IRGC Commander Stresses Hybrid Defense Against Enemy's Warfare

Commander of the Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) Aerospace Force Brigadier General Amir Ali Hajizadeh underlined that Iran has prepared a hybrid defense strategy in the face of enemy's hybrid war.

General Hajizadeh made the remarks after meeting with the Commander-In-Chief of Iranian Armed Forces and Supreme Leader of the Islamic Revolution Ayatollah Seyed Ali Khamenei with a group of the IRGC staff on Thursday.

The IRGC Aerospace Force commander further said that the armed forces commander had told them in a previous meeting that he was happy with the IRGC's progress, but he expected more.

Senior Commander: Iran Fully Monitoring Stealth US Fighters

"In the past few days, several American F-35 stealth fighter jets were flying over the Persian Gulf and were completely monitored by Iranian radars from the moment they took off," Deputy Commander of Operations of the Iranian Army Air Defense Force Brigadier General Reza Khajeh told FNA on Friday.

"All the radars located in the South of the country were monitoring the planes every moment," he added.

Iran Showcases Indigenous Drone with 24Hrs Flight Endurance

Iran unveiled an advanced domestically-developed drone, dubbed "Mohajer 10", which has an operational radius of 2,000 kilometers and can continuously fly for up to 24 hours.

The unmanned aerial vehicle was put on display in the presence of President Seyed Ebrahim Rayeesi on Tuesday during a ceremony that marked the Defense Industry Day.

"Mohajer 10" has a maximum flight duration of 24 hours at an altitude of 7,000 meters and an operational radius of 2,000 kilometers. It also has a maximum fuel capacity of 450 liters and a maximum cargo weight of 300 kilograms.

The UVA, equipped with electronic warfare and intelligence systems, can fly at a maximum speed of 210 kilometers per hour and carry different kinds of ammunition and bombs.

DM: Iran to Send 2-3 Domestically-Developed Satellites into Orbit in Coming Months

Iranian Defense Minister Brigadier General Mohammad Reza Ashtiani praised the country's astonishing progress in the space technology, and said that Tehran plans to launch two or three satellites by the end of the Iranian calendar year (ending in mid-March 2024).

Ashtiani stated on Tuesday that relevant organizations have been working to manufacture satellites and satellite carriers.

"We are involved in the development and launch of satellites. Under our plan, we will have 2 to 3 satellite launches this year, something we hope to be successful," he added.

Iran has taken giant strides in the field of science of technology in recent years, despite US sanctions, and is among the world's top 10 states capable of building and launching satellites.

Iran's Army Stages Large-Scale Electronic Warfare Drills

Iran's nuclear organization unveils production of radionuclide

The Atomic Energy Organization of Iran (AEOI) on Sunday unveiled a domestic radionuclide with potential in a variety of disciplines.

Iranian nuclear specialists have successfully produced Cesium-137 radionuclide, which was previously imported.

The material, which has a variety of industrial and medicinal uses, was unveiled by Mohammad Eslami, the chief of the AEOI, during an expo in Tehran.

Radionuclides (or radioisotopes) are radioactive atomic variations of elements. They are mostly produced by exposing suitable target materials to the neutron flux in a nuclear reactor for an appropriate time.

Cesium-137 radionuclide has a half-life of 30 years and is found mostly in spent nuclear fuel and radioactive waste.

Iran has received "many demands from different countries" to provide them with radiopharmaceuticals, he added. "Our exports have begun as well," the nuclear chief stated without elaborating on the target countries receiving the Iranian-made medicines.

"[Uranium] enrichment is done based on the Strategic Action Plan and within the framework of the general policies of the Establishment," he stated.

Iran is ready to export its unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs) provided that "political and security considerations" do not apply to any customer and the country makes sure that its drones will not be intended for inappropriate use, Talaei-Nik emphasized.

France seeking to return to Iran nuclear deal: Macron

France would like to return to the 2015 nuclear deal with Iran and have clear information on Iran's nuclear activities, President Emmanuel Macron said in a speech to French diplomats on Monday, Nour News reported.

The Iran nuclear deal, officially known as the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA) was an agreement signed between Iran and the 5+1 group of countries (U.S., UK, France, Russia, China and Germany) in July 2015.

The deal limited Iran's nuclear activities under the condition that all nuclear-related economic and financial sanctions imposed by the West against the Islamic Republic be lifted. U.S. President Donald Trump unilaterally withdrew from the deal in 2018 and re-imposed sanctions against Iran.

