IRAN

Iran: IAEA informed about moving centrifuge parts to Isfahan

Tehran Times, February 3, 2022

Iran's decision to produce centrifuge parts in a new complex in Isfahan instead of the Tesa complex in Karaj is done with the knowledge of the Vienna-based International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) and now the UN nuclear watchdog would be able to adjust its regulatory and monitoring standards accordingly, Iran's acting ambassador to the IAEA said late on Monday. "The IAEA report is a regular update which provides the latest technical information on Iran's nuclear activities to its members," Mohammad Reza Ghaebi explained. He continued by saving that according to the report, Iran has informed the Agency that it intends to produce centrifuge parts in a new complex in Isfahan instead of the Tesa complex, which has not yet begun its work, and the IAEA will be able to meet regulatory standards. "However, information about this monitoring will remain with Iran and the IAEA will not have access to it until Iran resumes its nuclear obligations under the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA)," he explained.

Iran's nuclear R&D achievements can't be restricted by any deal: top official

A top Iranian security official has underlined that Iran's achievements with respect to nuclear research and development (R&D) can't be limited by any deal. Ali Shamkhani, secretary of the Supreme National Security Council, said on Twitter that Iran's right to move ahead with its nuclear R&D activities should be

protected in case a deal was reached in the Vienna talks aimed to revive a 2015 nuclear deal known as the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA). "Iran's legal right to continue research and development and to maintain its peaceful nuclear capabilities and achievements, along with its security against supported evils, cannot be restricted by any agreement," the top security official tweeted on Saturday.

Amir Abdollahian says Vienna talks proceeding based on a new text

Foreign Minister Hossein Amir Abdollahian stresses that Iran will not have direct negotiations with the Americans in Vienna and that Tehran will try to lift as many sanctions as possible, according to a member of the National Security and Foreign Policy Committee of the Iranian parliament. The announcement by Ebrahim Rezaei comes as the parliament held a closed-door session on Tuesday with Amir Abdollahian. "The foreign minister said in this session that the negotiations and talks have proceeded according to the new text," Rezaei told the Mehr news agency. He added that the chief diplomat stressed that the parliamentary ratification on lifting sanctions and protecting the rights of the Iranian people is the Islamic Republic's red line in the negotiations.

Iran unveils Kheibar Shekan missile with 1,450 KM range

The Islamic Revolution Guard Corps (IRGC) on Wednesday unveiled new missile called "Kheibar Shekan" with 1,450

Kilometers range. The unveiling ceremony of Kheibar Shekan missile was held in the presence of Chief of Staff of Iranian Armed Forces Major-General Mohammad Bagheri and IRGC Commander of the Aerospace Brigadier General Amir Hajizadeh. The new strategic long-range missile, which uses solid fuel, is classified among the third generation of the IRGC missiles, and is unique in terms of weight and firing. Kheibar Shekan missile's weight is reduced by one-third in comparison to similar ones and the time needed to launch it has been reduced by six times.

Iraq seeks to develop its air capabilities

Israel takes part in naval exercise with Saudi Arabia, Oman

Israel is participating in a US Navy-led maritime exercise with Saudi Arabia and Oman, despite lacking diplomatic relations with both countries. The International Maritime Exercise (IMX) is the largest in the region, with 60 countries and some 9,000 personnel participating this year. IMX kicked off Monday at the US 5th Fleet's headquarters in Bahrain, and the exercise will take place across the Arabian Gulf, Arabian Sea, Gulf of Oman, Red Sea and North Indian Ocean. A US Navy spokesperson described high levels of cooperation among the exercise participants, telling Reuters, "Here in the region we have had nothing but positive results in terms of planning efforts."

Israel to operate laser-based defense system within year

Israeli Prime Minister Naftali Bennett said Tuesday that the nation's army will deploy a laser air defense system to intercept drones, missiles and UAVs within one year. Bennett made the announcement in an address at the annual international conference of the Institute for National Security Studies (INSS), according to the official Israeli KAN news channel. He said the new system will be deployed first in the south to tackle rocket attacks from the Gaza Strip and the technology will be offered to Israel's friends in the region against what he

said are threats from Iran and its proxies. The Israeli Defense Ministry said in January 2020 that it developed a laser interception system against rockets after decades of failed attempts.

Israel signs security cooperation agreement with Bahrain

In a first official visit to Manama, Defense Minister Benny Gantz signed memorandum of understanding with his Bahraini counterpart Abdullah Bin Hassan Al Nuaimi, formalizing the security relationship between the two countries. After the signing, Gantz met with Bahraini Crown Prince and Prime Minister Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa and then with King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa. A statement issued by the office of Gantz said the agreement will help advance intelligence coordination, providing a framework for exercises and cooperation between the countries' defense industries.

