## Armenian sectoral organisations to participate in DEFEA 2025 Defence Exhibition with a Joint National Pavilion

DEFEA 2025: Armenia's GBL guided bomb brings autonomous precision strike capability to light drones

At the DEFEA 2025 international defence exhibition held in Athens, the Armenian

company Locator CJSC officially presents its new GBL series of guided bombs, designed to equip a wide range of unmanned aerial platforms. This system represents Armenia's entry into the field of autonomous precision munitions. combining artificial intelligence electro-optical targeting in a lightweight, modular format intended for tactical drones as fixed-wing UAVs, VTOLs, quadcopters, and hexacopters. The GBL is an autonomous "fire-and-forget" guided munition. Once released, it operates independently, using onboard processors and algorithms to detect, lock onto, and strike moving targets without requiring external guidance. The core of the system lies in its gyrostabilised optical sensor package, which ensures visual tracking stability, and in its precision control surfaces, which maintain the bomb's trajectory toward a designated target. The modular design allows for compatibility with various warheads, thanks to a universal mounting system. The latest GBL 2.0 variant includes two onboard cameras, one with a wide field of view for area scanning and another with a narrow, zoomed lens for target designation. These sensors switch automatically during flight to maximise the efficiency of target identification and engagement. The operational range of the munition has been increased from 2,000 meters to 3,000 meters in this version, offering more flexibility in both urban and open battlefield environments.

#### Prime Minister Pashinyan discusses Armenia-EU relations with Gert Jan Koopman

India will send the second batch of "Akash" surface-to-air missile systems to Armenia in July, according to IADN. At the end of November last year, media outlets reported that India had sent the first battery of the "Akash" missile system to Armenia. As The New Indian Express reports, in 2022, Armenia signed an agreement with India to purchase 15 "Akash" missile systems, valued at approximately 60 billion rupees (around \$710 million), becoming the first foreign country to acquire this system. The "Akash" system, developed by the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO), is a surface-to-air missile capable of targeting fighter jets, cruise missiles, airto-surface missiles, unmanned vehicles (UAVs), and other airborne threats at a range of up to 25 kilometers. Each battery of the Akash weapons system, produced by Bharat Electronics Limited, is accompanied by a passive electronically scanned array (PESA) 3D radar and four launchers—each equipped with three interconnected missiles.

Russia ready to offer various nuclear reactor designs to Armenia, says ambassador

Russia is ready to offer Armenia nuclear power plants with reactors of various capacities that feature enhanced safety and economic efficiency, Russian Ambassador to Armenia Sergey Kopyrkin declared during his visit to the Armenian Nuclear Power Plant on May 14. "Rosatom is ready to offer Armenian colleagues nuclear power plants of Russian design with reactors of various capacities, distinguished enhanced safety and economic efficiency," the ambassador emphasised during his visit to the Metsamor facility. Rosatom is Russia's state atomic energy corporation that oversees all aspects of the country's nuclear industry, from power generation and fuel production to plant both domestically construction and internationally. The corporation also manages the operation of the Armenian nuclear power plant through its subsidiary Rosatom Service JSC, which is currently working on extending the operating life of the station. The ambassador's working visit the Metsamor facility aimed to familiarise himself with the progress of work being carried out by Rosatom Service JSC on extending the operating life of the station for a second time.

### Nuclear energy plays a strategic role in Iran's development

### Iran unveils new solid-fueled ballistic missile, state TV reports

Iran's defence ministry unveiled the country's latest solid-fueled ballistic missile, state TV reported, against a backdrop of threats from the United States over its nuclear program. TV showed the "Qassem Basir" ballistic missile during an interview with Defence Minister Gen. Aziz Nasirzadeh. He said it includes improvements in both guidance and maneuverability to overcome layers of defence and easily bypass anti-ballistic defence systems. The missile was most recently tested on April 17. TV described the missile as having at least a 1,200kilometer (745-mile) range. It also said the missile can identify and strike a designated target among multiple ones without GPS guidance and with pinpoint accuracy. In reaction to a May 1 comment by Secretary of Defense Pete Hegseth on the platform X, in which he warns Iran about its support for the Houthis in Yemen, Nasirzade said if war is initiated by the US or Israel, Iran will strike their interests, bases and forces "wherever they are and whenever necessary." Nasirzadeh added: "We have no hostility toward neighboring countries and seek brotherly relations, but in the event of an attack, US bases in the region will be considered legitimate targets."

