Upgraded systems ready to counter any threat: Iranian air defence chief

Iran's top air defence commander has declared the country fully prepared to counter any threat, emphasizing recent advancements in its defense capabilities. Speaking on the sidelines of the Fourth International Conference of Mahdavi Shahid Activists at the Khezravi Specialised Training Center, Brigadier General Alireza Sabahifard told reporters that Iran's air defence forces are equipped with entirely domestically produced "Our armed forces and air systems. defence are ready to confront any threat. According to reports compiled by the intelligence director for the Joint

Chiefs of Staff and the Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA), Iran's Fordow and Natanz nuclear sites are considered potential targets.

Iranian Navy fires AI-guided missiles during large-scale military exercises in the Persian Gulf

As reported by PressTV on January 25, 2025, the Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) Navy of Iran conducted large-scale military drills under the code name "Great Prophet Authority 19" on January 24, 2025, spanning the southern Iranian provinces of Bushehr and Khuzestan's littoral waters. The exercises included the deployment of missiles guided by artificial intelligence (AI), which successfully hit mock enemy targets. The Qaem and Almas missiles, integrated with AI technology, were launched by Mohajer-6 and Ababil 5 drones, demonstrating the IRGC Navy's focus on incorporating AI into its weapon systems. During the drills, the IRGC Navy

fired a range of ballistic and surface-tosurface missiles, including an offensive missile from the Shahid Soleimani warship. Additionally, Kowsar 222 missiles were used to intercept and destroy airborne targets. The exercises took place across the northern and central parts of the Persian Gulf and aimed to improve the coordination and readiness of the IRGC naval forces to respond to potential threats. IRGC Navy Commander Rear Admiral Alireza Tangsiri stated that the drills were also intended to convey a message of peace and friendship to neighboring countries.

Iran deploys Russian Yak-130 jets to intercept drones in military exercises

On February 24, 2025, during the Zolfagar 1403 military exercises, Iran demonstrated a step in integrating new aerial capabilities by deploying its Yak-130 aircraft in operational missions. According to Mehr News, which reported the event, these drills involved all branches of the Iranian Armed Forces and took place over a wide area stretching from the northern Indian Ocean to the Makran coasts in southeastern Iran. It was within this framework that the Islamic Republic of Iran Air Force (IRIAF) tested the Yak-130 for the first time in an interception mission, marking a notable evolution in the aircraft's role beyond its primary use as a trainer. The Yak-130, developed by Russian manufacturer Yakovlev, is a subsonic twin-seat aircraft originally desigsed for advanced pilot training for modern fighter jets such as the Su-35 and Su-57. According to Brigadier General Alireza Sheikh, the spokesperson for the exercises, a Yak-130 was deployed alongside two MiG-29s to intercept and neutralise a drone simulating a hostile aircraft. In a coordinated approach, the MiG-29 pilots first detected and tracked the target before relaying the data to the Yak-130, which then successfully eliminated it using guided missiles. This operation demonstrated the IRIAF's coordination and responsiveness, confirming the Yak-130's ability to be integrated into aerial operations alongside heavier combat aircraft.

Iran will not yield to US 'pressure and sanctions' on nuclear issue

Iran will not yield to pressure and sanctions imposed by Washington, the Islamic Republic's top diplomat after meeting his Russian counterpart, days after Moscow held initial talks with the US just a month into Donald Trump's second term in the White House. During his one-day trip to Iran, Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov discussed regional and bilateral topics with Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Aragchi, said state media. The visit came a day after the US imposed a fresh round of sanctions targeting Iran's oil industry, the Islamic Republic's main source of income. Trump earlier this month restored his "maximum pressure" campaign on Iran that includes efforts to drive the country's oil exports to zero, re-imposing a tough policy on Iran that was followed throughout his first term. "Iran's position regarding nuclear talks is clear and we will not negotiate under pressure and sanctions," said Aragchi during a televised joint press conference with Lavrov. "There is no possibility of direct negotiations with the US as long as maximum pressure is being applied in this way."

Iran accelerates production of near weapons-grade uranium, IAEA says, as tensions with US ratchet up

Iran has significantly increased its stockpile of near weapons-grade uranium, reaching 274.8 kilograms of uranium enriched up to 60% as of February 8. This escalation raises alarms amid heightened tensions with the U.S. Iran's decision follows its ban on IAEA inspectors experienced and continued advanced expansion of centrifuges for uranium enrichment at Natanz and Fordo. The report by the Vienna-based International Atomic Energy Agency said that as of Feb. 8, Iran has 274.8 kilograms (605.8 pounds) of uranium enriched up to 60%. That's an increase of 92.5 kilograms (203.9 pounds) since the IAEA's last report in November. That material is a short, technical step away from weapons-grade levels of 90%.

