#### Azerbaijan's president congratulates Iranian counterpart for ceasefire with Israel

#### India, Cyprus deepen Strategic Defence Partnership amid regional tensions

#### Iran downs 4th Israeli F-35, Lockheed Martin stock falls

The Deputy Governor of East Azerbaijan Province has announced that an Israeli F-35 fighter jet was shot down in the skies above Tabriz. According to Tasnim news agency, the aircraft was identified by Iranian air defence systems stationed in the area and was successfully targeted with a precision-guided missile. The fate of the pilot is unknown. This is the fourth time Iran has downed an F-35 fighter jet in the ongoing war with Israel, which began on June 15, 2025 after the regime launched unprovoked and deadly airstrikes on Tehran's residential buildings, as well as nuclear and military sites across the country. Two Israel pilots are currently in Iran's captivity. Lockheed Martin, the defence American contractor manufactures the F-35 stealth fighter, has seen a sharp decline in its stock value following reports that Iran has downed four F-35 jets since the outbreak of hostilities. Sources say debris from the last downed aircraft is being recovered and moved to secure locations for further analysis.

#### Why it will be hard for Trump to stay out of the conflict with Iran

Compelling national security arguments and domestic political considerations mean it makes sense to stop short of direct US offensive operations in the long-dreaded conflict that Israel describes as a matter of preserving its own existence. But powerful forces could suck America deeper into the conflict than its current role in helping to shield Israel from Iran's deadly rain of missiles and drones. CNN reported that over the weekend, Trump rejected an Israeli plan to kill Iran's Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, according to two sources. But some of this is out of Trump's hands. Should Iran's battered regime decide it has nothing to lose and attack US bases and personnel in the region, or US targets across the globe, Washington will be forced to respond hard to preserve credibility and deterrence. Another possibility is that Tehran could create duress on Trump to rein in Israel by attacking international shipping in the Gulf or Red Sea and bring on a global energy crisis. Pressure is also mounting on Trump from inside his own party for action that only the United States could carry out — a mission to destroy Iran's subterranean site at Fordow, which is believed to be beyond Israel's airborne capabilities. The logic of such a strike would be that Iran is now uniquely vulnerable, and a better chance may never come for the US to destroy the possibility of an Iranian nuclear weapon.

#### Iran crushes Mossad cells in nationwide sweep; Seizes missiles, drones after Israeli aggression

In a blow to the Israeli regime's espionage apparatus, Iranian security forces have dismantled multiple Mossad sabotage networks across the country, seizing Israelimade Spike anti-tank missiles, suicide drones, and explosives destined for attacks on critical infrastructure and residential areas. The operations, which included execution of convicted Mossad agent Fekri. Esmail demonstrate Iran's unwavering resolve following Israel's unprovoked aggression in the early hours of June 15, 2025, that has martyred over 224 Iranian nationals, including top military commanders and nuclear scientists. Fekri, arrested in December 2023 after a complex intelligence operation, was hanged after Iran's Supreme Court upheld his death sentence. Judicial authorities confirmed he had gathered "classified national security intelligence, including strategic site and locations internal organisational missions" for Mossad handlers using encrypted communications and cryptocurrency payments. His execution the third in recent weeks—follows the April elimination of Mossad operative Mohsen Langarneshin, the 2022 linked assassination of IRGC Colonel Hassan Sayyad-Khodaei.

## Israeli strike came when Iran was in middle of diplomatic track with US: Tehran

Iranian Foreign Ministry Spokesperson Esmail Baghaei says the Israeli strike has effectively sabotaged indirect nuclear negotiations with the United States. Addressing reporters at a weekly press briefing, he said: "We were in the middle of a diplomatic track when this regime launched its aggression—an act that could not have occurred without coordination or at least tacit approval from Washington." Baghaei dismissed recent U.S. statements as "contradictory and evasive," calling for a clear stance from Washington. "This is not a time for ambiguity. The U.S. must choose between its professed commitment to diplomacy and its apparent support for a regime engaged in war crimes." Asked about remarks made by the U.S. President Donald Trump and other U.S. officials regarding potential negotiations, Baghaei said talks under the current circumstances were meaningless. ## In new Iranian fusillade, a huge number of missiles are seen making impact; 'Iron Dome' is said to be hacked

The Armed Forces are hitting targets inside Israeli-occupied territories in a new wave of strikes. The combined strikes started. sending millions ofIsraelis into underground bomb shelters for a fourth day in a row. Initially, drones were launched, and powerful missiles were fired shortly later. Reports said the Israeli "Iron Dome" missile system was hacked, and Israeli missiles were being fired at Israeli locations in a mix of confusion and incompetence. Footage captured by cellphone cameras from inside the Israeli-occupied territories also showed large numbers of Iranian missiles passing through Israeli defences uninterrupted and making impact on targets on the ground. Earlier on June 16, 2025, Israel's National Cyber Directorate said text messages had been sent to Israelis by the military unit that issues civilian safety guidelines falsely instructing people to avoid entering public bomb shelters, in what seemed to be another successful cyberattack.