### Beyond the bomb: Ideology as the engine of Iran's nuclear doctrine

As a new round of nuclear talks between the United States and the Islamic Republic looms, negotiators must come to terms with the fact that the threat of the Iranian regime is not rooted in its nuclear ambitions, but rather in Tehran's ideological foundation. Should the officials return to negotiations, Washington must acknowledge ideological motivations underpinning Iran's nuclear ambitions beyond enrichment levels, centrifuge counts, and sunset clauses. What US President Donald Trump's administration might overlook is that Iran's nuclear program is not simply about energy or military deterrence—it is a tool for advancing a revolutionary

ideology. Since 1979, the Islamic Republic has operated along two strategic tracks: exporting its Shia revolutionary doctrine and establishing influence through networks like the "Axis of Resistance." This expansion is not limited to the Middle East—it includes initiatives in Africa and Latin America, where Iran quietly builds ideological and military infrastructure. At the core of this ideology is an enduring hostility toward the United States and an obsession with the destruction of Israel.

### Iran unveils electro-optical-guided ballistic missile

Iran's defence minister Brigadier General Aziz Nasirzadeh unveiled a ballistic missile called the Oasem Basir that has an electrooptical guidance system on 3 May. In an interview with Iranian television, Brig Gen Nasirzadeh described the Qasem Basir as an upgraded missile with improved manoeuvrability, so it can more effectively evade missile defence systems, and a guidance system that is immune to electronic warfare. He showed a video of a missile that looked like the Shahid Hai Qasem being launched, which included black-and-white footage that appeared to be filmed by its seeker as it descended towards its target, implying it uses an infrared sensor to find its target. Brig Gen Nasirzadeh was cited in the interview as saying the Qasem Basir also has a new carbon-fibre body that makes it almost invisible to radar. He added that the missile upgrade uses the lessons learned from operations 'True Promise 1' and 'True Promise 2', the missile attacks on Israel on 13–14 April 2024 and 1 October 2024 respectively, and that Iranian experts estimate that Iran's enemies will now only be able to intercept fewer than five of 200–300 missiles launched in a future attack. The Qasem Basir was said to have a range of at least 1,200 km but no figure was given for the size of its warhead. Named after the late Iranian general Qasem Soleimani, the Shahid Haj Qasem was unveiled in August 2020 and reportedly has a range of 1,400 km with a 500 kg warhead.

### Trump calls on Iran to abandon nuclear ambitions, threatens with consequences

The Iranian authorities must make the right decision and abandon the possibility of acquiring nuclear weapons. Otherwise, they will leave the United States with no alternative, US President Donald Trump told reporters at the White House. "This is really crunch time. I would tell you for Iran and, for their country, this is a very important time for Iran. This is the most important time in the history of Iran for Iran, and I hope they do what's right. I'd love to see a peace deal, a strong peace, so they cannot have a nuclear weapon," Trump said. "They [i.e. Iran] have everything you need. The people are incredible. They have vast amounts of oil and assets. We want it to be a successful country," he added. "We don't wanna do anything that's gonna get in

the way of that, but they can't have a nuclear weapon. And if they choose to go a different route, it's gonna be a very sad thing. And and it's something we don't wanna have to do, but we have no choice. They're not gonna have a nuclear weapon," the US president concluded.

