Iran Army drones, missiles arrayed around borders to fend off threats: commander

Tehran Times, December 18, 2023

Iran's Army Ground Force deploys missile, drone, and artillery units along the northeastern border for a swift response to potential threats, focusing on areas requiring additional forces. Air Force Deputy Commander Brigadier General Mahdi Hadian highlights strong defense capabilities, readiness, and the highest combat readiness, crediting sacrifices, Islamic Revolution principles, and Ayatollah Khamenei's leadership. Adversaries' investments in hybrid warfare are futile due to Khamenei's guidance and public support. Hadian reaffirms the Air Force's ability to respond to threats. Khamenei emphasizes the need to maintain improve and defensive capabilities, praising Armed Forces' accomplishments highlighting adversary's and the vulnerability in April. Iranian Interior Minister Ahmad Vahidi urges Pakistan to secure borders and prevent terrorist havens, infiltration disclosing from Pakistan. Recent advancements in domestically produced equipment enhance Iran's armed forces' self-sufficiency.

Iran says malware used in cyberattack on fuel stations detected

During the opening of an exhibition on domestic civil defense industries. Iran's Civil Defense Organization head reported the successful identification of malware in a recent cyberattack on the fuel distribution system. Brigadier General Gholam Reza Jalali stated that the disruption at gas stations on December 18 involved sophisticated malware, currently under analysis. He highlighted the role of artificial intelligence in cyberattacks, constituting over 55% of global incidents, with 30% targeting Iran being AI-powered. General Jalali emphasized the urgent need to modernize Iran's fuel distribution system for secure connections. The cyberattacks in October and December, linked to Israel, were swiftly mitigated by Iranian experts.

Iranian Navy receives new cruise missiles with cutting-edge equipment

The Iranian Navy strengthens its maritime capabilities with the induction of advanced weaponry and cutting-edge equipment, showcased at a coastal naval base in southern Iran. The new additions include the 'Talayieh' strategic cruise missile system with a range exceeding 1,000 kilometers and the 'Nasir' cruise missile with a range over 100 kilometers. Two helicopters, equipped for electronic warfare capabilities, enhance resilience against electronic attacks. The helicopters feature advanced optical devices, intelligence gathering systems, and Identification Friend or Foe (IFF) systems. The 'Sanjar' smart loitering and suicide drone, a diver detection system, a multipurpose drone system for electronic warfare, and the 'Sirvan' tugboat for port operations further complement the Navy's expanding arsenal. The modernization efforts underscore Iran's commitment to maintaining a secure maritime presence.

Iran threatens to Deploy Fishing Militia Based on Chinese Doctrine

Iran has unveiled a Maritime Basij, a fishing militia comprising 33,000 fully recruited boats and 55,000 volunteer vessels, aligning with the Chinese Navy's doctrine. The militia aims to gather intelligence, extend maritime presence, and enhance firepower, particularly countering the U.S. Navy. Armed with machine guns, light weapons, and 107mm rockets, it is expected to operate from the Hormuz Strait to the Horn of Africa, potentially disrupting maritime routes. Distinguishing between civilian fishing boats and potential threats poses challenges for navies, including the U.S. Navy. Israel's naval intelligence is advised to establish a comprehensive database to monitor Iranian maritime militias for strategic preparedness.

Iran Dismisses IAEA's Report on Accelerating Uranium Enrichment

Fars News Agency, December 28, 2023

AEOI Head Mohammad Eslami rejects IAEA's report on Iran's alleged increased uranium enrichment, labelling it as routine and unchanged. Eslami dismisses the claim of enriching uranium up to 60% as media propaganda, suggesting it aims to divert attention from global concerns about Israeli actions in Gaza. Despite the 2015 accord, the US exit in 2018 and sanctions cast uncertainty on the agreement. Iran calls on IAEA to prioritize technical aspects, avoid politicization influenced by Israel, and expresses readiness to resolve differences through collaboration. Iranian officials disproportionate highlight inspections, covering only 2% of global sites, and deny pursuing military nuclear capability, citing a fatwa by Supreme Leader Khamenei. Iran

rejects Western accusations, considering them a propaganda campaign against its peaceful nuclear program.

Ankara uses that term to refer to killed or captured fighters of the banned Kurdistan Workers Party (PKK).