#### 11 IAEA BoG members condemn Israeli strike on Iran's nuclear sites

Eleven member states of the International Atomic Energy Agency (I.A.E.A.) Board of Governors have issued a joint statement condemning the Israeli regime's military attack on Iran's peaceful nuclear facilities and urged immediate action by the United Nations nuclear watchdog and the Security Council to prevent such aggression. The members of the I.A.E.A. Board of Governors condemned Israel's aggression against Iran, including its military attacks on nuclear facilities under I.A.E.A. safeguards, calling them a flagrant violation of international law, the U.N. Charter, and the Statute of the I.A.E.A. The statement emphasised that these military attacks not only threaten international peace and security but also undermine confidence in the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (N.P.T.), constitute a blatant disregard for the I.A.E.A. safeguards system, and jeopardise the advancement of peaceful nuclear energy. The signatories also stressed that any armed attack or threat against nuclear facilities dedicated to peaceful purposes constitutes a violation of the principles of the U.N. Charter, international law, and the Statute of the I.A.E.A.

Israel's unprecedented attacks on Iran had at their core an elusive and high-risk goal: eradicating the country's controversial nuclear program. Israel targeted three key Iranian nuclear facilities – Natanz, Isfahan and Fordow – and a number of top scientists in nuclear research involved development. The extent of the damage is beginning to come into view, with satellite imagery and expert analysis hinting that the strikes had a significant impact in at least two of the locations. But much remains unclear - not least because Iran's most sensitive nuclear infrastructure is buried deep underground - and each side gave predictably contrasting assessments: An Israeli military official said at a briefing that strikes on Iran's nuclear sites in Natanz and Isfahan were able to damage the sites "significantly," while Iran claimed that damage to the facilities was limited. "The whole (nuclear) supply chain has been disrupted," Ali Vaez, the Iran Project Director at the International Crisis Group, told CNN, as Israel and Iran continued to fire. exchange Vaez stressed significance of each targeted nuclear site, which are all involved in the complex sequence of steps required to create a nuclear weapon.

#### Iran shoots down Israeli F-35 fighter jet over Tabriz

Director General of East Azerbaijan Crisis Management says the Iranian Armed Forces' air defence in Tabriz successfully shot down an Israeli F-35 fighter jet in Tabriz, northwestern Iran. Majid Farshi said two combat drones had earlier been shot down in Tabriz. He added that three locations around Tabriz were targeted on June 17, 2025, and air defence systems engaged the Israeli invading micro air vehicles (MAVs). This marks the fourth F-35 fighter jet to be intercepted and destroyed by Iran's air defences. The Israeli regime began strikes inside Iranian territory, including on residential buildings, in an unprovoked act of aggression overnight on June 13. High-ranking Iranian military officials were assassinated in targeted strikes. Civilians lost their lives as houses were directly struck, affecting entire population centers. The Israeli military also carried out strikes against Iran's top military brass. Chairman of the Chiefs of Staff of Iran's Armed Forces Major General Mohammad Bageri and Chief Commander of the Islamic Revolution Guards Corps Major General Hossein Salami were among the senior military officials assassinated in Tehran.

## Iran vows more surprises following successful stealth missile strike against Israel

Iran's Ministry of Defence confirmed Tuesday the successful deployment of a previously undisclosed missile system during its ongoing defensive operations against Israeli aggression and warned the "further regime to expect strategic surprises." #### Israeli media says 10 missiles launched in latest round of Iranian missile strike

## New type of Iranian missiles, previously undisclosed, reach occupied territories

Iran has launched a barrage of missiles into the occupied territories as part of the latest phase of Operation True Promise III-this time sending missiles that sport a higher range and power in comparison to the ones that were used before in the course of last five days of conflict with Israel. According to the informed sources, the range of these new missiles, that have been launched around 8 p.m. local time on Wednesday, have an approximate range of 6000 kilometres. Iran's armed forces intensified their military operations against occupied Palestine, continuing Operation Promise III with a series of missile strikes on June 17 and 18. On June 17, 2025 evening and into June 18, 2025 morning, Iran launched three new waves of ballistic missiles targeting various locations across the occupied territories. Reports indicate that these attacks caused widespread explosions from the northern to southern parts of occupied Palestine, with numerous videos and images circulating showing the aftermath, including incidents of self-damage involving Israeli missile defence systems. ## IRGC targets Israeli airbases in tenth wave of True Promise III, vows sustained strikes

The Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) announced on June 15, 2025, that its aerospace forces struck Israeli airbases that used to launch "audacious aggression" against Iranian territory, marking the tenth wave of Operation True Promise III. In a statement (Communiqué No. 9), the IRGC emphasised these precision strikes were a direct response to the Zionist regime's attacks on sovereign Iranian soil and signaled that "complex, multi-layered, and gradual operations will continue relentlessly." The operation commenced June 13, 2025, night after Israel launched its act of aggression against Iran and assassinated senior IRGC commanders, nuclear scientists, and civilians—including children—in Tehran and other Iranian cities. In the third phase of Operation True Promise III, initiated late Sunday, the IRGC unleashed coordinated missile and drone strikes deep inside occupied territories. According to military sources, six strategic sites were hit, including: Military and intelligence command centers in Tel Aviv, Haifa's oil refinery, a critical energy hub supplying the regime, Rafael Advanced Defence Systems facilities, which produce the Iron Dome. Although the regime has imposed strict military censorship, social media footage showed ballistic missiles overwhelming Israeli air defences, causing great precision and success against targets. The strikes triggered massive explosions in Haifa, flattened buildings in Tel Aviv, and damaged 61 structures in Bat Yam alone—six of which were completely destroyed.

### Is Iran 'very close' to building a nuclear bomb as Trump claims?

Returning early from the Group of Seven summit in Canada early on June 17, 2025, United States President Donald Trump told reporters he believed Iran was "very close" to building nuclear weapons. His comments were in keeping with increasingly threatening social media posts language from Trump against Iran in recent days during Israel's escalating conflict with its longtime Middle Eastern rival. Israel has bombed Iran's top nuclear facilities and has killed at least 14 Iranian nuclear scientists. Israel's armed forces said the scientists "were key factors in the development of Iranian nuclear weapons" and "their elimination is a significant blow to the regime's ability to acquire weapons of mass destruction (WMDs)." Iran insists that its nuclear programme is entirely peaceful and for civilian purposes. It points to Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei's edict against nuclear weapons to back up its assertion. But Trump's comments echoed the claims made on multiple occasions by Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu for more than two decades – and repeated by him during the current conflict – to justify military action against Iran. "In recent

months, Iran has taken steps that it has never taken before: steps to weaponise enriched uranium," Netanyahu said on June 13, 2025, after the first wave of missiles struck Iranian nuclear facilities.

### IAEA chief says no evidence Iran is building nuclear weapons

In a significant admission that contradicts assertions of Israeli regime and US officials, the head of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) confirms that there is no evidence Iran is pursuing nucleal weapons program. Speaking to CNN journalist Christiane Amanpour on Tuesday, Rafael Grossi acknowledged what Iran has repeatedly stated and the UN nuclear agency has also confirmed in its reports. "What we reported was that we did not have any proof of a systematic effort [by Iran] to move toward a nuclear weapon," the director general of the IAEA was quoted as saying. He reiterated that the agency's findings align with independent sources on the issue. The statement marks a clarification from the UN nuclear agency following heightened scrutiny and criticism of its most recent quarterly report on Iran's nuclear activities, which Iran dismissed as "politically motivated." Iranian officials maintain that obligations under the JCPOA are no longer binding in the absence of compliance by other signatories, notably the Europeans,

and maintain that the country continues to uphold its commitments under the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT) and related IAEA Safeguards Agreement.

#### Why Israel wants US bunker busters to hit Iran's Fordow nuclear site

US President Donald Trump says he is still weighing his options regarding United States military intervention amid escalating hostilities between Israel and Iran. Standing on the South Lawn of the White House Trump said, "The next week is going to be big," adding that Iranian officials are eager to negotiate. However, he warned them that "it's very late to be talking," after they reached out to him. Officials and experts have suggested that the US's 30,000-pound (13,000kg) bunker buster bomb is the only weapon capable of destroying the Fordow Fuel Enrichment Plant, a facility believed be central to Tehran's nuclear programme and carved deep into a mountain. The United States is the only country to possess these bombs, which it delivers using B-2 bombers. If deployed against Iran, it would represent a major shift from primarily intercepting missiles on Israel's behalf to conducting active offensive strikes against Iran. buster" is a general term for bombs designed to destroy targets located deep underground that conventional bombs cannot reach. The US military's most powerful bunker buster is the GBU-57 Massive Ordnance Penetrator. Weighing

about 30,000 pounds (13,600 kg), including a 2,700kg (6,000-pound) warhead, this precision-guided bomb is made of high-strength steel and built to penetrate up to 200 feet (61 metres) underground before exploding.

## Iran ready for nuclear talks when 'Israeli aggression stops'

## Iran is using cluster bombs against Israel: What are these bombs and why are they banned in war?

Israel accused Iran of launching at least one missile carrying cluster munitions, marking the first reported use of such weapons in the seven-day-old conflict. According to Israeli officials. the missile dispersed submunitions designed to increase civilian casualties, raising serious humanitarian concerns. Cluster bombs, a type of cluster munition, are designed to release numerous explosives—known smaller submunitions—over a wide area. These weapons can be dropped from aircraft or launched from the ground. Once deployed, the main shell opens mid-air and scatters submunitions across an area equivalent to several football fields. One of the most controversial aspects of cluster munitions is their long-term danger. Some submunitions fail to explode on impact and remain lethal for years, posing significant risks to civilians and hindering post-conflict recovery. Removing unexploded ordnance is both costly and time-consuming.