Iranian Military Official: Indigenous Air Defense Shield Capable of Hitting 12 Targets Simultaneously

A senior military official said that the domestically-developed air defense system, 'Tactical Sayyad', can intercept two dozen aerial targets at a distance of nearly 200 kilometers and simultaneously deal with a dozen target.

Deputy Defense Minister for Research and Industrial Affairs Afshin Naderi Sharif described the homegrown military gear as a deployable medium-range ground-based system, with special privileges over similar ones.

The air defense system is furnished with short-range self-protection capabilities in comparison with Khordad-3 and Khordad-15 systems, he stated.

Iran has no nuclear weapons: IAEA chief

The International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) Director General Rafael Grossi said on Monday that "Iran does not possess nuclear weapons."

"Iran does not have nuclear weapons. A distinction must be made between having nuclear weapons and being able to create them," Grossi said at a meeting of the Swedish Institute of International Affairs.

Grossi went on to say that in 2015 Iran and world powers reached an agreement, officially known as the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA), but the United States withdrew from it in 2018.

Grossi also noted that "the American move triggered Iran to abandon obligations over time. Although this agreement has not been declared dead, it has become an empty shell."

Iran nuclear program survived 20 years of sabotage: nuclear chief

The head of the Atomic Energy Organization of Iran (AEOI) has stated that Tehran has advanced its nuclear technology despite two decades of industrial sabotage.

"The country's nuclear science, which serves as a propeller for all industries, has come by while much industrial sabotage was committed to impede its advancement over the last 20 years," Mohammad Eslami said on Tuesday.

"Assassination of Iran's nuclear scientists, sanctions, psychological operations, and recourse to international organizations towards exertion of more pressure, none could impede the advancement of the country's nuclear science," he added.

Israel has targeted Iran's nuclear plants several times with terrorist acts and assassinated up to seven Iranian nuclear experts.

In tandem with its efforts to throw doubt on Iran's nuclear energy program, the regime's officials have waged a raucous propaganda campaign aimed at undermining the Islamic Republic's nuclear activities.

Iraq strikes Islamic State hideouts

Iraqi forces announced a strike against the Islamic State Wednesday in another sign of the group's growing weakness.

The Iraqi National Intelligence Service said early Wednesday morning local time that Iraqi air force pilots flying F-16s struck caves being used by IS members in the Qaraj mountains, near Tuz Khurmatu in eastern Iraq. The strikes destroyed IS hideouts in the caves and killed an unspecified number of the group's members, according to a Facebook post from Iraq's Security Media Cell.

US Approves Historic Procurement of Israel's Arrow 3 Defense System to Germany

The United States government has granted official approval to the procurement of Israel's Arrow 3 defense system to Germany.

The Israeli Ministry of Defense, German Federal Ministry of Defense, and Israel Aerospace Industries will sign the landmark \$3.5 billion defense agreement, marking Israel's largest-ever defense deal.

Defense Minister Yoav Gallant, the Director General of the Israel Ministry of Defense, Maj. Gen. (Res.) Eyal Zamir, and Director of the IMOD Directorate of Defense R&D (DDR&D), Brig. Gen. (Res.) Dr. Daniel Gold, were notified of this decision earlier today (Thursday), by the US Department of State.

Iran Presents New Drone, Claims It Can Fly for 24 Hours

Iran unveiled its new combat UAV, the Mohajer-10, which it claims is capable of flying for 24 hours non-stop.

Iranian President Ebrahim Raisi unveiled the Mohajer-10 yesterday (Tuesday), during a ceremony marking "Defense Industry Day," threatening that Tehran will "cut off any hand involved in aggression" against the Islamic Republic.

A video accompanying the drone's display had a text saying "Prepare your shelters" in Hebrew and Persian.

IRNA, Iran's official news agency, says that the new drone has an operational range of 2,000 km, a maximum fuel capacity of 450 liters, a maximum payload weight of 300 km, and a maximum speed of 210 km per hour.

India Introduces New Frigate with Interceptors and Radars Made by IAI

The President of India, Draupadi Murmu, launched the sixth frigate in Project 17A(Nilgiri Class) at the Garden Reach Shipbuilders & Engineers Limited shipyard in Kolkata. The frigate has been named INS Vindhyagiri. According to Reuters, the program's scope is around 8 billion dollars.

The ship launching sequence is not linear, as construction is carried out simultaneously at two shipyards. The launches began in 2020, while the launch of two more frigates in the series is planned for 2024. A total of seven frigates are planned in this series.

The frigate includes a Vertical Launch System (VLS) with 32 cells for Barak-8 missiles and an MF-STAR radar system manufactured by Israel Aerospace Industries (IAI).

