In this Edition

US Ambassador to Pakistan, Cameron Munter, paid a visit to the so called AJK on 13 June 2012. During his visit, Munter held meeting with Prime Minister AJK, Chaudhry Abdul Majeed and interacted with representative from NGOs. This was preceded by the visit of US embassy delegation to Gilgit Baltistan during May-June 2012. The high profile visit of US officials to the PoK signals a growing interest of the United States in this part of Kashmir. The US which in the past has funded the Satpara dam near Skardu is also likely the fund the controversial Diامر Bhasha Dam. Apart from the hydropower projects, the US Ambassador during his visit conveyed US willingness to support developing education sector and basic infrastructural facilities in the AJK.

Meanwhile, the Asian Development Bank (ADB) has expressed certain reservations on the Diامر Bhasha dam project. A senior official from ADB (noted to lead the consortium) stated that Pakistan should approach other donor agencies such as the World Bank as it is huge project. The hesitance of the ADB has spiraled up the problems for Pakistan who earlier failed to get commitment from the World Bank to participate in the funding process. The World Bank is said to have linked its acceptance to India's concurrence, as the site of the dam is located in a region legally claimed by India.

Both Gilgit Baltistan and the so called AJK presented their budgets in the month of June, details being given in several reports included in this issue. In Gilgit Baltistan Assembly, a demand was raised that at least 50% of the funds should be allocated to new projects. The lawmakers complained that most of the funds were absorbed by the ongoing incomplete projects and this does not allow new projects to start.

Mushtaq Ghumman, Diamer-Bhasha dam: ADB expressing support insincerely?

Asian Development Bank (ADB) is noted to be expressing support for Diamer-Bhasha dam project insincerely. A delegation of ADB, headed by Klaus Gerhaeusser, Director General, and Central West Asia Department called on the Federal minister for Water and Power, Ahmad Mukhtar on June 28. "ADB is no longer enthusiastic about the Diamer-Bhasha dam and the earlier schedule of an international road show and due diligence carried by their consultants has been postponed," stated an official on condition of anonymity.

On the Diamer-Bhasha dam, the Asian Development Bank has informed Wapda that other multilateral financial institutions, the World Bank and other potential donors needed to be approached, the sources added. On October 17, 2011, the then Prime Minister, Syed Yousuf Raza Gilani, laid the foundation stone of the \$12 billion Diamer-Bhasha dam capable of generating 4,500 megawatts of electricity and a reservoir capacity to store over eight million acre-foot of water to meet the country's growing power and irrigation needs.

Majeed announces regularization of contractual employees

MIRPUR (AJK) (APP): Azad Jammu Kashmir (AJK) Prime Minister Chaudry Abdul Majeed announced to regularize the services of all the contractual employees working in all the public-sector departments of AJK government. The AJK Prime Minister made these announcements while addressing the budget session 2012-13 in Legislative Assembly on June 28. PM Majeed also announced to establish another women university at Muzaffarabad next year, increase the members Legislative Assembly's fund from Rs. five million to 10 million.

He also announced to appoint two additional judges in AJK High Court, an additional civil judge in Patika, one civil judge in Mirpur, a circuit bench in Bagh and fund of Rs. five million for Chamber of Commerce. The prime minister stated that opposition and all members of the Legislative

Assembly would be taken on-board on Neelum Jehlum Hydel project before finalizing the agreement.

Shabbir Mir, Debate on budget allocations: G-B govt told to allocate at least 50% for new schemes

GILGIT: Legislators have urged the Gilgit-Baltistan (G-B) government to refrain from

spending more than half of the new fiscal budget on schemes left incomplete from previous years. A majority of lawmakers stated this during a debate at the Gilgit-Baltistan Legislative Assembly (GBLA) on the utilisation of Rs19.39 billion announced two days back for G-B for the fiscal year 2012-2013.

The lawmakers maintained that the G-B government often justifies non-initiation of new projects on the pretext that a significant portion of the budget is being spent on previously incomplete projects. They stated that the government should change its policy of spending over 80 per cent of the budget on previously incomplete development schemes and proposed that at least 50 per cent of the budget should be spent on new schemes to provide benefit to the people.

Shabbir Mir, Shortage of judges: G-B's Supreme Court 'virtually dysfunctional'

GILGIT: Cases are piling up and litigants are suffering due to shortage of judges in the top court of Gilgit-Baltistan. With the expiration of contracts of two judges last month, only one judge is left in the three-member Supreme Appellate Court (SAC). The positions fell vacant on May 26 when the contracts of Justice Syed Jafer Shah and Justice Mohammad Yaqoob expired after they completed their three-year term. Dubbed as Gilgit-Baltistan's apex court, SAC is run by three judges including a chief judge, all of whom are hired on three-year contracts. Justice Rana Arshad, who replaced Justice Mohammad Nawaz Abbasi as chief judge after the latter's contract expired last year, is now looking after the SAC.