It came a few days after the IAEA on 18 June reported that the

Tehran Research Center, where advanced centrifuge rotors were manufactured and tested, had been hit, as had a workshop in the city of Karaj where different centrifuge components were manufactured. There was no radiological impact, internally or externally.

A large nuclear complex in Esfahan has been targeted for a second time during Israel's attacks on Iran over the past nine days, with several more buildings struck, Director General Rafael Mariano Grossi of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) said today. The site in central Iran was first hit on 13 June when four buildings were damaged: the central chemical laboratory, a uranium conversion facility, a reactor fuel manufacturing plant, and an enriched uranium metal processing facility under construction. Based on information available to the IAEA today, six other buildings at the same site have now also been attacked: a natural and depleted uranium metal production facility which had not yet begun operations, a fuel rod production facility, a building with lowenriched uranium pellet production as well as a laboratory and nuclear material storage, another laboratory building, a workshop handling contaminated equipment and an office building with no nuclear material.

The International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) can confirm that the Iranian nuclear sites of Fordow, Natanz and Esfahan have been hit, following U.S. aerial attacks overnight, Director General Rafael Mariano Grossi said today. Based on an analysis of the information available to it, the IAEA assessed that there has been extensive additional damage at sprawling Esfahan site, which had already been struck several times by Israel since it began targeting Iran's nuclear facilities on 13 June, Director General Grossi said. The IAEA had previously reported that several buildings at the Esfahan complex were damaged, some of which may have contained nuclear material. "The latest attacks early this morning damaged other buildings in Esfahan. In addition, we have established that entrances to underground tunnels at the site were impacted," Director General Grossi said. The extent of damage to the Fordow uranium enrichment facility – built deep inside a mountain in central Iran – was not immediately possible to assess in view of its underground location and the penetrating nature of the bombs used.

### How the US used stealth and decoys to launch surprise attack on Iran

Before dawn in the US on June 19, 2025, plane spotters using flight tracker apps noticed B-2 stealth bombers based in Missouri flying to the Pacific, sparking

As experts debated why the B-2s were flying towards Guam and not Diego Garcia, an Indian Ocean location closer to Iran where the US and UK have a base, the US was already conducting a top-secret attack on Iran. Very early on June 19, 2025, eastern time, seven other B-2s took off from Whiteman Air Force Base in Missouri. Unlike the planes that flew to the Pacific and made themselves detectable at times, the seven B-2s flew east in stealth mode. Roughly 18 hours later, they dropped 14 massive bunker-buster bombs on two of Iran's three nuclear sites that were hit in the strikes. After the strikes on Fordow, Natanz and Isfahan, US defence secretary Pete Hegseth said Operation Midnight Hammer involved very tight operational security and "misdirection". "The scope and scale of what occurred... would take the breath away of almost any American if you had an opportunity to watch it in real time," Hegseth said.

Iran's Ambassador to the United Kingdom, Ali Mousavi, issued a stern warning during a heated session of the British Parliament's Foreign Affairs Committee on June 17, emphasising that Iran is a legitimate sovereign state, and declaring that Tehran reserves the right to withdraw from the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT) under Article 10 if its vital national interests are jeopardized. The session focused on regional escalation, Iran's nuclear activities, and diplomatic paths forward. Mousavi pushed back forcefully against the "hostile rhetoric, biased narratives, and double standards" from Western officials. Asked about speculation that Iran may exit the NPT, Mousavi said such decisions fall under the authority of Iran's independent parliament. "According to Article 10, if a signatory's vital interests are threatened, withdrawal is a legal option. There's no ambiguity," he said, holding up photos of Iranians killed in recent Israeli attacks. "We are accountable to these people."

#### Israel and U.S. smashed Iran Nuclear site that grew after trump quit 2015 accord

Israeli and American strikes appear to have created a major roadblock to Iran's manufacture of atomic bombs, even if its cache of uranium fuel remains untouched. analysts say. That's because attacks on one of the sites, in Isfahan, shattered gear that Iran was preparing to use for the transformation of enriched uranium gas into dense metal. That process, known as metallisation, is among the last steps in making the explosive core of an atomic bomb. Some nuclear experts argue that the demolished gear might never have existed but for President Trump's abandoning a restrictive nuclear deal in his first term that President Barack Obama had negotiated. Mr. Trump and his allies faulted the 2015 Obama deal as preserving Iran's ability to produce as much nuclear fuel as it wanted after 2030. But some experts see that criticism as ignoring a far more immediate threat. They note that Iran ramped up work at Isfahan only after Mr. Trump canceled the deal, and that now, in effect, he has been forced to neutralize a danger of his own making.