Major Deal for Rafael: US Navy Planning to Procure Three Iron Dome Batteries

Israel Defense, August 27, 2023

A major deal for Israel's Rafael Advanced Defense Systems: The U.S. Navy plans to acquire three Iron Dome batteries, including 44 launchers and 1,840 Tamir interceptors.

WAR ZONE reports that the exact value of the transaction is not known, but it is estimated to be around \$200 million. The Marines need Iron Dome for defense against rocket attacks, and these systems also have capabilities to defend against missiles and artillery.

The details of the purchase are published on the U.S. government website. The acquisition will be carried out by the Marines through Raytheon, which markets the system in the U.S. under the brand SKY HUNTER.

Sikorsky to Build 8 New CH-53K Helicopters for Israel

The U.S. Navy awarded Sikorsky, a Lockheed Martin company, a \$2.7 billion contract to build and deliver 35 additional CH-53K helicopters – the largest procurement to date for this multi-mission aircraft.

The agreement includes 12 U.S. Marine Corps Lot 7 aircraft, 15 U.S. Marine Corps Lot 8 aircraft, and eight aircraft for Israel. Sikorsky will begin delivering these aircraft in 2026.

These eight additional CH-53K helicopters for the Israeli Air Force follow the initial production announcement in 2022 for the first four aircraft under a U.S. Navy Foreign Military Sales (FMS) agreement.

4 Arab Israelis arrested for Hezbollah ties, smuggling Iranian explosives

Four Arab Israelis were arrested last month on suspicion of smuggling into the country munitions they received from Hezbollah, Israel's Shin Bet security agency announced Thursday.

The four, residents of Kfar Qasim village and the town of Lod, were indicted on Thursday on charges of arms trafficking.

According to the Shin Bet announcement, which included pictures of those arrested, Kafr Qasim residents Jalal Khursa, Ahmed Issa and Muhammed Issa and Lod resident Nuh Assam were caught in possession of Iranian-made explosives. The Shin Bet suspects the four were part of a ring that received smuggling distributed illegal arms and possibly drugs from Hezbollah. The security agency is now looking into other Israelis suspected of involvement in the smuggling ring.

Adopting Resolution 2695 (2023), Security Council Extends Mandate of United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon for One Year

United Nations, August 31, 2023

The Security Council today extended the mandate of the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL) until 31 August 2024, as speakers debated the matter of the Force being allowed access to some areas around the Blue Line.

Adopting resolution 2695 (2023) (to be issued as document S/RES/2695)—by a recorded vote of 13 in favour to none against, with 2 abstentions (China, Russian Federation)—the Security Council decided to extend the present mandate of UNIFIL for a period of twelve months, until 31 August 2024. By the text, the Council reiterated its call for the Government of Lebanon to present a plan to increase its naval capabilities as soon as possible, including with appropriate support from the international community, with the goal of ultimately decreasing UNIFIL's Maritime Taskforce and transitioning responsibilities to the Lebanese Armed Forces.

Security forces raid Palestinian gun workshop, seize lathes, dozens of firearm parts

Balancing act: Asked about China's Middle East arms sales, Qatari PM lauds US 'defense alliance'

Thani told the audience at an event put on by the International Institute for Strategic Studies. "We welcome any cooperation with all the countries. But as I mentioned also, none of our relation with any specific country will be at the account [expense] of the other."

The US is quietly warning its Middle East partners about the cost of stocking up on Chinese-made weapons

US officials are warning about Chinese arms sales in the Middle East, saying they could undermine the US military's ability to integrate with its partners in the region.

China isn't offering weapons that would directly replace US arms, but the growing interest in what Beijing is selling reflects a longer-term desire by Middle Eastern countries to diversify their suppliers and their increasing concern about the US's commitment to the region, experts say.

Chinese arms sales in the Middle East have increased by 80% over the past decade, a result of Beijing's expanding relationships there and its willingness to deliver arms faster and with fewer stipulations than Washington.

There is increasing talk of a United Statesbrokered "grand bargain" on Middle East security, the core of which would be normalization of ties between Israel and Saudi Arabia. The obvious goal would involve the eternal search for peace in the Middle East, but there are hints that such a bargain may have more to do with keeping the Saudis out of China's orbit. One thing we know, Biden's lieutenants are lobbying hard in the Senate for acceptance of some version of farreaching demands from the Saudi crown prince, Mohammed bin Salman, among them access to uranium enrichment technology that would ostensibly provide fuel for future Saudi nuclear power plants. Indeed, enrichment is a step in the production of nuclear reactor fuel. It is also a vital part of one of two paths to the atomic bomb.