Philippine Air Force to Purchase Two Maritime Patrol Aircraft with Elbit Systems

Israel Defense, December 19, 2023

The Philippine Air Force is set to acquire two ATR-72 600 long-range maritime patrol aircraft equipped with systems by Israel's Elbit Systems for \$114 million. The aircraft aim to strengthen the 300th Air Intelligence and Security Wing. The purchase, part of an intergovernmental agreement, will be fulfilled over five years. Elbit's competitor in the project was Airbus with a P-295MPA/AS aircraft. The ATR 72-600 will feature a Mission Management System, advanced radar, electro-optics, Signals Intelligence (SIGINT) capabilities, and comprehensive communication systems. Despite concerns about the ongoing conflict involving Israel, the contract is proceeding as planned.

It also features Nir-Or's computer units and Video Management System, providing real-time AI analytics for optimal performance, survivability, and enhanced situational awareness of the AFV. IMCO Group remains committed to contributing to the nation's defense capabilities.

New Czech Tanks Might Include Israeli "Trophy" Active Protection System by Rafael

The Czech government is reportedly planning to purchase 77 Leopard 2A8 main battle tanks from Germany for the Czech army. The breakdown includes 44 combat and command tanks, along with 15 support tanks. Rafael's "Trophy" Active Protection System (APS) is often installed in Leopard 2A8 tanks and is manufactured for them in German factories through a joint European venture involving Rafael, German KMW, and General Dynamics Land Systems Europe. The acquisition is intended to replace the Soviet T-72 MC4Z tanks in service with the Czech army.

Elbit Combat Systems Presented at a Philippine Army Parade

Elbit Combat Systems showcased its cutting-edge military technology at a recent parade in Quezon City, Philippines, commemorating the 88th anniversary of the Armed Forces of the Philippines. The display featured the Sabrah Light Tank, ASCOD 2 Command Vehicle, M125A2 IFVs with a 120mm armoured mortar, and the ATMOS 155mm howitzer system. Notably, the Sabrah light tank, equipped with a 105mm cannon and autoloader turret, was highlighted. Elbit's communications systems and UT25 unarmed turret with a 25mm autocannon on the ASCOD 2 were also spotlighted. This display follows a \$172 million contract awarded in 2022 for Elbit to supply light tanks to the Philippine Army.

Israeli Artillery corps Fires Over 100,000 Shells During the War

Israeli Artillery Corps has played a pivotal role in the ongoing war, firing over 100,000 shells, with 90,000 directed at the Gaza Strip. The IDF Spokesperson's Unit highlights the engagement of UAV operators, specifically Unit 5252 "Zik" using Hermes 450 UAVs, and Unit 5353, "Sky Rider," contributing to observations and attack coordination. Rocket battalions utilized MLRS launchers for precision strikes with over 200 rockets. Recent reports on Bloomberg reveal U.S. support, with Israel receiving 57,000 155mm highpower artillery shells originally stored in Israel for the U.S. Army European Command, now redirected to meet the conflict demands. An additional supply includes 400 120mm mortars.

Elbit Systems of America Secures \$500M Contract for Night Vision Goggles for U.S. Marines

Jordan says it foiled plot against its security by gunmen from Syria

On Monday, the Jordanian military reported that a significant number of infiltrators from Syria had crossed the border, carrying rocket launchers, antipersonnel mines, and explosives. The army described the incident as a thwarted plot against the kingdom's security. According to the state broadcaster al Mamlaka, the military destroyed a vehicle laden with explosives, marking the largest armed cross-border operation aimed at smuggling weapons and drugs in recent years.

Kuwait appoints interior minister to caretaker defence post

Kuwait appoints Interior Minister Sheikh Talal Khalid al-Ahmad as caretaker defense minister amid reported resignation of Defense Minister Sheikh Abdullah Ali Abdullah Al-Sabah. currently on leave. undisclosed The development coincides with parliament's probe into an Airbus military aircraft order due to corruption allegations. The National Assembly examines contracts for 30 Caracal military helicopters and 28 Eurofighter jets in 2016, citing serious technical issues with the Airbus deal and irregularities with Eurofighter, according to the Kuwaiti Audit Bureau This parliamentary inquiry aligns with global investigations into Airbus following a \$4 billion settlement in 2020.