### Iran managed to preserve some of its enriched uranium

Director-General of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) Rafael Grossi claims that Iran has managed to preserve some of its enriched uranium despite US and Israeli attacks on its nuclear sites. Speaking about the alleged 400 kilograms of uranium enriched to 60%, which Tehran allegedly presumably had, Grossi said: "We don't know where this material could be." "Some could have been destroyed as part of the attack, but some could have been moved. So there has to be at some point a clarification," the IAEA chief claimed, TASS reported. Earlier, CNN reported, citing sources, that the US intelligence community believes that American strikes on Iran did not destroy the main components of the country's nuclear program.

### Iran could restart enriching uranium in months, says nuclear watchdog chief

Iran could be able to start producing enriched uranium again "in a matter of months", the head of the UN's nuclear watchdog said, adding that there is no military solution to stop Iran from developing a nuclear weapon. Rafael Grossi, head of the International Atomic Energy Agency, said that while US bombs had dealt a "very serious level of damage" to Iran's nuclear facilities, "one cannot claim that everything has disappeared and there is nothing there". In an interview with CBS news aired on Sunday, Grossi said: "They can have, you know, in a matter of months, I would say, a few cascades of

centrifuges spinning and producing enriched uranium." Grossi's comments follow a week of conflicting claims about the level of damage done to Iran's nuclear programme by Israeli and US forces during the 12-day war launched by Israel this month. Israel began bombing Iran's nuclear and military sites on June 13, and also killed several senior Iranian nuclear scientists in a series of targeted assassinations. The US then bombed three of Iran's most important nuclear facilities: Fordow, Natanz and Isfahan, on June 21.

#### Iraq launches Arab nuclear crisis cell over Iran-Israel tensions

Iraq has launched a regional crisis cell to respond to potential nuclear emergencies, as Israeli military operations targeting Iranian nuclear facilities escalate. ## Iraq Probes Drone Attacks on Military Radar Systems

Iraq said it will investigate suicide drone attacks on radar systems at two military bases, adding that its forces intercepted several other attempted incursions. ## Balancing acts and breaking points: Iraq's US-Iran dilemma

Even without the current conflict between Israel and Iran, the prospects for future US-Iraq relations have often appeared dim. Due in part to the reduced threat from the Islamic State in Iraq and al-Sham (ISIS), and also to public opposition to US military presence under Operation Inherent Resolve (OIR), Washington and Baghdad agreed to reduce the role of US forces in combating ISIS and transition to a new security relationship. Moreover, Iran-backed militias had renewed attacks against US forces over Washington's support for

Israel's military operations in Gaza in the aftermath of October 7, 2023. Making matters worse, popular expressions of anti-US sentiment, due to Iraqis' long-held animosity towards Israel, led to attacks on US-linked businesses, limiting already low interest in expanding economic ties. Thus, with a diminishing security cooperation footprint and little room to expand into other sectors, it is difficult to envision where US-Iraq relations could go, except for termination or a status quo that does not adequately serve the interests of either party.

## Israel destroyed a third of Iran's ballistic missile launchers, IDF says

IDF Chief Spokesman Brig.-Gen. Effie Defrin on June 16, 2025 announced that the air force has destroyed a third of Iran's ballistic missile launchers, 120 in total. Each launcher could have fired dozens of missiles over the course of the current war. The Islamic Republic was only able to fire around half of the missiles it had intended to fire overnight, said Defrin. This means that for the rest of the war, Iran's ability to launch more missiles at once will be reduced by at least a third, if not more, given that during the overnight attack, Tehran's firing capability was reduced by around half. Overnight, Defrin said that the air force also destroyed 20 ballistic missiles that were on their way to being fired. This means that given that Iran fired 40 ballistic

missiles, it would have fired at least 60, without getting into how many missiles it lost the ability to fire, given its losses in the area of missile launchers.

# IAEA: All 15,000 centrifuges at Iran's main enrichment plant likely 'severely damaged'

It is very likely all the roughly 15,000 centrifuges operating at Iran's biggest uranium enrichment plant at Natanz were badly damaged or destroyed because of a power cut caused by an Israeli strike, the UN nuclear watchdog chief told the BBC on June 16, 2025. The International Atomic Energy Agency and its Director General Rafael Grossi had previously said the centrifuges at the underground enrichment plant at Natanz may have been damaged as a result of an airstrike on its power supply, even though the hall housing the plant itself did not seem to have been hit. "Our assessment is that with this sudden loss of external power, in great probability the centrifuges have been severely damaged if not destroyed altogether," Grossi said in an interview with the BBC. "I think there has been damage inside," he said, going further than in an update to an exceptional meeting of his agency's 35-nation Board of Governors hours earlier. Power cuts pose a threat to the fragile, finely balanced

machines that spin at extremely high speeds.

