We shall not forget Jammu's 'martyrs' says KC-EU's Chairman

The chairman of Kashmir Council Europe (KC-EU) Ali Raza Syed said that we shall not forget the 'martyrs' of Jammu, and added that the martyrs provided great courage and strengthen the freedom movement of Jammu and Kashmir. During a meeting of the core committee of KC-EU held on the occasion of 'martyrdom day of Jammu' (on 6 November 1947) in Brussels, Ali Raza said, the 75-year history of Jammu and Kashmir is full of sacrifices and particularly people of 'illegally occupied Kashmir' are still paying a huge price for freedom struggle for the liberation of their homeland from Indian 'illegal occupation.' He claimed that there is no comparative example of 'genocide' of the people of Jammu and Kashmir by the Indian 'occupation forces', stressing that the martyrs of Jammu and Kashmir have a very important role in the freedom movement. He urged the international community to take serious notice of the 'severe' situation of human rights in Jammu and Kashmir.

Girl's school in Diamer set on fire by unknown miscreants

Dawn, 8 November 2022

A girls' school in Darel valley of Diamer district was set on fire by three unknown miscreants. The police have registered a First Information Report (FIR) under Section 6 (terrorist act) and 7 (punishment for the terrorist act) of the Anti-Terrorism Act along with Section 34 (acts done by several persons in furtherance of common intention), 341 (punishment for wrongful restraint), (mischief causing 427 damage to the amount of fifty rupees), and 436 (mischief by fire or explosive substance with intent to destroy a house, etc) of the Pakistan Penal Code. The miscreants torched the Girl's Middle School and fled the scene. Gilgit-Baltistan (GB) Chief Minister Khalid Khurshid ordered an investigation into the incident and has sought a report from the police with the commitment to take strict action against the criminals behind the incident. It is worth mentioning that 12 schools were set on fire in Diamer on Aug 3, 2018, for which the Taliban took responsibility and had strict action taken against them.

Tehreek-e-Kashmir conducts digital campaign in UK to remember forgotten Jammu 'genocide'

Pakistan today, 8 November 2022

The Tehreek-e-Kashmir-United Kingdom (TeK-UK) conducted a digital campaign, which was aimed to highlight the 'massacre committed on 400,000 Muslims in Jammu division of India 'Illegally occupied Jammu and Kashmir' (IIoJK) in the first week of

1947, claimed November Fahim Kayani, leader of the TeK UK. The TeK UK ran a digital van around the diplomatic enclave in London including around Indian High Commission besides landmark points including the British parliament. He said that Hindu Dogra autocratic Hari Singh in connivance with the then 'Indian army massacred Muslims in the Jammu division to physically change the demographics' of the Muslimmajority region.

He claimed that as per the 'historical evidence', tens of thousands of people, mostly Muslims, were 'brutally killed, burnt alive, abducted,' wounded, and thrown into rivers by the autocratic Singh who held the region under 'forcible rule.' He alleged that the 'Jammu massacre' was the first case of 'ethnic cleansing' after World War II. He claimed that the scars of the 'brutal massacre' are still fresh in the memories of Kashmiris and this chapter in the history of 'IIoJK' has not attained much attention in international academia and media. Kayani claimed that the 'Jammu Genocide' was committed because India was 'sacred that any plebiscite held in IIoJK' will be against her, since the region is mostly Muslims, adding that India took it upon itself to force a 'demographic change in IIoJK' by way of 'massacre.' He said that if 'properly probed', India can be held responsible for 'genocide, war crimes and crimes against humanity in Jammu Genocide case.'

'AJK' PM and President discuss the current Kashmir situation

The Prime Minister of 'Azad Jammu and Kashmir' (AJK), Tanveer Ilyas Khan held a detailed discussion on the current situation in Kashmir with the president of 'AJK', Sultan Mahmood Chaudhry at Jammu Kashmir House. While referring to his recent visit to the USA, he said that his visit was fruitful and expressed satisfaction over the diaspora community's role in raising the Kashmir issue abroad, adding that overseas **Kashmiris** are more enthusiastic than before in raising the issue. While citing his recent engagements with the high officials of the OIC, the UN, and the US administration, the president said that there was a dire need to amplify efforts both at the national and international level and increase diplomatic outreach to shape up world opinion in favor of Kashmir. He also said that the federal government will provide the requisite security for holding local elections.