First on CNN: US rebukes Israel for more than 30 attacks on Lebanese military amid concerns of Gaza conflict widening

The U.S. has rebuked Israel for more than 30 attacks on the Lebanese military, expressing alarm over the widening conflict concerns in Gaza. Israel targeted U.S.backed Lebanese Armed Forces positions over the past two months, prompting strong objections from the Biden administration. The attacks, including small arms, artillery fire, drones, and helicopters, have raised frustration in the U.S., believing the Lebanese Armed Forces' involvement is crucial for a diplomatic solution. The Biden administration is also concerned about the potential expansion of the conflict between Israel and Hamas to the north. Israel cites self-defense against Hezbollah aggression, but the U.S. urges restraint to avoid civilian harm. Nine Israeli Soldiers Wounded in Hezbollah Strike: Army

Lebanese Analysts concerned for Future Involving Hezbollah, Hamas

In recent developments, Israeli media reports reveal that around 80% of Hezbollah's recent rocket launches have landed inside Lebanon rather than reaching Israel. IDF Spokesman Rear Adm. Daniel Hagari highlights ongoing efforts to disrupt Hezbollah's presence in southern Lebanon, predicting a transformative change in the region. Hagari accuses Hezbollah leader Hassan Nasrallah of jeopardizing Lebanon's future for the benefit of Hamas and Iran. In related talks, Israeli Defense Minister Yoav Gallant and U.S. Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin discuss regional security threats, focusing on Hezbollah's destabilizing activities in southern Lebanon. The conversation also addresses Israel's military campaign in Gaza. preparations for stabilization, and concerns

about attacks by Iran-aligned groups in Iraq and Syria, as well as Houthi assaults affecting international commerce in the Red Sea.

Eight Civilians Killed by Syria Army in Rebel Bastion: Monitor

In the latest escalation of violence, eight civilians, including a pregnant woman, were killed in artillery and rocket attacks by the Syrian army in the rebel-held northwest. The Syrian Observatory for Human Rights reported the direct targeting of residential areas in Darat Izza, Aleppo province, condemning it as a massacre. Hayat Tahrir al-Sham (HTS), formerly Al-Qaeda's local retaliated branch. bv killing five government soldiers in Latakia province. The HTS attack was in response to earlier Syrian army bombardments in Idlib city that left 14 civilians wounded. Idlib, under a Russia-Turkey ceasefire, continues to witness violations, with HTS being a major rebel force in the region.

Despite territorial losses, IS cells persist in carrying out hit-and-run attacks in the vast Badia desert, stretching from the outskirts of Damascus to the Iraqi border. The conflict in Syria, originating in antigovernment protests in 2011, has resulted in over half a million casualties and mass displacement.

Israeli air strike in Syria kills top Iranian military adviser

An Israeli air strike outside the Syrian capital of Damascus has killed a senior adviser in Iran's Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC), according to reports from Iranian state media. Sayyed Razi Mousavi, one of the top IRGC commanders in Syria, was killed on Monday. Iran vows 'harsh revenge' for general's killing three years ago. Iran's IRGC successfully puts third imaging satellite into orbit. Iran's IRGC runs military drills on disputed islands claimed by UAE. He was responsible for coordinating the military alliance between Syria and Iran, an important part of Iran's regional network of allies and proxies known as the "Axis of Resistance". Mousavi "was killed during an attack by the Zionist regime a few hours ago in Zeinabiyah district in the suburbs of Damascus," Iran's official IRNA news agency reported, using a different name for Sayyida Zeinab south of the Syrian capital.

Turkey hits 71 targets in Iraq, Syria in retaliation for soldiers' deaths

Turkey has hit 71 sites allegedly linked to Kurdish groups in Syria and northern Iraq during air raids launched this week in retaliation for the deaths of 12 Turkish soldiers in Iraq, the defence minister has said. In a video message posted on X, Defence Minister Yasar Guler claimed on Wednesday that at least 59 Kurdish fighters were "neutralised" in the attacks. Ankara uses that term to refer to killed or captured fighters of the banned Kurdistan Workers Party (PKK).

Tensions Rise Between Sudan Army and United Arab Emirates

The UAE denies the allegations. Sudan's army expels 15 UAE diplomats, describing Abu Dhabi as a "state mafia." Analysts suggest the army's bold stance reflects desperation as options dwindle in the ongoing conflict. The dispute underscores broader geopolitical complexities in the region.