## How Iran could further retaliate for Israel's offensive

### IAEA says Israeli strike directly hit Iran's Natanz underground enrichment plant

An Israeli military strike on Iran's nuclear complex at Natanz directly hit the underground uranium enrichment plant there, the United Nations nuclear watchdog said on June 17, 2025, revising its assessment after initially reporting it had been hit only indirectly. Israel bombed the site on June 13, 2025, during the first wave of major strikes to start its shock campaign against Iranian military and nuclear sites, in

a move it says was needed to thwart an immediate existential nuclear threat. The International Atomic Energy Agency had previously said an above-ground pilot enrichment plant at Natanz was destroyed, but assessed that the larger underground plant was not directly hit, although IAEA chief Rafael Grossi said on June 16, 2025, its roughly 15,000 centrifuges had very likely been badly damaged by a strike on the plant's power supply. However, on June 17, 2025, the IAEA said on X: "Based on continued analysis of high-resolution satellite imagery collected after Friday's attacks, the IAEA has identified additional elements that indicate direct impacts on the underground enrichment halls at Natanz." Located 135 miles (220 kilometers) southeast of Tehran, the Natanz facility was protected by anti-aircraft batteries, fencing Iran's paramilitary Islamic and Revolutionary Guard Corps.

# Israel running low on Arrow interceptors, US burning through its systems too – WSJ

A report in The Washington Post June 17, 2025, cited a on US person briefed and Israeli intelligence, who said that, according to "some assessments," Israel can maintain its air defence for 10-12 days at the current rate of Iranian attacks — which have lessened since the start of the fighting last week before it will require the US to replenish its stocks or get more involved in the war.

Technicians from the Israel Defence Forces (IDF) say they recovered dozens of unexploded canisters on June 19, 2025, after one of the missiles Iran fired toward central Israel carried a cluster bomb warhead, and have opened an inquiry into whether Tehran's arsenal might also include true MIRV (multiple independently-targetable reentry vehicle) capability. A cluster bomb is a containered

warhead that, upon reaching its target area, opens in mid-air and scatters dozens or hundreds of smaller explosives, known as "bomblets," over a wide zone. Those bomblets are unguided and designed to increase the chance of hitting troops, vehicles or soft targets across an area roughly the size of several football fields. By contrast, a MIRV-equipped missile carries several precision warheads, each with its own guidance system. After the missile's main rockets burn out, an onboard "bus" maneuvers in space, releasing each reentry vehicle on a separate trajectory aimed at distinct targets. In effect, one missile becomes multiple cross-country threats.

# Going at it alone: Can Israel complete its mission in Iran without US assistance? - analysis

Such statistics could be highly significant because there is a likely tipping point around 50-70% damage to Iranian launchers where, even if the Islamic Republic still has 15,000 ballistic missiles left, it will be unable to launch more than 10-30 at a time, which will make it much easier to shoot down all of the missiles. Already on June 16, 2025, the IDF said it had destroyed 120 Iranian ballistic missile launchers, which it placed at around onethird of the total.

Iranian missile with cluster warhead scattered bombs in central Israel, IDF says

At least one ballistic missile launched by Iran at Israel in a barrage on June 19, 2025 morning was carrying a cluster bomb warhead, the Israel Defence Forces said, marking a dangerous new development after nearly a week of attacks. The IDF Home Front Command said the missile's warhead split while descending, at an altitude of around 7 kilometers (4.3 miles), spreading around 20 smaller munitions at a radius of around 8 kilometers (5 miles). The munitions do not have their own propulsion or guidance and simply fall to the ground, where they are designed to explode on impact. An Israeli military official said such a missile poses a threat to a much wider area than Iran's other ballistic missile warheads, but the explosion from each of the cluster bombs is far smaller. One of the small munitions, with an explosive warhead of around 2.5 kilograms, struck a home in the central town of Azor, causing damage equivalent to that of a small rocket. Many of the other munitions did not explode, according to the military official. The unexploded ordnance still poses a danger to anyone who happens upon them.

## Why Israel-Iran tensions might not raise prices at the pump as much as feared

The unexpected attack by Israel on Iran, a major oil-producing nation, may undermine anemic global economic growth and hinder central banks' ability to cope in an already uncertain market. Iran exports up to 2 million barrels per day (mbd) of oil and refined petroleum products. Due to longstanding sanctions, most of this oil is sold to China at discounted prices. Normally, a sudden loss of the Iranian exports (equivalent to around 2 percent of global oil supply) would trigger panic. But OPEC (the Organisation of the Petroleum Exporting Countries) is in the process of reversing the production cuts imposed early in the COVID pandemic (and subsequently). This leaves the organisation with an unusually large spare capacity of at least four million barrels per day, most of which is held by Saudi Arabia (up to 3.5 million) and the UAE (about one million). On top of that, the International Energy Agency (IEA) holds more than 1.2 billion barrels of reserves across **OECD** emergency countries, ready to be deployed if needed. China, too, has significant reserves, though

the line between its commercial and strategic stocks is less clear.

# Could Iran's missiles carry nuclear warheads? An expert breaks down the threat

As Iran continues to launch missiles at Israel, a question looms large in the minds of defence analysts and civilians alike: If Iran's nuclear program is able to advance, could those same missiles one day carry nuclear warheads? Inbar has spent decades tracking the development of missile systems in Iran, North Korea, and beyond. According to Inbar, two basic features determine whether a missile can be equipped with a nuclear warhead: the weight the missile can carry (payload capacity) and the physical space inside the warhead compartment. "Every missile with a warhead of roughly 500 kilograms (1,100)pounds) could

theoretically be fitted with a nuclear warhead," he explained.