Diamer police rule out terrorism in school fire incident

The Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Sher Khan said that the fire in a girls' school in Darel valley of Diamer district was not an act of terrorism. He further said that a security guard of the Girls' Middle School had been taken into custody and the investigation was being conducted from various angles. While the incident was initially being treated as a case of terrorism, there are now indications that it could have been a single individual rather than a terrorist, Khan added. Khan also highlighted the fact that militants would have claimed responsibility for the incident as they did in 2018 when 12 schools were burned. On the contrary, he said that instead, 'local militants' have expressed on social media that they are not related to the incident.

India violating human rights of Kashmiris, minorities: Pakistan FO

During the 4th Universal Periodic Review of India at a session of the United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) in Geneva, Pakistan Foreign Office (FO) secretary, Danyal Hasnain in a statement said that 'human rights' people' of the 'Kashmiri and 'minorities' in India were continued to with impunity.' be 'violated He claimed that India's 'abuses' had been widely documented and added that India's standing invitation to UN Special Procedure Mandate Holders to Kashmir during its previous UPR had never materialized. He said that India should reverse 'illegal steps' taken since 05 August 2019, in 'Occupied Jammu and Kashmir' and cease 'demographic engineering', added that should demonstrate India its commitment to international law by complying with article 25 of UN

Charter and implementing UNSC resolutions on Jammu and Kashmir. He that India should held accept the recommendations made in OHCHR's Kashmir reports and allow the independent observers access to the 'occupied territory.' He also expected that India should repeal the Armed Forces Special Powers Act (AFSPA), the Jammu and Kashmir Public Safety Act (PSA), the National Security Act (NSA), the Citizenship (Amendment) Act 2019, and the National Register of Citizens (NRC).

India is following the Israeli model to suppress Kashmiris' freedom struggle

The PM Narendra Modi-led 'Hindutva' assiduously government is implementing Palestinian Israel's occupation model in 'India illegally occupied Jammu and Kashmir' (ILOJK) as New Delhi and Tel Aviv are cooperating to coordinate their occupation tactics. The PM Modi regime's new domicile law for 'IIOJK' is a reflection of the Israeli colonial project, said a report released by the Kashmir Media Service (KMS). It added the then Israeli Foreign Minister Shimon Peres, during his visit to India in 1993, had said that the only solution to the Kashmir dispute is to 'settle Hindus' Indian there. India has recently accorded full access to Israel in 'IIOJK' in the name of cooperation in the agriculture sector and that Tel Aviv's decision to open two centers in

the 'occupied territory' is aimed at helping New Delhi to suppress the Kashmiris' freedom struggle.

The report said the Kashmiris and Palestinians have been demanding their UN-recognized right to selfdetermination for over seven decades, but India and Israel are unleashing similar types of 'brutalities 'on the people of both the 'occupied' regions to suppress their just cause of freedom. The report said the right to selfdetermination of the Kashmiris and Palestinians should be raised at all forums and the world must come forward to help them to secure their birthright. It claims that 'occupiers' India and Israel are openly violating international laws in Kashmir and Palestine. Global peace and stability are linked to resolutions of the two longpending disputes, it maintained. The report said close military cooperation between India and Israel is dangerous to humanity and world peace.

South Asian peace is threatened by silence on the Kashmir issue: Pasbane-Hurriyat

According to the Chairman of Pasbane-Hurriyat, Uzair Ahmad Ghazali, the 'Azad Kashmir' government should undertake a determined resistance effort for the independence of the 'Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir' (IIOJK), rather than making statements. While referring to the 'threatening' remarks made by Rajnath Singh, he said that such warnings would be devastating for the peace in the area. He expressed concern over the government's base camp dismal performance and noted that the Indian government's 'atrocities' in 'IIOJK' need to be documented and pursued. He said that the base camp's previous and current governments should be honest about whether or not they have constitutionally carried out their mandated duties and national

obligations. He questioned whether through frequent public international trips, announcements, conferences, speeches news and anything can be achieved? Would that force India's one million troops to leave the 'occupied' state. He said that 'AJK' government needs to be questioned because no practical, concrete or plan for the realistic *'liberation* movement' has been implemented by the base camp government over the past 33 years. The silence of the base camp on 05 August 2019, and the 'illegal' constitutional amendments made by India and inflicting worst attacks on Muslim identity in the 'occupied' part, raised many questions. He urged the 'AJK' government to mobilize the properly resistance movement its to carry out obligations for constitutional the freedom of the 'occupied state.'