# Iran to supply Russia with Fath-360 Ballistic Missile launchers for battlefield use in Ukraine

In a development that signals a deepening strategic alliance between Iran and Russia, Iran is reportedly preparing to deliver Fath 360 tactical surface-to-surface ballistic missile launchers to Russia. This move follows a series of escalating arms transfers that have already reshaped the battlefield dynamics in Ukraine. On May 9, 2025, the international agency press Reuters confirmed that Iranian-made Fath 360 short-range ballistic missiles (SRBMs), are expected to be shipped to Russia in the near future. The significance of this delivery lies not only in the capability of the systems but also in the strategic implications of the growing military cooperation between the two nations amid the ongoing war in Ukraine. Iran and Russia have, over the past years, intensified their military cooperation. Despite earlier denials by both parties, Western intelligence has confirmed that Iran has already supplied Russia with thousands of drones, including the Shahedseries loitering munitions, and artillery shells. The inclusion of tactical ballistic missile systems represents a serious upgrade in the scale and lethality of Iranian assistance. U.S. Army General Christopher

Cavoli, the commander of U.S. Central Command, testified last month before Congress that Iran had donated over 400 short-range ballistic missiles to Russia. Although the specific types were not publicly disclosed at the time, sources now indicate that the Fath 360 is among the systems either delivered or being prepared for imminent deployment. Notably, until now, there have been no confirmed public reports of the Fath-360 being used by Russian forces or integrated into their operational structure.

### Iran says nuclear talks 'difficult but useful', US 'encouraged'

Iran and the United States wrapped up nuclear talks in Oman on Sunday with no apparent breakthrough in a public standoff over enrichment, but with both sides confirming plans for future negotiations. This was the fourth round of talks that began nearly a month ago, marking the highest-level contact between the two foes since Washington withdrew in 2018 from a landmark nuclear deal, during President Donald Trump's first term. Both sides had reported progress in the previous three rounds, and Iran said the meeting was "difficult but useful" while a senior US official said Washington was "encouraged". The official, speaking on condition of anonymity, said Washington was "encouraged by today's outcome and look forward to our next meeting, which

will happen in the near future", without specifying when. In a post on X, Iran's foreign ministry spokesman Esmaeil Baqaei said that the "next round will be coordinated and announced by Oman", which in turn said "the talks will take place once both parties... consult their leaderships". According to the US official, the talks were "both direct and indirect, and lasted over three hours".

### Iran says fourth round of 'difficult' nuclear talks with US ends in Oman

Tehran, Iran – A fourth round of indirect nuclear talks between Iran and the United States has concluded in the Omani capital, Muscat, with Iran's Ministry of Foreign Affairs describing them as "difficult but useful". After about three hours of negotiations on Sunday, spokesman Esmaeil Baghaei described the talks as "difficult but useful talks to better understand each other's positions and to find reasonable and realistic ways to address the differences". Before the talks started, Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi told state media that Iran has a legal right to civilian enrichment of uranium that cannot be subjected to any deal. A landmark 2015 Iran nuclear deal, from which US President Donald Trump withdrew during his first term, allowed Iran to pursue its civilian nuclear activity but put restrictions on uranium enrichment to prevent Tehran

from making a nuclear bomb. "Enrichment is one of the achievements and honours of the Iranian nation. We have paid a heavy price for enrichment. The blood of our nuclear scientists has been spilled for this achievement," he said in reference to scientists assassinated by Israel over the years.

#### Israel is region's greatest threat, says Iranian FM in Doha

Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi has called Israel the "single greatest threat to peace in the region," citing its nuclear arsenal and aggressive regional policies as the root causes of instability in West Asia. Speaking at the Fourth Round of Iranian-Arab Dialogues in Doha, Araghchi condemned the Israeli regime's ongoing military operations in Gaza and expansionist agenda, accusing it pursuing a policy of genocidal erasure against the Palestinian people. "The existence of the Zionist regime remains the most serious threat to regional peace," he said. "Its policies of occupation, apartheid, and undeclared nuclear weapons endanger the entire region, while its American backers remain complicit in these crimes." He dismissed the two-state solution as a "myth" used to delay justice, pointing out that even Israeli officials no longer pretend to support the framework. In the same criticised address, Araghchi Western what he described powers for "unacceptable double standards" regarding nuclear proliferation. He said while Iran's

peaceful nuclear energy program faces constant pressure and accusations, Israel's nuclear arsenal is ignored. "Iran is committed to the international non-proliferation regime and has never sought weapons of mass destruction," Araghchi said. "Yet the West continues to target Iran with sanctions and political pressure while remaining silent on Israel's nuclear stockpile."

