### In this Edition

The WAPDA (Water and Power Development Authority) has been urged to expedite the process of land acquisition for the controversial Bhasha Dam during a seminar held in Islamabad on January 6, 2011. Alongside, a resettlement plan for the affected people was proposed in the same conference where there was large scale participation from major stakeholders. In the next eight months, the WAPDA seeks to complete the construction of 5 small dams which would significantly improve the power generation capability in Pakistan and PoK. On the other side, the local body elections in Gilgit Baltistan are scheduled to be held in March 2011 in order to ensure good governance and welfare of the common people, as noted by the a provincial minister, Engineer Ismail. Meanwhile in Gilgit Baltistan, the PPP led government has stated it is determined to carry out developmental activities.

The rehabilitation work in the flood affected areas in the so called AJK was marred by the cold weather which generally is hostile to such activities. People rendered homeless by the calamity were hence left struggling without proper shelters and facilities. In addition, there is a report in the issue which describes the state of corruption in PoK by citing the case of fake certificates furnished by a minister in the elections. His appointment was later declared null and void by the Supreme Court.

There are indications that US is getting involved in certain projects in PoK as part of its larger commitment to infrastructure building in Pakistan. If proved correct in due course, the development could adversely impact the Indo US relations especially in the long term perspective keeping in view India's sensitivities on PoK.

### Mangla Dam: WAPDA pays remaining compensation to AJK

The Express Tribune, January 19, 2011

LAHORE: The Water and Power Development Authority (Wapda) has paid the remaining amount of Rs3 billion to the government of Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK) on account of compensation for the residents affected by the Mangla Dam raising project.

According to Wapda, complete payment for land acquisition and property for the Mangla Dam project has now been made and the AJK government has started disbursement of the amount to the affected people. The process will be completed by the end of next month and after that the displaced people will be given sufficient time to construct houses on alternative locations.

Wapda said the development has paved the way for filling the Mangla Dam, whose capacity had been increased in 2009 but water storage could not be started due to non-payment of compensation money caused by the financial crunch. Now, Wapda has planned to start test-filling of the water reservoir up to 1,230 feet above mean sea level this year. The Mangla Dam raising project is being completed at a revised cost of Rs101 billion, out of which Rs64 billion has been allocated for resettlement of residents alone.

MUZAFFARABAD: With the first snowfall of the season in upper Neelum and Jhelum valleys, Rawalakot and Haveli districts of Azad Jammu and Kashmir, most of the humanitarian organisations have halted their operations in quake and flood-stricken areas.

### Shabbir Mir, Black day observed in Gilgit, Hunza

GILGIT: As people affected by the Attabad landslide-triggered lake gathered in Gilgit to observe its first anniversary, the government in Hunza imposed a ban to stop processions and rallies planned by protesters as part of the January 4 blackday. "We want action not words," chanted the protestors who were holding placards on January 4.

Last year, on January 4, as many as 20 people perished, including children and women, after a small hamlet called Attabad in Hunza plunged into the Hunza River. This occurred following the creation of a natural lake that has now expanded 23 kilometres upstream and has submerged four villages. The lake has marooned over 25,000 inhabitants of Gojal valley for the past one year as the government failed to drain the lake, though an attempt was made by creating a spillway.

#### Corruption rises in Pakistani Kashmir

The misconduct of political elite and top government functionaries suggests that Pakistan Administered Jammu & Kashmir (PAJK), commonly known as Azad (free) Kashmir, is literally free from the burden of all rules, regulations and laws.

Surprisingly, in a rampant political and administrative corrupt regime a member of ruling political party has been disqualified over deception and misconduct. On October 29, 2010 the AJK Minister Chaudhry Rukhsar was ejected from the parliament when the Supreme Court of the semi-autonomous region, proved him guilty of submitting forged educational documents to prove his eligibility as a candidate in the election process. The MLA of the ruling Muslim Conference from southern Mirpur district had sent bogus certificates of O and A levels of British educational standards.

In AJK, a few mighty hands never feel shame of capturing any occasion to seize political and administrative powers by any means. They do not have an iota of respect to their legal, ethical or social obligations. The reason being their political survival maintained by close family ties with highups in civil and military bureaucracy. In the presence of ad-hoc judicial arrangements and a guarded media the accountability mechanism is hilarious. Lack of an institutional control on corruption and a political will to prosecute the violators, has turned the region into a haven for opportunists.

#### Wapda urged to acquire land for Bhasha Dam

ISLAMABAD: Water and Power Development Authority (WAPDA) has been urged to speed up land acquisition for the construction of Diamer-Bhasha Dam, speakers at a conference noted on January 6. Speaking at the stakeholders' seminar on "Land acquisition and resettlement of mega hydropower projects in Pakistan", the participants noted that just 45 days are left in the ground-breaking of the project and WAPDA has acquired only 150 acres land. The total area to be acquired for this purpose is around 37,419 acres.

