China's Tianwen-3 Mars sample-return mission targeted for 2031; drone to be deployed for remote sampling: chief scientist

China aims to launch the Tianwen-3 Mars mission by 2028, with sample return targeted for 2031, according to chief scientist Hou Zengqian. Unlike Tianwen-1, which used a rover, this mission will deploy a drone for collecting samples remotely, minimizing contamination risks from the probe's landing. Hou, who is also an academician from the Chinese Academy of Sciences (CAS) shared the information in a recently published interview with the China Science Daily. According to Hou, the mission's preliminary design includes three sampling methods: surface soil shoveling, deep drilling, and drone-assisted grabbing, to ensure sample diversity and scientific value of the samples.

Pentagon reliant on Chinese suppliers and 'not prepared' for war, report warns

The US defence industrial base remains dependent on Chinese suppliers despite efforts to decouple – and that raises concerns over war readiness, according to a report by data analytics firm Govini. Chinese firms still made up 9.3 per cent of the primary contractors, or Tier 1 suppliers, involved in major US defence programmes across nine critical sectors in 2024, Govini said in its annual National Security Scorecard. "The United States is not prepared for the war that we may have to enter if China said, 'today is the day'," said Tara Dougherty, chief executive of the Washington-based defence acquisition information firm.

China's asteroid probe Tianwen-2 has captured images of the Earth and moon, which the China National Space Administration (CNSA) released. The CNSA said that the narrow-field-of-view navigation sensor equipped on the probe recently captured the images of Earth and the moon, demonstrating good functional performance. The images released include a photograph of Earth obtained by Tianwen-2 when it was approximately 590,000 kilometers away from the planet, as well as a new photograph of the moon captured when it was about the same distance from the moon. After the images were transmitted back to the ground, they were processed and produced by scientific researchers.

The 3D-printed Minimalist Lightweight Micro Turbojet Engine, which was developed independently by the Aero Engine Corporation of China (AECC), successfully completed its first flight test in North China's Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region, AECC announced on its official WeChat account. According to the AECC, the engine is the first of its kind in China to complete a flight test, with a thrust level of 160 kilograms. The engine, which utilized multidisciplinary topological optimization and additive manufacturing technology, represents a revolutionary integration and innovation in aviation engine design and manufacturing processes, filling a domestic gap in the full-scale engineering application of this technology.

2 Chinese nationals charged with spying inside the US for Beijing, Justice Department says

Two Chinese nationals have been charged with spying inside the United States on behalf of Beijing, including by taking photographs of a naval base, coordinating a cash dead-drop and participating in efforts to recruit members of the military who they thought might be open to working for Chinese intelligence. The case, filed in federal court in San Francisco, is the latest Justice Department prosecution to target what officials say are persistent efforts by the Chinese government to secretly collect intelligence about American military capabilities — a practice laid bare in startling fashion two years ago with China's launching of a surveillance balloon that U.S. officials ultimately shot down over the coast of South Carolina.

China's first satellite-to-satellite refuelling test appears to be imminent after a second round of close-proximity operations between two probes in high orbit. The landmark Chinese mission will be one of the most ambitious attempts at autonomous satellite servicing in geostationary orbit, which rival the United States has yet to achieve. On June 30, the Shijian-21 and Shijian-25 spacecraft – both orbiting at an altitude of 35,786km (22,236 miles) above the equator – came within extremely close range after days of closing in on each other, according to Swiss space surveillance firm s2a Systems.

The deal with Vietnam lowers tariffs on Hanoi's exports from a threatened 46 per cent to 20 per cent, but retains a 40 per cent levy on "trans-shipping" of goods — widely believed to be aimed at Chinese re-exports to the US. The agreement, announced, is the second seen as targeting China since President Donald Trump outlined his "liberation day" increases in tariffs on April 2.

Graduates from Hangzhou's Zhejiang University, where DeepSeek's founder studied, have become sought-after employees at Chinese tech companies. Liangzhu is a quiet suburb of the southern Chinese city of Hangzhou, which is a hot spot for entrepreneurs and tech talent lured by low rents and proximity to tech companies like Alibaba and DeepSeek.

Italy arrests alleged Chinese hacker wanted by US for industrial espionage

Italian authorities have arrested a Chinese citizen suspected of being linked to a state-sponsored hacking group that sought to steal Covid-19 vaccine secrets from the US at the height of the pandemic in 2020. Xu Zewei was arrested at Milan's Malpensa airport on July 3 after an international warrant was issued by the US, Italian police confirmed. The 33-year-old Chinese national was suspected of being linked to a Chinese government-backed hacking group known as Hafnium that was accused of penetrating Microsoft email software in 2021 in a mass espionage campaign, a person familiar with the matter said.

Besides its civilian applications, BeiDou provides navigation and positioning services to all branches of the Chinese military with even higher precision in the Asia-Pacific than GPS offers the US military.

Tianzhou-8 cargo craft re-enters atmosphere

China's Tianzhou-8 cargo craft has re-entered the atmosphere in a controlled manner, according to the China Manned Space Agency (CMSA). Most of the spacecraft's components burned up during the re-entry, and a small amount of its debris fell into the scheduled safe waters, said the CMSA. Launched on Nov. 15, 2024 from the Wenchang Spacecraft Launch Site in the southern island province of Hainan, the Tianzhou-8 was loaded with supplies for astronauts, propellants, and devices for applications and experiments. The Tianzhou-8 separated from the orbiting Tiangong space station combination and then entered its independent flight phase.

China denies giving Iran air defence systems after conflict with Israel

China has denied transferring surface-to-air missile batteries to Iran following Israel's attacks on the Islamic Republic last month. Citing an Arab official familiar with the intelligence, the British-based platform Middle East Eye reported that Chinese air defence equipment had been sent to Iran after it struck a truce with Israel last month. One source told the platform that China – the biggest recipient of Iran's oil exports – had received payment in oil shipments, but the report did not say how many surface-to-air missile systems Iran had received since the end of the fighting.

Ukraine detains Chinese father-son duo for alleged espionage

Ukraine said it had detained a Chinese father and son, both suspected of spying on its prized Neptune anti-ship missile programme, a key part of Kyiv's growing domestic arms industry critical to its defence against Russian invaders. The announcement by the Security Service of Ukraine (SBU) follows assertions by Kyiv in recent months that Beijing, which has sought to project an image of neutrality, is helping the Kremlin's war effort. Counter-intelligence officials

arrested a 24-year-old former student in Kyiv after they provided him with "technical documentation" related to Neptune production, it said in a statement.

CAS unveils findings from lunar samples retrieved by Chang'e-6 mission, sheds light on evolutionary history of moon's far side

The findings of the four studies were published as cover articles in the international academic journal Nature, according to the CAS. China said it had cracked three spying plots, including one in which a public servant was lured by the "seductive beauty" of a foreign agent, urging government workers to remain vigilant against overseas threats. Beijing has stepped up espionage warnings in recent years as relations with the United States and other Western nations have worsened. Its Ministry of State Security (MSS) said that foreign spies "have been increasingly active in infiltrating and stealing secrets from China" and were targeting public officials. "Individual officials have caused the damaging effects of leaking secrets due to a lack of belief, a weakened sense of discipline and a loosened awareness of rules... harming national security and interests," the MSS said.