Iran's nuclear weapons potential leaps ahead of IAEA meeting

Iran's major strides in its march towards a nuclear weapon hang ominously over the meeting of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) Board of Governors in Vienna on March 3-7. The nuclear monitoring agency reports that Tehran surged production of 60 percent highly enriched uranium (HEU), increasing this stock by 50 percent since the IAEA's last reporting in November. Using this roughly 275-kilogram stock of HEU, Tehran can fuel nearly seven nuclear weapons. Overall, Iran is currently assessed to possess enough material for at least 17 weapons, if further enriched to weapons grade. The IAEA also reported that Iran once again failed to answer the agency's questions about nuclear weapons work at two sites. Tehran continues to build new nuclear facilities without notifying the IAEA, a violation of Iran's legal safeguards obligations. In addition to Iran's advancing capability to produce fuel for multiple nuclear weapons, The New York Times reported in February that the Islamic Republic has a secret team dedicated to shortening the country's route to constructing nuclear weapons. Axios reporting in 2024 suggested that Iran had restarted weaponisation activities such as computer modeling, metallurgy, and tests to trigger an implosion that compresses a nuclear device. which leads to its detonation.

Senior diplomat says Iran ready to share nuclear knowledge with regional countries

Iran is prepared to collaborate with regional countries by sharing its scientific and technical expertise on nuclear matters, according to Seyed Kamal Kharrazi, head of the Strategic Council on Foreign Relations. In an interview with Egypt's Al-Masry Al-Youm, Kharrazi discussed the region's turbulent history, asserting that colonial powers have long sought dominance in West Asia. He said that the

establishment of Israel was intended to destabilise the region. Criticising U.S. and Israeli policies, Kharrazi stated, "The U.S. and Europe do not abandon this region. They use division, instability, and war to justify their interventions." On Iran-Egypt relations, he emphasised the deep historical and civilizational ties between the two nations, stating that political any engagement depends on the decisions of their leaders, irrespective of past or present differences. Addressing the concept of the Resistance, Kharrazi described it as an enduring ideology rather than a movement that can be eliminated. "Even if it faces setbacks. Resistance remains a fundamental part of the region's struggle," he said. Regarding Iran's nuclear program, he reiterated that economic sanctions have failed to halt Iran's progress in peaceful nuclear technology. He reaffirmed Iran's readiness to share its scientific advancements with regional partners.

Iraq turns to China for agreement on peaceful nuclear energy use

Iraq decided to enhance the country's peaceful nuclear energy capabilities by signing agreements with China. The Prime Minister's media office confirmed that the Cabinet held its regular session and voted to authorise the Minister of Higher Education and Scientific Research, also head of the Iraqi Atomic Energy Commission, to negotiate and sign a cooperation agreement between the governments of Iraq and China. The agreement will focus on the peaceful use of nuclear energy, while The Ministry of Foreign Affairs will prepare the necessary authorisation document and submit it to the Cabinet Secretariat for final approval and signature by the Prime Minister. Prime Minister Mohammed Shia Al-Sudani stated last year that Iraq was among the first countries to seek membership in the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) and to commit to its treaties, emphasising Iraq's efforts to establish nuclear reactors for peaceful purposes, believing that nuclear energy should be a source of prosperity, not a means for developing deadly weapons. Iraa previously had three nuclear reactors in the al-Tuwaitha area south of Baghdad. One of these reactors was destroyed by an Israeli airstrike in 1981, while the other two were destroyed by U.S. aircraft during the Gulf War in 1991, following Iraq's invasion of Kuwait in 1990. These sites were used by the previous regime for the production of internationally banned weapons.

How US tech giants supplied Israel with AI models, raising questions about tech's role in warfare

US tech giants have quietly empowered Israel to track and kill many more alleged militants more quickly in Gaza and Lebanon through a sharp spike in artificial intelligence and computing services. But the number of civilians killed has also soared, along with fears that these tools are contributing to the deaths of innocent people. Militaries have for years hired private companies to build custom autonomous weapons. However, Israel's recent wars mark a leading instance in which commercial AI models made in the United States have been used in active warfare, despite concerns that they were not originally developed to help decide who lives and who dies. The Israeli military uses AI to sift through vast troves of intelligence, intercepted communications and surveillance to find suspicious speech or behaviour and learn the movements of its enemies. After a surprise attack by Hamas militants on October 7, 2023, its use of Microsoft and OpenAI technology skyrocketed, Associated an Press investigation found.

