5.9M TONNES OF LITHIUM RESERVES FOUND IN REASI DISTT

LITHIUM: THE NEW PETROLEUM

On 9 February 2023, the central government announced its discovery of 5.9 million tonnes of lithium reserves in the Salal-Haimana area (Reasi district) of Jammu and Kashmir (J&K). This has been the first such discovery in India. It is a critical and rare component required for manufacturing rechargeable batteries which power electric vehicles, smartphones, and laptops. It has been suggested by expert observers that this discovery will prove to a critical component for India's success in its drive to achieve reduced carbon emissions and address challenges brought about by climate change. Furthermore, it will contribute to the national agenda of increasing the producing electric cars to 30 per cent by 2030.

The Indian government had indicated earlier that it intends to boost its supply of rare earth materials by sourcing them from within country and abroad. In 2021, lithium was uncovered in comparatively smaller amounts in Karnataka.

The presence of lithium in J&K instills optimism that India can soon move away from its reliance on Argentina and Australia for importing this component. Lithium has emerged as a sought-after component worldwide as states have demonstrated interest in pursuing alternative and green technology to counter climate change. – BBC News, Hindustan Times



The lithium reserves in J&K were discovered last month during exploration by the Geological Survey of India (GSI). Be it a smartphone, electric car or even a normal car or any other battery operated product, they are all run by lithium-ion batteries. As all countries around the world are reducing their dependence on petroleum, lithium is becoming a major energy resource.

Currently, India now imports most of its minerals – including lithium, nickel, and cobalt. With 50% of the deposits concentrated in Argentina, Bolivia, and Chili, the *lithium triangle* is where the majority of the world's lithium reserves are located. China, on the other hand, has an advantage over other nations and is in charge of 75% of the world's lithium refining. — *Livemint*

Bilquis Mir, the first Olympic-level women's kayaking and canoeing athlete from J&K is now the only Indian woman and the first from Jammu and Kashmir to be appointed as the judge at the Asian Games.

Mir's journey is inspiring because of her success stories. She represented J&K for over a decade professionally and trained despite facing harsh opposition and rebuke from her family and community. She is also the first individual to be appointed as a water sports coach from Srinagar.

In 2022, she added another feather to her cap after she was appointed as a judge at the 19th Asian Games held in China. However, it was the second time she assumed a judge's responsibility at an international water sports event.

She has expressed her appreciation and pride in female athletes taking up this sport – "It's sending a positive message because there were very few girls in sports when I started, and now I see that is changing.