GILGIT: A court in Gilgit has accepted the bail plea

of a detained youth activist Baba Jan, who was imprisoned last year under the Anti-Terrorism Act for protesting over the killing of a man and son in Hunza. "He will be released from jail in about two days," Advocate Ehsan Ali, the counsel for Baba Jan, noted on June 27.

Jan, who is the chief organiser of Progressive Youth Movement, was among the nearly 100 people arrested for allegedly ransacking a police station and torching government offices after a clash, which claimed the lives of two internally displaced persons, Sher Afzal Baig and his son Sherullah Baig, in Hunza last year.

Pak fails to get World Bank commitment for dam project

ISLAMABAD: In a setback to Pakistan, the World Bank has linked financing of its USD 11.7 billion Diemer-Bhasha dam project with Indian concurrence, a media report stated. Pakistan was unable to get a positive response from the Washington-based financial institution on the project amidst strained relations with the US, sources in the Finance Ministry noted. Finance Minister Abdul Hafeez Shaikh was unable to get a

"firm commitment" from the World Bank's Vice President for South Asia, Isabel Guerrero, on co-financing the project when they met on June 25. Sources stated Shaikh raised the issue but could not get a "welcoming response".

Shabbir Mir, 2012-13 fiscal year: Gilgit-Baltistan unveils Rs19b budget

GILGIT: A total annual budget of Rs19.39 billion for the year 2012-13 was presented in the Gilgit-Baltistan Assembly on June 25. As Finance Minister Mohammad Ali Akhtar read out the budget speech, an opposition legislator Nawaz Khan Naji stormed out of the house, terming the proceedings an exercise in futility.

On the other hand, Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) leader Janbaz Khan remained tight-lipped throughout the session. The 22nd session of the assembly was chaired by Gilgit-Baltistan Legislative Assembly Speaker Wazir Baig and also attended by Gilgit-Baltistan Chief Minister Mehdi Shah. The total amount earmarked for the development sector was Rs8.39 billion, whereas the non-development budget amounted to Rs11 billion.

Sacked: Three advisers to ex-PM sent packing

GILGIT: With the disqualification of Yousaf Raza Gilani from the office of Prime Minister (PM), the three advisers to PM appointed from Gilgit-Baltistan (G-B) have also been removed, stated officials. “The three are no more advisers to the new PM, it has officially been decided,” an official noted, adding that the news will be communicated to them shortly.

Two days back, a notification issued by the PM Secretariat did not contain names of the three advisers from G-B, suggesting they might be retained with the new PM. Earlier this year, Gilani appointed Attullah Shahab, Professor Muhammad Saleem, and Wazir Ibadat as advisers to the PM in G-B. The three were also the members of the Gilgit-Baltistan Council.

Patients, students and other affected people were transported free of cost. The 19-km-long Karakoram Highway, the sole overland connection between China and Pakistan, was submerged. Due to this catastrophe, the cross-border trade between the two countries has been badly affected. Local businesses have been ruined,

while the business community has become bankrupt and suppressed under huge loans.

AJK announces Rs 49.59 billion tax-free budget

MIRPUR: The Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK) government on June 21 announced a total of Rs 49.59 billion revenue-oriented tax-free budget for the next fiscal year, with revenue expenditures estimated at Rs 40.05 billion and deficit of Rs 5.1 billion. The budget was announced by AJK Finance Minister Chaudhry Pervaiz Ashraf in the AJK

Legislative Assembly, which met in Muzaffarabad. "An amount of Rs 9,547.036 million has been allocated for the development sector with Rs 40,050 million recurrent budget for the next fiscal year," he informed the House. The AJK assembly was told that the development budget was 15 percent more than that of the fiscal year 2011-12.

In his keynote address to lawmakers, the finance minister stated that the PPP government had presented a well-balanced and public-friendly budget for the first time in its five-year term, and almost all the sectors had been focused.

The park which is spread over 10,000 square kilometres in five districts of G-B is a natural habitat for over 10 species of wild animals and 12 rare species of birds. Some of the endangered species include marmot, snow leopard, markhor, ibex, blue sheep, brown bear, musk deer, Tibetan wild ass, and wolf. However, due to the absence of official records, the status of these species is not known.