### Iran warns nuclear talks could stall if US demands go beyond weapons

Iran warned that nuclear talks with the United States could collapse if Washington insists on what Tehran called "excessive demands," as negotiators from both sides gathered in Oman for a fourth round of indirect discussions. The talks, facilitated by Omani officials and held behind closed doors in Muscat, come amid escalating rhetoric from both capitals and ahead of a high-stakes Middle East trip by US President Donald Trump. Before departing for Muscat, Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi said Tehran had submitted a to proposal intended reassure international community of the peaceful nature of its nuclear activities. He warned, however, that the talks would fail if the United States continues to push beyond nuclear weapon-related commitments. "If demands exceed assurances against nuclear weapons, the talks could stall," Araghchi told reporters in Tehran. "We hope the other side comes with a clear negotiating logic. Talks should remain at the table, not

in the press." He added, "Iran has well-known positions based on clear principles... We hope to reach a decisive stance in Sunday's meeting." Araghchi also accused the United States of adopting contradictory positions. "There are actors pushing for conflict—we understand this, but it is their problem," he said. "If there are concerns, we are ready to build trust."

# U.S. sanctions related to Iranian Nuclear-Related research with potential military applications

The Department of State is sanctioning three Iranian nationals and one Iranian entity with ties to Iran's Organisation of Defensive Innovation and Research, which is known by its Persian acronym, SPND the direct successor organisation to Iran's pre-2004 nuclear weapons program, also referred to as the Amad Project. All individuals sanctioned are involved in activities that materially contribute to, or pose a risk of materially contributing to, the weapons proliferation of of mass destruction. Iran continues to substantially expand its nuclear program and carry out dual-use research and development activities applicable to nuclear weapons and nuclear weapons delivery systems. Iran is the only country in the world without nuclear weapons that is producing uranium enriched to 60 percent and it continues to use front companies and procurement agents to obscure its efforts to acquire dualuse items from foreign suppliers. The

United States' actions are intended to delay and degrade the ability of SPND to conduct nuclear weapons research and development.

### US sanctions 3 Iranians, 1 entity linked to nuclear weapons programme

The US Department of State announced sanctions against three Iranian individuals and one Iranian entity linked to Iran's Organisation of Defensive Innovation and Research (SPND), the successor to the pre-2004 nuclear country's weapons programme, known as the Amad Project. The sanctioned parties were accused of contributing to the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction. Secretary of State Marco Rubio in a statement said, "Today, the Department of State is sanctioning three Iranian nationals and one Iranian entity with ties to Iran's Organisation of Defensive Innovation and Research, which is known by its Persian acronym, SPND - the direct successor organisation to Iran's pre-2004 nuclear weapons programme, also referred to as the Amad Project. ### Iran rejects nuclear suspension, demands guarantees

Iran's Foreign Ministry has rejected calls to suspend its nuclear program, saying that the Islamic Republic will require "guarantees" before agreeing to any nuclear deal. "Without receiving specific commitments, no agreement will be achieved," Foreign Ministry spokesperson Esmail Baghaei. Baghaei ruled out a halt to Iran's nuclear activities, saying, "The suspension of the nuclear program is not under discussion." He reiterated Iran's position that security guarantees are essential for any potential agreement. The comments follow a statement by Deputy Foreign Minister Majid Takht-Ravanchi, who indicated that Tehran may be open to temporary restrictions on its uranium enrichment program as a confidence-building measure. "We have announced that, for a limited period, we can accept certain restrictions regarding the level and capacity enrichment," Takht-Ravanchi told reporters in Tehran. He noted that negotiations remain in the early stages and that no specific details about the limitations have been discussed. "We have not yet reached the stage of determining a specific timeframe enrichment percentage," he said.

