest to finalize the feasibility of a new airport in Gilgit. It was due to the special efforts of the CM, that Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) started direct flight operation

from the several major cities of the country to GB this year which was previously limited to Islamabad. He said that under the historic 370-billion integrated development plan, GB Khalid Khurshid had envisioned a 5route land connectivity plan for GB. The GB's major land connectivity projects with the mainland country were Gilgit-Shandur Road, Astore Counter Valley Road, Tunnel Feasibility, Babusar and Tunnel Feasibility. One of the prospective plans for the improvement of land connectivity is to extend Karakoram Highway (KH) to both sides of the Indus River. The CM has already approved a project costing 41 crores for the construction of Alternate KH at the Tattapani section.

He further noted that the Raikote-Thakote Motorway project has been included in the China Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC). Ali Taj said that to further improve the digital connectivity, the CM has got a 4G internet license and taken up the matter of extension of Ignite and Universal Fund Pakistan Service (USF) jurisdiction to GB at the highest level in the federal government. He further emphasized that the grand land, aerial and digital connectivity vision of CM Khalid Khurshid will be the backbone of the Naya (New) GB. It will massively boost tourism, heavily enhance trade and rapidly develop the Information Technology (IT) and service sector.