Speakers said that the dam on completion would have 8.1MAF gross storage, while 6.4MAF storage of live water will be available for supplementing

irrigation supplies. Weighted annual value of storage has been worked out to be Rs50,824 million, while it would generate 4,500MW electricity.

### WAPDA to complete construction of 5 small dams in next eight months: Durrani

ISLAMABAD: Five small dams having power generation capacity of 225 MW would be completed during next eight months to help mitigate power shortage in the country. The projects to be completed during the period include Sattpara dam, Gomal zam and Jinnah Hydel Power projects, Chairman Pakistan Water and Power Development

Authority (WAPDA), Shakeel Durrani said while addressing the two-day seminar on 'Land Acquisition and Resettlement of Mega Hydropower Projects in Pakistan, on January 7.

The government has released Rs. 6 billion for Mangla uprising projects and payments to the affectees would start from the next month, he noted adding that it would increase the storage capacity of the dam by additional 2.8 million acre feet water by next raining season.

### Gilgit-Baltistan security: Expenditure on forces to be cut down Shabbir Mir

GILGIT: Gilgit-Baltistan Chief Minister Mehdi Shah stated on January 7 that the expenditure on the region's internal security will be cut down by 40 per cent to bring the faltering economy back on track. "In the first instance, the number of vehicles being used by the security forces will be reduced," Shah noted.

At present, Rs600 million is being spent annually on the vehicles being used by forces in Gilgit-Baltistan. Security of the region had been beefed up in light of the sectarian clashes that hit the region five years ago when more than 100 people fell to target killings in 2006. Rangers were also deputed in Gilgit to assist the police and are still in Gilgit, putting pressure on the region's budget.

### Shabbir Mir, Broken promises: Substandard airports hindering tourism in G-B

GILGIT: Pakistani Prime Minister Yousaf Raza Gilani made a promise back in 2009 to upgrade the airports of Gilgit and Skardu and bring them at par with international standards. Fifteen months later, locals have begun to think that the promise, made prior to the general elections in October 2009, was nothing more than electioneering by PM Gilani.

Gilgit Airport is located on the edge of a slope and has a one-kilometre-long runway. The strip is too short for most mid-sized aircraft including Boeing 737s and the Airbus A320 family to take-off and land on. While Skardu Airport is comparatively larger, it also lacks the facilities of an international-level airport.

Since the grounding of Fokker aircraft in 2006, Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) operates two daily flights using French-Italian ATR 42 turboprop aircraft between Gilgit and Islamabad. Each flight can accommodate around 40 passengers. C-130 aircraft are also employed by PIA to make sorties to this mountainous region.

#### Federalization of Chitral-Gilgit Road

The federal Minister for Communications, Dr. Arbab Alamgir has disclosed that the Government

of Gilgit-Baltistan and KP have requested to the federal government to involve the National Highway Authority of Pakistan to construct the important strategic road between Gilgit and Chitral.

The Federal Minister, while talking to the members of National Highway Commission in a meeting convened on January 19 at Islamabad told that the KP government and the government of Gilgit-Baltistan have requested the NHA to construct the Road between the two districts Chitral and Gilgit.

"Due to the natural disasters and land sliding, the Gilgit-Baltistan is most of the times landlocked. Same is the situation for Chitral in winter. This alternate road by National Highway Authority would ease that tension and provide alternate routs for the two regions." The federal Minister said.

### Attabad Lake: Spillway re-opened, outflow 22,000 cusecs

The spillway was reopened on January 27 on recommendation of American, Chinese and Nespak experts, noted a press release. The water flow into the Hunza River after the spillway was opened is about 22,000 cusecs. As a preventive measure, the government of Gilgit-Baltistan (G-B), on directives of National Disaster Management Authority, has vacated the low lying areas downstream till the water flow stabilises.

Currently water-level in the lake is lowering at about seven inches per hour. The G-B government has also imposed Section 144 along the river banks to restrict movement. If things go according to Frontier Works Organisation plan, the water level in the lake will be lowered by an additional 30 metres by May 2011 and the 15 kilometres of the Karakoram Highway currently under water will reemerge.

The lake was formed last year on January 4 during a landslide that completely buried Attabad village and killed 20 people. About 6,000 people were displaced and a further 25,000 were stranded in the upstream villages.

### Shabbir Mir, Staying warm: A luxury in Gilgit-Baltistan

GILGIT: Already suffering from power outages and fuel shortage, the people of Gilgit-Baltistan must now contend with the disappearance of firewood from markets during the harsh winter.