#### Tehran would forgo highly enriched uranium in nuclear deal with Trump, Ali Shamkhani

Iran is ready to sign a nuclear deal with certain conditions with President Donald Trump in exchange for lifting economic sanctions, a top adviser to Iran's supreme leader told NBC News. He said Iran would commit to never making nuclear weapons, getting rid of its stockpiles of highly which enriched uranium can weaponised, agree to enrich uranium only to the lower levels needed for civilian use, and allow international inspectors to supervise the process, in exchange for the immediate lifting of all economic sanctions on Iran. # Israel's IAI unveils LORA ballistic missile system with Long-Range precision strike capability

Israel Aerospace Industries (IAI) presented the LORA missile system at DEFEA 2025 in Athens, highlighting its role in long-range precision strike operations as part of a new generation of ground-based artillery capabilities. Designed as a theater-level ballistic missile, LORA (Long Range Artillery) offers states a flexible deterrent option, fitting seamlessly within strategic concepts like Greece's planned 'Achilles Shield'. Its combination of exo-

### Israel discusses JASSM missile procurement with US

Israel's Ministry of Defence (MoD) is reportedly in "advanced talks" with the US to procure Joint Air-to-Surface Standoff Missiles (JASSM) from Lockheed Martin. The MoD refused to comment on the report while Lockheed Martin asked to refer it to the US government, according to the outlet. "Foreign military sales are government-togovernment transactions and we work closely with the US government on any military sales to international customers," Globes quoted the company as saying. "Discussions regarding sales to foreign governments are best addressed by the US government." First inducted in 2009, the air-launched missile has standard and extended range versions. The basic version features a maximum range of about 370 kilometers (230 miles), while the extended range can strike up to 930 kilometers (578 miles) away. The missile's 450-kilogram (992 pound) blast fragmentation warhead allows it to damage heavily defended ground targets such as command and control posts and air defence systems. Though the missile is unlikely to cause any damage to Iran's deeply-buried nuclear sites in a potential conflict, it would provide an additional option to the Israeli Air Force to strike certain targets from a stand-off range.

### Trump no longer demanding Saudis recognise Israel for nuclear deal with US

The United States is no longer demanding Saudi Arabia normalise ties with Israel as a condition for progress on civil nuclear cooperation talks, two sources with knowledge of the matter told Reuters ahead of US President Donald Trump's visit to Riyadh next week. Dropping the demand that Saudi Arabia establish diplomatic relations with Israel would be a major concession by Washington. Under former US president Joe Biden, nuclear talks were an element of a wider US-Saudi deal tied to normalisation and Riyadh's goal of a defence treaty with Washington. The kingdom has repeatedly said it would not recognise Israel without a guarantee of a viable path to a Palestinian state, frustrating Biden administration attempts to expand the Abraham Accords signed during Trump's first term. Under those accords, the United Arab Emirates, Bahrain and Morocco normalized relations with Israel. Progress toward Saudi recognition of Israel has been halted by fury in Arab countries over the war raging in Gaza. The nuclear talks had also stumbled over Washington's non-proliferation concerns.

### Israel intercepts missile launched by Yemen's Houthis

Air raid sirens were heard in Israel as a missile was launched towards the territory by Yemen's Houthis, who say they are retaliating against Israeli sites in solidarity with Palestinians in Gaza. Israel's military said it intercepted the projectile using its air defence systems. There were no reports of injuries or damage from the missile attack, according to a military statement. The incident came days after Oman said it mediated a ceasefire deal between the United States and the Houthis, with the Yemeni group saying the agreement did not

Israeli Defence Minister Israel Katz said that Israel would respond forcefully in Yemen and "wherever necessary", describing the Houthi missiles as "Iranian".

