The Directorate of Tourism Jammu and Kashmir (J&K) has announced its intent to develop Basohli (Jammu) as a major leisure, heritage, and adventure tourism destination.

It is considered an 'off-beat tourist destination and major water sports' site.

The products sold range from wicker and tilla work to carpets, paper mache, shawls, copperware, and rugs. All of them are produced locally by veteran artists, critically acclaimed for their work nationally and worldwide.

Her brand, Myôn (translated to 'My' in Kashmiri), intends to take her customers through an enthralling journey in which they will experience the luxurious and rich heritage to which she belongs. It will allow them to select their products carefully. She launched her business in mid-2020 after "seeing the plight of our artisans and how many of them were leaving it that has been generationally running in their families due to lack of market opportunities."

Ms. Shah seeks to cultivate networks between her customers and artisans employed while ensuring that the latter are compensated equitably for quality products produced.

However, her online venture faces some challenges. For example, "it is difficult to make the customers understand how the products are different from the counterfeits readily available in the market." – <u>*Rising Kashmir*</u>

J&K's Samba district is renowned for its traditional Calicostyled paintings, dating back more than a century to Maharaja Ranjit Singh's reign.

Therefore, the local government, Self-Help Groups (SHG) of the Rural Employment Livelihood Mission, and the Department of Education's Umeed programme have collaborated to revive and develop it further.

Currently, 5 SHGs whose members have introduced calico prints on the jute bags produced in the district are involved with this initiative. They have played a key role in preserving this artistic culture.

Mr. Abhishek Sharma, Samba's District Development Commissioner, has a keen interest in art and wants to encourage the development of traditional and ancient art.

For this purpose, he has launched 'Create Block Print Patterns' on the J&K government's website. This is a competition where all interested, mainly students and artists, can enter and gain knowledge regarding local flora and fauna and the district's unique cultural heritage.

The Directorate of Handicrafts and Handlooms will use designs submitted to the website portal for manufacturing wooden blocks used in block printing. – <u>*Hindustan Times*</u>
