Iran not ready to recognize Taliban government

Iran is not ready to formally recognize the Taliban government in Afghanistan, a Foreign Ministry spokesperson said Monday, citing the importance of an inclusive Afghan government. "Today, we basically not at the point of are recognizing," Saeed Khatibzadeh said at a news conference. "We hope that the governing body of Afghanistan will move, through its actions, in a direction that will enable achieve it to international recognition." "Iran and the neighboring countries of Afghanistan insist particularly on the formation of an inclusive government which reflects the ethnic and demographic diversity of this country," Khatibzadeh added.

"Bits of progress have been made in the last few days," Le Drian said. "We have been heading in a positive direction in the last few days, but time is of the essence, because if we don't get an accord quickly there will be nothing to negotiate." On Tuesday, US State Department spokesperson Ned Price told reporters there had been some "modest progress" in the latest round of discussions, noting, "There has been some progress relative to the beginning of December in identifying the hard issues left to be negotiated."

Iran exports 110 MW of power to Afghanistan

A senior advisor to Iran's energy minister said that the country was exporting 110 megawatts of electricity to Afghanistan, with the maximum export capacity being 175 megawatts. Iran's power grid is connected to Afghanistan's Herat and the power transfer is carried out through four transfer lines. Mohammad Ali Farahnakian said in an exclusive interview with IRNA's economic correspondent on Saturday. Farahnakian said that Iran was working on plans to add 500 to 600 megawatts to the capacity, adding that Iran and Afghanistan had struck good deals, but the Afghan side didn't cooperate. The new governing body in Afghanistan showed positive pulse and made promises when the first Taliban minister visited Tehran last month, the advisor to energy minister noted.

Iran denies reports of interim deal

Iran's Foreign Ministry spokesman has denied media reports about a possible interim nuclear deal. Speaking to reporters Jan. 10, Saeed Khatibzadeh said, "We want a durable and reliable agreement and any agreement that does not have these two criteria is not on the agenda for us."

Khatibzadeh continued, "We all have to be certain that America's return [to the original deal] is verified and guaranteed and the cycle of sanctions have to be removed — none of these can happen with an interim agreement." Arab-language newspaper Rai Al-Youm originally reported on the possibility of an interim agreement, though this is not the first time in these latest rounds of talks that reports have surfaced of its possibility.

"The crime of assassinating scientists will not go unpunished as a gross violation of Human Rights," Qaribabadi said.

Iranian commander promises more satellite launches

Air Defense: Iraq's airspace is secure, drone processing systems will enter service

He continued that "We have anti-drone systems to deal with small drones, but they are limited and few, so the government, headed by the Prime Minister and Minister of Defense, seeks to obtain a better quality of these systems to address all the threats that affect officials and vital places in Iraq in Baghdad and the provinces."

US troops in Syria, Iraq targeted with renewed rocket and drone attacks

Rockets rained down near bases used by US troops in Iraq and Syria on Wednesday, marking the third straight day of such attacks since the two-year anniversary of the US killing of Iranian general Qasem Soleimani on Monday. No one was reported injured in the barrages, which targeted the US-led coalition's site near al-Omar oilfield in Syria, Iraq's Ayn al-Asad airbase in Anbar province and the international airport in Baghdad, which houses Iraqi and coalition troops. At least five rockets also landed near Asad Airbase west of Baghdad today. The coalition said none of the projectiles hit the base, with the closest landing more than a mile away. Iraqi security forces said they recovered a launcher and unfired 240mm rocket in the al-Jihad neighborhood of Baghdad on Wednesday morning. A group calling itself Saraya Qasem al-Jabaareen claimed credit for the attempted attack on Ayn al-Asad in a written statement released Wednesday. The group vowed to continue the strikes until US forces fully withdraw from the country.

The Iran-supported malign actors fired on the Coalition and SDF from within civilian infrastructure with no regard for civilian safety."

2 rockets fired from Gaza hit off central Israel coast; terror groups blame weather

The Israel Defense Forces said Saturday morning that two rockets were fired from the Gaza Strip toward central Israel. Large explosions were heard in a number of central Israel cities around 7 a.m. Video circulating on social media showed an explosion in the sea off the coast of Jaffa. Other footage apparently showed the two rockets being fired from Gaza. There were no sirens warning of incoming rockets, in a sign that no projectiles were headed for populated areas. The Iron Dome missile defense system was not activated for the same reason. Armed factions in Gaza said the rocket fire was "caused by weather conditions," not the first time the excuse has been used to explain the firing of projectiles toward Israel.

Israel carries out airstrikes in Gaza in response to rockets off Tel Aviv coast

The Israel Defense Forces carried out retaliatory airstrikes in Gaza late Saturday night after two rockets fired from Gaza landed off the Tel Aviv coast on Saturday morning. "Fighter jets and helicopters attacked a series of targets in a rocket production facility belonging to the Hamas terror group," the IDF said in a statement.

Israeli tanks also shelled Hamas military posts near Gaza's border with Israel. Hamas media said Israeli warplanes struck a Hamas outpost west of Khan Younis, in the southern part of the Strip, while tanks targeted outposts in northern Gaza. "Hamas is responsible and bears the consequences for all activity in and emanating from the Gaza Strip," the IDF said.

Anti-aircraft missiles fired at IDF helicopters during Gaza strike, but miss

In a rare incident, Gazan terrorists targeted Israeli military helicopters with shoulderlaunched anti-aircraft missiles over the Strip early Sunday morning during airstrikes carried out by the Israel Defense Forces. During retaliatory airstrikes shortly after midnight, Hamas operatives fired two SAM-7 anti-aircraft missiles toward raiding helicopters west of Gaza City, Palestinian media outlets said. The IDF confirmed that anti-aircraft missiles were fired at the helicopters, but would not comment on how many. The military said the missiles missed their mark and caused neither injury nor damage.

IDF intel chief reportedly says restored Iran nuke deal better than talks failing

The head of Military Intelligence reportedly told the high-level security cabinet that it would be better for Israel if a deal is reached to curb Iran's nuclear program in exchange for sanctions relief, appearing to break with the government's position that the failure of talks is preferable to anything but a significantly bolstered pact. Citing two unnamed ministers who took part in the meeting this week, the Walla news site reported Tuesday that Maj. Gen. Aharon Haliva said restoring the 2015 nuclear agreement would provide greater certainty about the limitations on Iran's atomic activities than if talks between Iran

and world powers fall apart. According to the report, Haliva's comments were in response to Mossad chief David Barnea, who did not express support for a restored nuclear deal and told ministers he believed there was still time to influence the United States regarding the conditions for an agreement.

Amid talk of Iran strike, Bennett says Israel rearming as it hasn't for years

UAE's nuclear energy corporation set to produce 85% of Abu Dhabi clean electricity by 2025

The UAE said Wednesday it can produce around one million tonnes of hydrogen per year from nuclear power once all its four units are operational, according to the CEO of the Emirates Nuclear Energy Corporation (ENEC). The Emirates Nuclear Energy Corporation (ENEC) said on Wednesday it was set to produce 85 percent of Abu Dhabi's clean electricity by 2025. The Barakah nuclear power plant's fourth unit had the potential to create one million tonnes of hydrogen per year, Mohamed Ibrahim al-Hammadi, chief executive of ENEC, said. "This low carbon fuel is essential to transition to a net zero world," he said at an energy conference.

The plant in Abu Dhabi, capital of the UAE, is the first nuclear power plant in the Arab world and is part of the Gulf oil producer's efforts to diversify its energy mix.
