The External Affairs Minister, Dr. S. Jaishankar, inaugurated Jammu and Kashmir's (J&K) first international education fair on 21 February 2023. This event was jointly organised by the Indian Council for Cultural Relations and SKUAST-Kashmir.

Dr. Jaishankar hailed the event as a hallmark of how locals, especially the youth in J&K, can now avail of complete benefits of progress and development, earlier enjoyed by the rest of the country. He remarked, "In that sense, people of J&K in the national mainstream was extremely important. It was also by doing so they would connect with the rest of India and the international mainstream. For me it is not just an education event; it is a very integral part of ensuring that a very important region of India is connected to what is happening in the world."

Furthermore, the Lt. Governor of J&K, Mr. Manoj Sinha, emphasised that this initiative would serve as an example for other universities nationwide. He also explained that his administration aims to "invite international students to J&K for short-term and long-term courses in various disciplines & strengthen the international connect." – <u>The Print</u>

The J&K government announced on 22 February 2023 that it had sanctioned a five-year project, Innovative Extension Approaches for Revitalising Agriculture in Jammu and Kashmir, worth Rs. 463 crores.

This initiative aims to introduce sustainable agricultural practices in the union territory, empower the youth and farmers through 'inclusive and technology-driven agriextension services,' and establish approximately 2,000 Kissan Khidmat Ghars, akin to one-stop centres providing 'farmer-oriented services.'

Mr. Atal Dulloo, the Additional Chief Secretary of Agricultural Production, firmly believes this initiative will remedy the defects plaguing the current extension system in the union territory.

He added, "The project aims to address these issues by developing a dynamic agri-extension system using IoT-enabled real-time big data for farm-centric planning and resource allocation. This technology-enabled system will form the basis for a proactive agriculture extension system with a cluster approach. This approach will use real-time regional analysis of climate and agro-ecology information to promote niche agriculture under given agro-climatic conditions." – <u>Business Standard</u>

OILSEED INITIATIVES



Jammu and Kashmir's oil industry will be witnessing a major transformation with the implementation of new schemes by the Holistic Agriculture Development Programme by the Agriculture Production Department.

The department will implement an Rs. 31 crore project. The three-year initiative will create jobs and contribute towards promoting economic growth.

The government intends to bring 210 Th Ha under oilseed cultivation from 140 Th Ha over the next three years. — *Greater Kashmir*

Dr. Mubarak Hussain Syed, a Kashmiri neuroscientist, is among 125 scientists who have secured the highly sought-after Sloan Research Fellowship. He is the first person of Kashmiri origin to do so. This fellowship is granted to the 'most promising' early career scientists. As per the guidelines, each fellow will be allocated USD 75,000 to carry out research for a period of over two years.

Dr. Syed is attempting to find how specific cells in the brain make a division of labour and manage to create a brainblood barrier. To this end, he has already identified four genes from fruit fly as a model.

Dr. Syed serves as an Assistant Professor of Biology at the University of New Mexico and spearheads the institution's Neural Diversity Lab. In 2011, he also secured the National Science Foundation Career Award.

Speaking to Kashmir Life, the young scientist said: "Early in my independent scientific career, this recognition (Sloan Fellowship) will tremendously help our research programme and mentoring activities. I am grateful to my dedicated and hardworking team at the University of New Mexico, especially my first two graduate students, who also happen to be from Kashmir..." – <u>Kashmir Life</u>

KASHMIR SCIENTIST GETS FELLOWSHIP FOR BRAIN-BLOOD CELL RESEARCH

20 MORE DNB SEATS IN MEDICAL COLLEGES & DISTRICT HOSPITALS

The **National** Board **Examination in Medical Science** (NBEMS) has sanctioned 20 more Diplomate of National Board (DNB) seats in government medical colleges and hospitals in Jammu and Kashmir. An official spokesman has said these seats will be in addition to the earlier granted DNB seats. According to official data, GMC Srinagar has received approval for two seats in FNB paediatric anaesthesia and Jawahar Lal Nehru Memorial Hospital, Srinagar, and three post-MBBS DNB seats in general surgery. Mission Director, National Health Mission (J&K), Ayushi Sudan, has said that implementing the DNB courses at the district level in J&K has been termed as a best practice in the country. — The Print