# Putin: Peace offers shared with Israel and Iran; Moscow hasn't abandoned Tehran

## Mossad says Iran 15 days from bomb, US agencies still say up to a year – report

Despite Iran's development of a large stockpile of enriched uranium that cannot serve any peaceful purpose, US intelligence agencies continue to differ with more foreboding Israeli assessments that the Islamic Republic is actively pursuing a nuclear weapon, according to a June 19,

Banned by 100+ countries, Iran attacks Israel with "Cluster Munitions"; Here's why they are widely prohibited

In what may be a first in the ongoing Iran-Israel war, Iran launched a ballistic missile with cluster munitions in a devastating strike on Israel, indicating that it is unlikely to back out and is far from being crippled. The Israel Defence Force (IDF) Home Front Command confirmed that Iran launched a ballistic missile carrying a cluster bomb warhead aimed at targets in central Israel on June 19. It stated that the warhead split at an altitude of 7 kilometres while descending, and then spread out about 20 sub-munitions across a radius of 8 kilometres. One of the small explosives,

about the size of a small rocket, inflicted some damage on a house near the central town of Azor. An unidentified Israeli military officer told The Times of Israel that although the explosion from each cluster bomb is substantially smaller, such a missile threatens a far larger area than Iran's other ballistic missile warheads. The army advised the civilians to notify authorities right away if they see any missile wreckage on the ground and to avoid approaching any such wreckage. The conflict between Israel and Iran began on June 13 with unprecedented IDF strikes on Iranian nuclear facilities and its top military leadership. Iran Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) retaliated soon after the first round of air strikes by the IDF, and has launched dozens of missile and drone strikes on Israel, breaching its air defences and hitting strategic assets like the Mossad Headquarters.

# IAEA: No fear of 'radiological effects' after IDF hits Iran's Arak heavy water reactor

The UN nuclear watchdog confirmed June 19, 2025 that IDF strikes had hit Iran's partially built Khondab Heavy Water Research Reactor and damaged the nearby plant that makes heavy water, a component used in nuclear react. It was not operational and contained no nuclear material, so no radiological effects," the International Atomic Energy Agency said in a post on X. Production Plant was initially not visible, it is now assessed that key buildings at the facility were damaged, including the distillation unit," the IAEA statement said.

From 90% To 65% — Israel's Interception Rate Goes Down Big Time; IAF Expert Decodes Why IDF's SAMs Are Leaking Missiles

NBC News, citing a senior Israeli intelligence official, reported that only about 65% of Iranian missiles were intercepted in the past 24 hours, significantly lower than the nearly 90% interception rate the day before. Several other outlets have echoed NBC's report. Earlier, The New York Times reported that Iran had fired around 400 missiles, with nearly 40 evading interception and striking Israeli neighborhoods—implying a 90% interception rate. The drop in interception rate coincides with reports from The Wall Street Journal and Newsweek highlighting concerns over Israel's dwindling stockpile of Arrow missile interceptors. The decline in Israel's interception rate could be due to its dwindling stockpile of interceptors, the use of more technically advanced missiles by Iran, or a combination of both. In the first case, Israel may be conserving interceptors when an incoming missile is unlikely to hit a significant target, which would naturally lower the interception rate. Newsweek reports that Iran has deployed

hypersonic missiles, which are particularly difficult to intercept due to their high speed and maneuverability. These missiles significantly reduce the time available for Israel's air defence systems to respond.

IDF hits Isfahan nuclear site for 2nd time; Iran fires 5 missiles in overnight barrage

The Israeli Air Force bombed Iran's Isfahan nuclear site early June 21, 2025, for the second time since the start of the conflict, as Iran fired an overnight volley of five ballistic missiles at central According to the military, some 50 IAF fighter jets were involved in overnight strikes, dropping 150 munitions on dozens of targets in Iran, including the Isfahan nuclear facility and four primed missile launchers. ## Denying reports, IDF indicates that it's not running low on missile interceptors

Israel is not running low on air defence interceptors amid its conflict with Iran, the military indicated June 20, 2025, denying reporting that the IDF's stockpile of interceptor missiles is being depleted. The Israel Defence Forces said it was "prepared and ready to handle any scenario," but officially declined to comment on specific munitions matters. Military officials have told The Times of Israel that the operation in Iran was planned months in advance, and the planning took into account Iran's stock of ballistic missiles and drones that it could fire at Israel. Taking Iran's stockpile into account means the IDF prepared ahead of time with enough interceptors to handle the threat. IDF Chief of Staff Lt. Gen. Eyal Zamir said Friday evening that "we launched the campaign when possessed around 2,500 surface-to-surface missiles," while warning Israelis to brace for a "prolonged" conflict. Additionally, the IDF is actually running through fewer interceptors than it anticipated at this point in the operation. The IDF estimated that Iran would fire several hundred ballistic missiles at Israel in its initial response. In reality, it mustered just 100. In all, some 470 ballistic missiles have been fired from Iran at Israel in the past week, below the IDF's "reference scenario" for the operation.