### Lebanon warns Hamas against attacks threatening nation's security

Lebanon's top security body has warned the Palestinian group Hamas against using the country's territory for acts that could undermine national security, after rocket fire towards Israel led to counterstrikes. The Higher Defence Council issued the warning on Friday as Lebanon faces growing United States pressure to disarm groups outside state control, following a 14-month war between Israel and the armed Lebanese group Hezbollah, an ally of Hamas. Lebanese authorities are also trying to establish their authority throughout the country, particularly in the south near the border with Israel. Israel has violated the US-brokered November 2024 agreement on a near-daily basis, according to Lebanese authorities, including three air attacks on the capital Beirut. In a statement, the council headed by President Joseph Aoun said Lebanon must not be used as a launchpad for instability or be dragged into unnecessary wars. It added that "the utmost measures and necessary procedures will be taken to put a definitive end to any act that violates Lebanese sovereignty." Aoun, who previously served as army commander, has pledged to bring all weapons in the country under the state's authority, but has admitted that disarming Hezbollah, which the US has been pressuring Lebanon to do, is a "delicate" matter.

### Round four of talks in Oman: Will this be Iran's nuclear breakthrough?

"No sovereign nation negotiates its deterrence capabilities under duress," stated Reza Talebnia, spokesperson for Iran's Defense Ministry.

### Iran's FM visits Saudi Arabia, Qatar before nuclear talks with US in Oman

The negotiations between Iran and the US, primarily focused on Iran's nuclear program, started last month with Omani mediation amid an escalation of tensions.

### From rubble to rebirth: A model for Syria's reconstruction

Almost six months have passed since Bashar al-Assad's regime fell in Syria. The most notable event of this transitional phase was the establishment of a new Syrian government in late March 2025, consisting of twenty-three ministers from different backgrounds. The new government has inherited the aftermath of more than five decades of authoritarian rule, compounded by the devastating consequences of nearly fourteen years of armed conflict. In addition, Syria continues to grapple with the impact of harsh international sanctions, which were imposed in response to the al-Assad regime's widespread human rights violations. These challenges have rendered Syria a fragile state, with its institutions on the verge of total collapse. However, the fall of the dictatorial regime and the formation of a new government offer an opportunity to begin rebuilding state institutions. Whether this new Damascus can seize this opportunity relies on four key pillars: achieving security and political stability, fostering inclusive political participation, establishing justice as a precondition for sustainable peace, and lifting sanctions to prevent the resurgence of violence.

#### Turkish Navy Commander confirms plan to develop nuclear-powered submarines after actual Reis-class

As reported by TurDef on May 1, 2025, in an interview with Warships International Fleet Review, Admiral Ercüment Tatlıoğlu, Commander of the Turkish Naval Forces, has declared: "We will also take a crucial step towards constructing nuclear-powered submarines, essential for our long-term submarine deterrence capability and vision of being a mid-scale power with global influence." The statement was made in the context of Türkiye's broader development plans and ongoing submarine construction programs at Gölcük Shipyard. The foundation for these plans is being developed in parallel with Türkiye's civilian nuclear energy program. The Akkuyu Nuclear Power Plant, currently under construction in Mersin Province, is being built by Russia's state-owned Rosatom under a build-own-operate (BOO) model. The facility includes four VVER-1200 pressurised water reactors, each with capacity of 1,200 megawatts. Construction began in 2018. The first unit is expected to become operational in 2025, and the remaining units are scheduled for

2028. fully completion by Once operational, the plant is projected to meet approximately 10% of Türkiye's total electricity demand. The BOO model has raised concerns within NATO circles due to the facility's full foreign ownership and its proximity to strategic sites such as the Incirlik Air Base and NATO's ballistic missile defense radar at Kürecik. Turkish authorities have contingency plans to assume control of the plant in scenarios where national security considerations require such measures.

