Smart submarines delivered to IRGC Navy

Tehran Times, March 16, 2022

A series of new advanced homegrown defense hardware with special capabilities, including smart sub-surface vessels along with missiles and speedboats, were delivered to the IRGC Navy on Tuesday. The new armaments were handed over during a ceremony attended by top military officials, including the IRGC chief Hossein Salami, in the southern port city of Bandar Abbas. For the first time, the IRGC naval fleet was unequipped with domestically developed smart submarines, which will significantly boost its capabilities in detecting and thwarting sub-surface threats.

The new speedboats, which feature high maneuverability, are capable of traveling at up to 95 knots. They can also carry and fire various missiles and rockets. The IRGC Navy was also furnished with new maneuverable missiles, whose range has been increased and can be used in electronic warfare, Press TV reported.

Iran among world leaders in nanotechnology

Iran gained more than \$2.7 million from nanotechnology sales in 2021, the official Islamic Republic News Agency reported Wednesday. Nanotechnology refers to industrial production from atomic and molecule-sized matter. The field has several industrial and environmental benefits, but also has downsides, such as the possibility of creating toxic waste. Among Iran's nanotechnology products, 42% are

related to construction, 17% are related to petroleum and 13% are related to automobile manufacturing, according to the agency.

Iran says nuclear deal within closest reach yet

"We have inched to an agreement closer than ever," Iran's Foreign Minister Hossein Amir-Abdollahian told counterpart Liz Truss in phone a conversation on the status of the talks over the revival of the Iran nuclear deal. Amir-Abdollahian maintained that Iran is ready to sign a final deal if its "red lines" are minded. "What determines a good and lasting deal is America's realistic behavior by presenting new and unfitting demands." Seeking reentry into the nuclear deal after its 2018 withdrawal, the United States has with engaged Tehran through intermediaries in eight rounds negotiations over a period of nearly a year.

IRGC Warns to Target More Israeli Bases in Iraqi Kurdistan

He reiterated that "the Zionists had admitted themselves that their drones" which flew over a military base in Iran's Kermanshah Province had taken off from their bases in Erbil (capital city of the Iraqi Kurdistan Region). "It is our natural right to destroy any base from which any attack is carried out against the security of Iran and this is a redline for us," General Sharif said.

Iranian Navy Sends 81st Fleet of Warships to Int'l Waters

The 81st flotilla of the Iranian Navy set off for the high seas to safeguard maritime routes for the country's vessels. The flotilla left the Iranian Southern port city of Bandar Abbas for high seas on a routine mission to maintain the Islamic Republic's sway in international waters, not least the Gulf of Aden. The 81st naval fleet, comprised of the Alborz destroyer and a logistic ship, left Bandar Abbas on Friday, following a seeoff ceremony attended by the Navy's Rear Admiral Shahram Irani. The mission aims to equally protect the Islamic Republic's interests and provide security for merchant vessels and tankers in the region. The Iranian naval forces succeeded in escorting 10,000 commercial ships to ensure their safe passage during the eight years of the Sacred Defense (1980-88). And over the past 12 years, the forces have thwarted numerous pirate attacks.

Iraqi foreign minister says Iran nuclear deal in Iraq's interest

Iraqi Foreign Minister Fuad Hussein, in an exclusive interview with Al-Monitor's Andrew Parasiliti on the sidelines of the Doha Forum, says an Iranian nuclear deal is in Iraq's interest. "It is true that the Iranian

minister [Foreign Minister Hossein Amir Abdollahian] called me and he mentioned that they had reached the last stage of the negotiations" in Vienna on the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action, said Hussein. Asked about what role Iraq can play in diplomacy between the US and Iran, Hussein said that "we are on good terms, and in contact with both sides. In fact, from the beginning of the negotiations until now ... they have been talking about the process of the negotiation with us, and sometimes we are trying to get messages between the Americans and the Iranians."

Lifting bans on IRGC is an 'important' and 'serious' issue: Amir Abdollahian

Iranian Foreign Minister Hossein Amir Abdollahian said on Saturday removing sanctions on the Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) is an "important" and "serious" issue negotiations to revive the 2015 nuclear deal, officially known as the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA). The remarks by Amir Abdollahian came one day before Enrique Mora, the European Union coordinator for the Vienna nuclear talks, held talks with Iran's chief nuclear negotiator Ali Bagheri Kani and possibly some other Iranian officials in Tehran. Lifting sanctions on the IRGC is one of the "important issues of negotiations," the foreign minister told the national TV. He added, "Removing the name of real and legal persons from the 'red list' and from a complex of sanctions and unilateral sanctions that the U.S. has imposed on Iran is one of the serious issues of our recent negotiations in Vienna." By red list the minister means "list of terrorist organizations".

Iran Attends IONS 2022 Combined Maritime Drills in India

The coastal phase includes workshops and visits to the fleets of the two sides, while the naval phase is concerned with specialized naval operations including formulation exercises, guard officer maneuvers, medical aid exchange operations, and rescue operations, according to Fattahi.