Israel said to fear restored Iran deal will leave breakout time of only a few months

Israel fears that reviving the nuclear deal between Iran and world powers may leave Tehran only a few months away from having enough fissile material for an atomic bomb, Israeli television reported Saturday.

The Kan public broadcaster did not specify who in Israel was concerned by the possibility that Iran's so-called breakout time would be significantly shorter under a restored nuclear agreement. But American sources quoted in the report appeared to acknowledge such a prospect. "It is better to have a distance of a few months and not just weeks, as would happen if no agreement is signed," the sources said.

IDF: Syrian anti-aircraft missile explodes over Israel, no interception needed

An anti-aircraft missile fired from Syria exploded in the air over northern Israel early Wednesday morning, setting off warning sirens in the town of Umm al-Fahm and communities in the northern West Bank, the army said. Residents reported hearing a loud explosion in the area. There were no immediate reports of casualties. "A launch was identified from Syrian territory toward Israel. The missile exploded in the air and as such there was no need to carry out an interception," the Israel Defense Forces said. Shrapnel landed near the Homesh outpost, causing a small fire, according to Rescuers Without Borders, a Jewish emergency service operating in the West Bank

Israel, Morocco agree \$500m defence missile deal

Israel and Morocco have agreed a \$500 million deal that will see Israeli Aerospace Industries (IAI) supply the African country with the Barak MX air and missile defense system, *Globes* reported yesterday.

Morocco, the Globes said, initially made enquiries about Israel providing these and other systems when Israeli Minister of Defence Benny Gantz visited the country in November. During his visit. Gantz signed memorandum a understanding (MoU) about defence collaboration between the two countries, the site added. Reporting defence sources, the Globes said that Morocco spoke with Israel about its needs and Israel proposed several options including the Barak system was chosen because of its flexibility and capabilities in various areas. IAI CEO Boaz Levy visited Morocco secretly and presented the missile defence systems' capabilities and closed the deal.

Israel torpedoed sale of Iron Dome to Ukraine, fearing Russian reaction — report

Israel halted an attempt by the US to transfer several batteries of the Iron Dome defense system to Ukraine over worries it would damage its relations with Russia, the Ynet news site reported on Tuesday. According to the report, the defense system's capabilities — especially during the 2021 Gaza war — piqued the interest of Ukrainian officials. The country's representatives began working vigorously in Washington last year to persuade US lawmakers to initiate a transfer of the rocket and mortar defense system to them. According to the report, Israeli officials made it clear to the US administration in informal talks that it wouldn't agree to the transfer of Iron Dome batteries to Kviv, fearing it would hurt its relations with Russia, especially in light of Moscow's influence over Syria.

US Navy eyes Israeli robot boats for Middle East ops as Bennett visits Bahrain

The US Navy is considering adding unmanned Israeli boats to its joint Middle East operations, a US official said, a move that could deepen Israel's growing role in regional military arrangements as it normalises ties with former foes in the Gulf.

Bahrain, home to the US Navy's Fifth Fleet and several international naval task forces, is hosting a visit by Israeli Prime Minister Naftali Bennett, the first by any Israeli leader following the 2020 normalisation of ties between the two states.

US approves \$4.2 billion F-16 sale to Jordan, air defense systems to Gulf

The Biden administration notified Congress on Thursday of a planned sale of \$4.21 billion worth of 12 F-16 C/D fighter jets to Jordan, as well as command-and-control systems and HAWK surface-to-air missiles to upgrade air defenses in Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates, respectively. The sales come as the UAE has come under unprecedented attacks ballistic bv missiles and claimed drones Yemen's Houthi rebels. Though most of the attacks missed their targets or were shot down, one strike last month killed three people in Abu Dhabi.

Israel sanctions Lebanese companies aiding Hezbollah missile project

"Hezbollah is endangering the citizens of Lebanon and the State of Lebanon. We will continue to offer humanitarian assistance to the citizens while acting resolutely in the face of the Iranian precision [missile] project operating from the heart of Lebanon," Gantz said in a statement issued by his office.

Lebanon, Israel 'narrowing gaps' towards a maritime border deal after 10 years of talks

Lebanon and Israel are at a moment of "narrowing" gaps towards reaching a deal on their disputed maritime borders, a senior US diplomat said on Wednesday. "I think after 10 years of these discussions, it's time for moving on to a deal. I came here in November. I was in Israel. And now we're at a stage where I understand the parties' positions, and I think that we're at the moment of narrowing those gaps towards a deal," the State Department's senior advisor for global energy security, Amos Hochstein, said. But progress seems to have been made, building off former US diplomat David Schenker's successful efforts to get Lebanese and Israeli officials in the same room for indirect talks.