"We cannot afford to buy kerosene oil and gas for heating purposes as the prices are simply beyond our means," said senior citizen Munir Akhtar on January 2 as he failed to find firewood to keep his family warm. He said at some places Rs600 was being charged for 40 kgs which he said was beyond his budget. LPG gas was available at Rs180 per kg in Gilgit, compelling ordinary people to stay away from purchasing it. Along with the skyrocketing prices of petroleum products, Kerosene has remained in short supply for most of the winter. The availability of electricity is also limited and people have to brave more than 19 hours of load shedding a day.

Most of the depots and wood stalls in Gilgit ran out of wood in December and remained so till January 2 as consumption increased with the cold weather. The government also didn't allow transportation of wood from Chilas to Gilgit and other parts in an attempt to discourage illegal logging.

### Roshan Mughal, University in AJK: Court intervenes to rectify bidding anomalies

### Shabbir Mir, Attabad landslide lake: One year on, the threat is still looming

GILGIT: The emergency created by a massive landslide that struck Hunza's Attabad village on January 4 last year refuses to subside. Thousands living up and down the 23-kilometre-long lake are still under threat from the lake that was created by the landslide. Many people in Gilgit-Baltistan believe that the Attabad Lake disaster is the biggest-ever calamity to have hit the region. "It is such a big disaster that even the region's history is silent about it [in shock]," stated Farman Karim, who lost four family members in the disaster.

At least 20 people died in the landslide that blocked the Hunza River, creating a lake that gradually expanded 23 kilometres upstream, submerging four villages Ainabad, Shishkat, Gulmit and Gulkin. The landslide also blocked the Karakoram Highway (KKH), a vital trade link to China, cutting off 26,000 people in Upper Hunza Valley, also known as Gojal Valley. The debris obstructed nearly three kilometres of the once fast-flowing river and a longer stretch of the highway.

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Government lifted certain restrictions on establishing electricity projects of over 50 mw, which will pave the way for setting up 17 hydropower projects in Azad Jammu and Kashmir, Kyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) and Punjab provinces. All these projects would be functional by the end of 2017. Sources in the Planning Commission stated that all bottlenecks had been removed which had halted the construction progress of 5107 mw capacity hydropower projects. These will provide cheap electricity and help bridge the power deficit the country has been facing in the shape of load shedding.

Out of total, nine hydropower projects would be

located in Azad Jammu and Kashmir with installed capacity of 2154 mw. Each project has different completion date. New Bong Escape Hydropower Project near Mangla has 84 mw capacity and would be completed by the end of 2013. Other projects include Kotli (100 mw), Gulpur (100 mw), Rajdhani (132 mw), Sehra (130 mw), and Patrind (147 mw). Construction work would be completed in 2014. Two projects, Chakothi-Hattian (139 mw) and Azad Patan (222 mw) would start functioning in 2016. The completion date of Kohala hydropower project (1100 mw) is 2017. The cost of these projects would be recovered within five years.

### Ashraf vows to add more electricity to national grid

Minister for Water and Power Raja Pervez Ashraf stated on January 10 that eight private power projects of 1,611MW have been commissioned within the past couple of years, and another 800MW would be added into the national grid by private sector this year out of which some projects are already under test runs.

He stated this while chairing 86th meeting of the Board of Private Power and Infrastructure Board. The meeting was attended by Secretary Water and Power Javed Iqbal, Secretary Planning Commission Sohail Ahmad, Chief Secretary AJK Mohammad Shahzad Arbab, member FBR Abrar Ahmad, Joint Secretary Ministry of Finance Shabbir Ahmed, Managing Director PPIB N A Zuberi, Secretary Energy/Power Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Sohail Altaf, MD SHYDO Syed Ishtiaq Hussain Shah besides other senior government officials.

Ashraf advised the Private Power and Infrastructure Board (PPIB) to hold a national debate through a seminar of national and international experts, politicians, academia and subject specialists from all walks of life for seeking an out of the box solution to the energy issues being faced by the country.

#### 2 girl schools blown up in Chilas

GILGIT: At least two girls' schools were blown up in Chilas valley in a predawn attempt on January 15 while outside wall of a mosque was partially damaged, officials stated. "The incident occurred at around 2:00am," noted an administration official. He stated that no loss of life was reported in the blast that triggered a sharp reaction from the people who termed it a conspiracy against the Diamer-Bhasha Dam and other development projects.

"Three rooms of the government Girls High School Chilas and two rooms of Social Action Programme [SAP] School were damaged in two separate blasts," he noted, adding that the boundary wall of a mosque was also partially damaged as the third blast occurred.

The official stated that investigations were on but no arrests had been made so far. Meanwhile, a delegation from Diamer comprising clerics denounced the blasts and termed it a conspiracy to label the people of Diamer district as hard core who are against the female education. "But we want to make it clear that we have nothing to do with such sabotaging activities," they noted, adding that they are not against female education and NGOs in their area.