## How the attacks on Iran are part of a much bigger global struggle

## Its missile stock is depleted, but Iran's arsenal may still be a threat

With the Iran-Israel conflict possibly brought to a halt by a US-brokered ceasefire on June24, 2025, questions remain over the true condition of Iran's missile arsenal after nearly two weeks of punishing exchanges. Iran's missile salvos proved the destructive power of its longrange missiles, turning buildings into rubble and killing dozens, even as Israel has claimed to take out much of its stockpile and the means to launch. Al Udeid Air Base Qatar: Why US is removing its troops from this base in Middle East amid Iran-Israel war

"We will not submit to anyone's aggression – this is the logic of the Iranian nation."

# Saudi nuclear authority confirms no radiation risk from regional conflict

Saudi Arabia's Nuclear and Radiological Regulatory Commission (NRRC) has confirmed the safety of the Kingdom's environment amid rising regional tensions, stating that there have been no radiation leaks affecting the country. In a statement posted Thursday on its official X account, the NRRC said that radiation levels across the Kingdom remain normal and the environment is safe, despite the ongoing military escalation between Iran and Israel. In a follow-up post, the commission clarified that the military strike on Iran's Arak research reactor has had radiological consequences, as the facility is currently free of nuclear fuel. The NRRC reiterated that it has been monitoring developments around the clock, and that its emergency operations center is actively evaluating any potential nuclear fallout risks. It also emphasized that preventive measures are in place to protect the public and the environment from potential radiological impacts.

# IAEA launches management system advisory service to support the Introduction of Nuclear Power, conducts first mission to Saudi Arabia

IAEA conducted its first-ever management systems advisory service in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia from 19 to 22 May 2025. The IAEA Management Systems Advisory Service (IMSAS) was established to support newcomer countries in developing robust and effective nuclear infrastructure, in response to findings from Integrated the Agency's Nuclear Infrastructure Review (INIR) missions that inconsistencies highlighted implementation of management systems among countries embarking on new nuclear power programmes. As part of the IAEA's broader commitment to support countries in introducing nuclear power in their energy mix, IMSAS helps nuclear organizations develop and maintain management systems appropriate to the current phase of the nuclear power programme. A management system is a set of interrelated or interacting elements — including organizational structure, responsibilities, resources, and processes — established to achieve organizational objectives in an efficient and effective manner.

## What's behind Syria's silence on the Israel-Iran War?

While tensions between Iran and Israel have erupted into open warfare, Syria has so far remained officially silent. The conflict, which began with a series of strikes and counterstrikes, has rapidly escalated into a full-scale confrontation marked by long-range missile exchanges. With missiles from both countries regularly traversing Syrian airspace near Damascus, Syria's silence has prompted speculation over its political and military calculus. President Ahmed al-Sharaa's government has not issued any formal statement. Syrian state media have remained vague, offering only brief remarks about "the importance of Syrian sovereignty" without clarifying the government's stance on the conflict. Some analysts suggest Syria's silence stems from necessity rather than a calculated policy. "Syria's fragile economy deteriorated military capacity after more than a decade of civil war do not allow it to engage in any new political or military adventure, regardless of pressure from allies," said political analyst Samir Abdullah, a professor of international relations at Damascus University.

# Radar in Turkey gives US early access to Iranian missile launches. Israel may benefit

The rally, organized by civil servant, student, and journalist unions, took place in Ankara on October 8, 2011. As missiles fly between Israel and Iran in their most dangerous confrontation to date, attention is turning to a high-tech radar system located in eastern Turkey. The USoperated AN/TPY-2 radar installation in Kürecik, Malatya province, is capable of detecting missile launches from deep inside Iranian territory, and experts say it could play a critical role in warning against Iranian attacks. The radar, operational since 2012, is part of NATO's ballistic missile defense architecture. It was deployed to provide early warning of potential threats from Iran aimed at Europe. But its strategic positioning—roughly 500 kilometers from Iran's western border with Turkey-also makes it highly valuable to any system intercept Iranian missiles trying to midflight.

# Turkish Aerospace eyes full development of local KAAN fighter jet engine by 2032

"We [have] already started working on" the new TF35000 turbofan engine, Mehmet Demiroğlu, general manager at TAI, told Breaking Defense at Le Bourget, adding that work is being done jointly by Tusas Engine Industries (TEI) and TRMotor. As part of the system's preliminary design phase, a "conceptual design is almost done," he added, "and then it will go to initial prototyping maybe by the end of the year." Additionally, Demiroğlu said that "some early testing" of the powerplant is planned in 2026 and integration on KAAN could be a reality starting in 2032.

## S-400s not enough to meet Turkey's air defence needs