Iran's foreign minister in China to pursue partnership deal

Iran's top diplomat, Foreign Minister Hossein Amir-Abdollahian, headed to the eastern Chinese city of Tunxi on March 29 to join a summit of the foreign ministers of Afghanistan's neighbors. the Iranian foreign minister's agenda, according to the hard-line Tasnim News Agency, is expected to largely focus on the trajectory

of the 25-year China-Iran Comprehensive Strategic Partnership. Amir-Abdollahian has told Iran's state television that he will meet with his Chinese counterpart, Wang Yi, for a review of where the two sides stand in the deal, which he said is already in fast-paced motion with the "outcomes to be seen in the not-distant future." Iran slams new US sanctions amid nuclear deal uncertainty

The spokesperson for Iran's Foreign Ministry, Saeed Khatibzadeh, dismissed new sanctions announced by the US Treasury against an Iranian national and his four companies connected to Tehran's missile program. "It is yet another indication of the US government's ill intentions toward the Iranian nation," Khatibzadeh said in a statement on March 31. The US Treasury stated on Wednesday that it had levied the punitive measures as it was convinced the firms and its owner had supported Iran in its development of ballistic missiles. Those missiles, US officials said, allegedly are being used by the Islamic Republic in its ambitious regional activities and in pursuit of deeper influence, a policy that Tehran defiantly defended as "strategic."

An intention sign military cooperation agreement between Iraq and Romania

He pointed out that "Romania has many memoranda of armament with Iraq in the past years, and we hope that cooperation will be better, especially as we see that cooperation needs to be developed in a broader fields." He stressed that "There are preliminary agreements with the Iraq concerning the military side and the protection of confidential information, as well as a memorandum of understanding on Military education and training."

Israel moves forward on laser-based rocket defense, will begin initial procurement

Defense Minister Benny Gantz said Thursday his office would be signing a contract in the coming days to begin procurement of a laser air defense system to protect Israel against rockets and UAVs. "We are at the start of the journey. It will take time, it isn't a short process, but we will get it done in the shortest amount of time possible," Gantz told reporters. The ministry has been testing the laser-based defense system for several years, shooting down a drone with it last year. Its research and development department initially planned to deploy the anti-missile system by 2024, but the military has pushed for an earlier deployment.

Bennett says US determined to sign nuclear deal at 'any cost'

Prime Minister Naftali Bennett on Sunday sounded the alarm over the potential US decision to remove Iran's Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) from its list of terrorist groups as part of a revived nuclear deal with Tehran. Reports in recent days have indicated that Iran is demanding the IRGC be delisted as a condition of its return to the 2015 accord. "We are very concerned about the United States' intention to give in to Iran's outrageous demand and remove the IRGC from the list of terrorist organizations," Bennett said at a cabinet meeting. "Unfortunately, there is still determination to sign the nuclear deal with Iran at almost any cost – including saying that the world's largest terrorist organization is not a terrorist organization," he added. "This is too high a price."

Bennett says he won't pick public fight with US over Iran nuclear deal

I will only go to war if there is a real chance of success and a worthy purpose."

Morocco and Israel to cooperate in civilian aerospace projects

Israel and Morocco signed an agreement on Wednesday to cooperate in civilian aerospace projects as the two countries push for closer economic ties after resuming their diplomatic relationship last year. Moroccan Industry Minister Ryad Mezzour said the agreement would cover potential projects in innovation and airplane maintenance and transformation after a signing ceremony in Rabat with Israeli Aerospace Industries (IAI) chief Amir Peretz. There were no details on specific projects that the agreement might lead to, or on the size of investments that it might cover. In November, Israel and Morocco agreed a defense pact covering intelligence and cooperation in military industries and procurement. Israeli media reported that Morocco wants to buy Israelimade drones and other arms.

Giant missile-detecting balloon begins operational use over northern Israel

The military on Tuesday officially received a massive new balloon equipped with an advanced missile and aircraft detection system from the Defense Ministry. The radar-based system, deployed in the north at an unspecified date, is part of a general effort by the Israeli Air Force to improve the country's air defenses, particularly in the north, due to the proliferation of Iranian drones and cruise missiles in the region. The detection system, dubbed "Elevated Sensor," or "Sky Dew" in Israel, is deployed at high altitudes in order to detect incoming long-range missiles, cruise missiles, and drones, officials said.

Lebanon's Hezbollah chief denies sending fighters to support Russia in Ukraine

"I categorically deny anything of this sort. These are baseless lies. No one from Hiezbollah, neither a fighter nor an expert, has gone to this war zone," Nasrallah stressed.

Qatar signs deal with Leonardo for first ever Navy Operations Center

Abdullah Hassan Al-Sulaiti told Breaking "The Defense resulting maritime command and control center will be linked with the ships in the theater of operations. It is like the Navy's eye in the sea."

The US condemned Yemen's Iran-backed Houthi militia attacks on Saudi Arabia and affirmed its support for the Kingdom's defense, National Security Advisor Jake Sullivan said on Sunday. "We condemn the Houthi attacks over the last 48 hours against civilian infrastructure in Saudi Arabia. These attacks reportedly targeted water treatment facilities as well as oil and natural gas infrastructure. The Houthis launch these terrorist attacks with enabling by Iran, which supplies them with missile and UAV components, training, and expertise. This is done in violation of UN Security Council resolutions prohibiting the import of weapons into Yemen," Sullivan said in a statement.

Riyadh gets US military help as Washington seeks better ties

Russia not sending Syrians to Ukraine just yet, top US general says

after the top commander of US military forces in the Middle East said last week he had seen no sign yet of widespread Russian recruitment of Syrians to fight in Europe.

Turkey says idea to send its S-400s to Ukraine 'quite unrealistic'

Greece buys 6 more Rafale jets, frigates amid tensions with Turkey