US okays F-16 sales to Jordan, air defense boosts for Saudi Arabia, UAE

The US State Department approved potential sales of fighter jets and air defense systems to Jordan, Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates to help stabilize the region and counter Iran, Washington said Thursday. The proposed sales include fighter jets, munitions and other equipment for Amman, with a price tag of \$4.21 billion; \$23.7 million in upgrades to Saudi Arabia's missile defense systems; and \$65 million in spare parts for missile defense systems deployed by the UAE, according to the US Defense Department, which announced the approvals.

Biden pledges US support against Houthi attacks to Saudi king

Wednesday's call came as the Houthis have intensified drone and missile attacks against Saudi Arabia and have begun directly targeting the United Arab Emirates (UAE), Riyadh's key ally in the region. "The president underscored the US commitment to support Saudi Arabia in the defense of its people and territory from these attacks and full support for UN-led efforts to end the war in Yemen," the White House said in a statement describing the talks.

Shrapnel wounds 12 as Saudi defences blow up drone near airport

At least 12 people have been injured by shrapnel after Saudi air defences intercepted and destroyed a drone close to the kingdom's southern border with Yemen. In comments carried by the Ekhbariya news channel, the Saudi Arabialed military coalition battling Yemen's Houthi rebels said on Thursday travellers and workers of various nationalities were wounded by the falling debris in the vicinity of Abha international airport. Houthi military spokesperson Yahya Sarea said the group hit a military target at Abha airport with a Qasef 2 drone. Shrapnel from the drone attack at midday fell inside airport grounds and some glass facades were damaged, it said. Light injuries were sustained by two Saudi nationals and citizens of Bangladesh, Nepal, India, the Philippines and Sri Lanka.

Terrorist organizations leaders plan to carry out attacks in Syria, Russian MoD warns

"The last three days have witnessed 10 terrorist attacks and subversive operations in those areas, killing 18 people and wounding 25 others," Zhuravlev said.

Turkey, UAE discuss improving defense, military cooperation

Officials from Turkey and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) on Monday discussed the prospects of developing their bilateral defense and military cooperation. He noted that the newly delivered drones are equipped with the leading defense firm Aselsandeveloped Common Aperture Targeting System (CATS). CATS is a highperformance electro-optical reconnaissance, surveillance and targeting system designed for fixed-wing and rotaryairborne platforms, including wing

unmanned air systems (UASs), helicopters and aircraft.

Greece set to ratify major arms agreement with France

The Greek parliament is expected to approve the 3 billion euro (\$3.4 billion) agreement for three new French-made frigates amid ongoing tensions with Turkey. Lawmakers are also debating on Tuesday whether to add six new Rafale fighter jets to an existing order for 18 planes – six of them newly built and 12 that were previously in service in the French air force. Greek Prime Minister Kyriakos Mitsotakis and French President Emmanuel Macron finalized the frigate deal last year along

with an enhanced defense cooperation agreement between their countries. Made by France's Naval Group, two warships are due to be delivered in 2025 and the third the following year, with an option to add a fourth frigate to be ready in 2027. Turkey has often warned Greece against indulging in an arms race, offering instead to resolve all outstanding issues, including in the Aegean, Eastern Mediterranean and Cyprus, through dialogue.

UAE intercepts and destroys 3 hostile drones

Three hostile drones were intercepted over the United Arab Emirates at dawn on Wednesday, the country's defense ministry said. The drones managed to penetrate Emirati airspace but were destroyed away from populated areas, the ministry said on Twitter. It's unclear to whom the drones belonged. Yemen's Iranian-backed Houthi rebels, a possible culprit, have not claimed responsibility. The Houthis have launched a series of attacks on the Emiratis, beginning with a January 17 drone strike that killed three foreign workers in the capital, Abu Dhabi. The Saudi-led coalition responded with a weeklong offensive in Yemen.

US to help UAE replenish missile defence interceptors: General

The United States will help replenish the United Arab Emirates's missile interceptors after a slew of attacks by Yemen's Houthi rebels targeting the Gulf country, a top US general has said. "We will help with replenishment of interceptors. And we'll do everything we can to assist [the] UAE in defending themselves," Frank McKenzie, head of the US Central Command which oversees the Middle East, told the Reuters news agency in an interview after a trip to Abu Dhabi. Reuters cited an anonymous source as saying that the UAE had requested US replenishment of its THAAD and Patriot missile defence systems.

US F-22 fighter jets arrive in UAE after attacks by Iran-backed rebels

US F-22 fighter jets arrived in the United Arab Emirates on Saturday, part of an American defense response to recent missile attacks by Yemen's Houthi rebels targeting the country. The Raptors landed at Al-Dhafra Air Base in Abu Dhabi, which hosts some 2,000 US troops. American soldiers there launched Patriot interceptor missiles in response to the Houthi attacks last month, the first time US troops have fired the system in combat since the 2003 US-led invasion of Iraq. American officials declined to say how many F-22s were deployed or the number of airmen supporting the aircraft, citing operational security.