Israel's strategic calculations: Is an attack on Iran imminent?

This week, a high-stakes diplomatic meeting took place between US Secretary of State Marco Rubio and Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu in Jerusalem. The meeting was significant not only for its timing but also for the explicit rhetoric used by Netanyahu, who declared, "With the support of President Trump, we will finish the job against Iran." His statement has fueled speculation about Israel's immediate and long-term plans regarding Iran's nuclear ambitions and broader regional influence. The phrase "finish the job" carries heavy implications. For years, Israel has considered Iran's nuclear program an existential threat and has repeatedly warned that it would not allow Tehran to acquire nuclear weapons. Netanyahu's statement, coupled with heightened Israeli military activity and US diplomatic backing, suggests that Israel may be preparing for decisive military action. Secretary Rubio, standing beside Netanyahu, reinforced this perception by stating that Iran is "behind every terrorist group" operating in the Middle East. This characterisation aligns with Israel's longstanding position that Iran is the primary sponsor of militancy in the region. Given these strong remarks, the meeting between the two leaders has intensified discussions over whether Israel is poised to launch a preemptive strike against Iran's nuclear sites.

ACWA to acquire ENGIE's assets in Bahrain and Kuwait for \$693m

We consolidate our presence in Bahrain where we are already a reliable supplier of power and water, and we enter Kuwait, where we recently submitted a bid for a large power and desalination plant.

Lebanon presses for full Israeli withdrawal as troops remain in 5 places

Lebanese leaders said they were in contact with the United States and France to press Israel to withdraw fully, branding its continued presence in five places an "occupation" after a ceasefire deadline expired. The UN called the incomplete pullout a violation of a Security Council resolution, though it has allowed many displaced residents to return to devastated border villages after more than a year of hostilities between Israel and Hezbollah. It has also enabled the emergency services to from retrieve bodies previously inaccessible areas. Lebanon's civil defence agency said it had recovered 23 corpses from border villages. Israel smuggled pagers into Lebanon prior to 7 October attack, says Mossad chief

Israeli intelligence agents smuggled 500 pagers into Lebanon for the purpose of sabotaging the Hezbollah movement even before the Hamas cross-border incursion on 7 October 2023, the head of Israel's Mossad intelligence agency has revealed. On 17 September last year, thousands of pager devices exploded simultaneously across Lebanon, targeting alleged Hezbollah fighters and members who used them as a form of low-tech communication. The next day, thousands of walkie-talkies also exploded throughout the country. The incidents marked an extensive Israeli intelligence operation that killed at least 51 people and wounded thousands more, including civilians. Many at the time believed that Israel had been working on the operation for months, but as more information came out, it was revealed to be a years-long effort of setting up shell companies, hacking into devices' hardware, and arranging shipments to Lebanon, all with the aim of infiltrating Hezbollah and sabotaging the group's members at a time of Tel Aviv's choosing.

IDEX 2025: Airbus prep to propose A400M to UAE Air Force

In an exclusive media briefing, Airbus revealed its intention to deliver the A400M military airlift aircraft to the United Arab Emirates (UAE) when the time comes. On the margins of the International Defence Exhibition and Conference (IDEX 2025) in Abu Dhabi on 18 February, the company's newly appointed president for Africa and the Middle East, Gabriel Semelas, was joined by the head of the programme, Gerd Weber, to offer details behind their preparations for the future bid. "The A400 is a natural successor to C-130," the duo asserted. Out of ten A400M users, only three – Kazakhstan, Luxembourg, and Spain – have not operated the alternative legacy aircraft before.

How the Houthis' strikes on US MQ-9 Reaper drones serve a wider regional agenda

On December 28, 2024, Yahya Sare'e, the spokesperson for the Houthis, announced that a Houthi surface-to-air missile shot down a US MQ-9 Reaper unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) overflying the Al Bayda governorate in Yemen. Four days later, the Houthis boasted the downing of a second US-made drone in the Marib governorate, marking the first Houthi strike of an MQ-9 Reaper in 2025. These attacks represent the latest in a long string of successful Houthi strikes against US UAVs since the beginning of the Israel-Hamas war, showcasing the Houthis' growing offensive capabilities. For the Yemeni militant group, imposing a heavy toll on the US drone fleet serves tactical, strategic, and symbolic goals at the domestic and regional levels. The strikes against MQ-9 Reaper drones impair US intelligence and targeting systems and help the Houthis shore up domestic and regional support. And, with the Houthis' ties to China, Russia, and Iran, downed MQ-9 Reaper drones could end up in the hands of US adversaries.