#### Turkish president says power generation from Akkuyu Nuclear Plant to start by year's end

Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan announced Friday a major step forward in the country's energy sector and its first nuclear power plant. "By the end of this year, we will begin trial production and deliver the first electricity from Akkuyu (Nuclear Power Plant)," Erdogan said at the Istanbul Natural Resources Summit. With the completion of the other reactors, the Akkuyu Nuclear Power Plant is expected to operate at full capacity in 2028, he stated. The president emphasised Türkiye's role in addressing global energy particularly in light of Europe's ongoing energy challenges. "We have undertaken numerous initiatives to contribute to regional energy security in order to help ease the energy crisis faced by European

Erdogan countries," said. "Türkiye's emergence as a safe haven during Europe's crises is by no means a coincidence," he added. The president also signaled the final stages of the ambitious project, which began in 2017: "The construction of the first reactor of the Akkuyu Nuclear Power Plant is nearing completion." In addition to nuclear advances, Erdogan also touched on the country's resource efforts abroad. "We aim to begin the first production this year at one of the gold fields in Niger for which we obtained a license," he said.

#### **US Approves \$1.4B Weapons Sale to UAE**

US officials said Monday the State Department has authorised the sale of \$1.4 billion worth of military aircraft and equipment to the United Arab Emirates, ahead of President Donald Trump's visit this week. The proposed sale to the Gulf state involves six CH-47F Chinook helicopters and other equipment for \$1.32 billion that would "support the foreign policy and national security of the United States," officials from the State Department Bureau of Political-Military Affairs said in a statement. "The UAE will use these assets in search and rescue, disaster relief, humanitarian support, and counterterrorism operations," they said. "The United Arab Emirates is a vital US partner for political stability and economic progress in the

Middle East." Trump is scheduled to visit the oil-rich states of Saudi Arabia, Qatar and the UAE this week to discuss diplomatic needs on Gaza and Iran, along with major business deals that could touch on anything from defence and aviation to energy and artificial intelligence. In addition to the helicopters, the State Department has approved the sale of \$130 million in F-16 fighter jet components. In a separate release, State Department officials said the F-16 parts would improve the UAE's "ability to defend its sovereignty and territorial integrity to meet its national defence requirements."

### Iran proposes partnership with UAE and Saudi Arabia to enrich uranium

Iran has floated the idea of a consortium of Middle Eastern countries – including Iran, Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) – to enrich uranium, in a effort to overcome US objections to its continued enrichment programme, The Guardian reports. The proposal is seen as a way of locking Gulf states into supporting Iran's position that it should be allowed to retain enrichment capabilities. Tehran views the proposal as a concession, since it would be giving neighbouring states access to its technological knowledge and making them stakeholders in the process. It is not clear if Abbas Araghchi, the Iranian foreign minister, made the proposal in relatively brief three-hour talks with the US in Oman on Sunday, the fourth set of such talks, but the proposal is reportedly circulating in Tehran. After the talks, Araghchi flew to

Dubai where he spoke to the UAE's foreign minister, Sheikh Abdullah bin Zayed Al Nahyan. The UAE currently does not enrich uranium for its own nuclear programme. The consortium would be based on Iranian facilities with enrichment returned to the 3.67% levels set out in the original 2015 nuclear deal between Tehran and six world powers, which Donald Trump unilaterally ended in 2018.

### Israel bombs Yemen's Hodeidah port after attack near Tel Aviv airport

The Israeli military says it has carried out air strikes on Yemen's Hodeidah port and a cement factory, claiming the sites were used to support Houthi operations against Israel. The strikes injured at least 21 people, the Houthi-run health ministry spokesman Anees al-Asbahi said. According to the fighter Israeli army, iets struck infrastructure linked to the Houthis. including a cement factory east of Hodeidah that it described as "an important economic resource" used in building tunnels and military infrastructure. "The Hodeidah seaport serves as a hub for the transfer of Iranian weapons and equipment for military needs," the Israeli army said in a statement. The claim could not be independently verified. Houthi-run Al Masirah TV reported that six Israeli strikes hit Hodeidah's port and blamed both Israel and the United States. Axios quoted a senior US official who said the air raids were coordinated between Israel and the

US. A US defence source told Al Jazeera that "US forces did not participate in the Israeli strikes on Yemen today" but did not deny nonlethal support may have been provided.
