At China's Victory Day parade last week, President Xi Jinping warned that the world stands at a crossroads – between peace and war. He urged nations to learn from history to prevent a repeat of the catastrophe that engulfed the world eight decades ago. Xi used the SCO summit to launch the Global Governance Initiative, clearly aimed at countering Trump's approach and reaffirming China's commitment to the rule of law as the foundation of international relations. Together with existing initiatives – the Global Development Initiative, Global Security Initiative and Global Civilisation Initiative – the Global Governance Initiative forms a broader framework to build a global governance system grounded in multilateral cooperation, development equity and sovereign equality.

NASA bans Chinese nationals from working on its space programmes

US space agency Nasa has blocked Chinese citizens with valid US visas from its facilities - a move that effectively bars them from working at one of the most respected space research centres. Chinese nationals, who could only work at Nasa as contractors or students contributing to research, found out on 5 September that they had lost all access to Nasa's systems and facilities, Bloomberg reported, citing sources. Nasa then confirmed this, saying Chinese nationals would be restricted from using the agency's "facilities, materials and networks to ensure the security of our work".

China's Long March-10 carrier rocket passes second static fire test

China successfully organized and carried out the second static fire test of the Long March-10 carrier rocket, the country's new-generation manned launch vehicle, in Wenchang Spacecraft Launch Site in South China's Hainan Province, marking a phased breakthrough in the prototype development of the Long March 10 series carrier rockets, according to the China Manned Space Agency (CMSA). The test lasted for 320 seconds. So far, the two planned static fire tests have been completed. These tests have fully verified the performance of the first-stage seven-engine power system of the rocket and the correctness and reliability of the work procedure design for the recovery phase, the CMSA said in a statement it provided to the Global Times.

AI could cut a submarine's survival chance to 5%: Chinese defence scientists

A new defence industry study from China suggests that artificial intelligence (AI) could soon make it extremely hard – even nearly impossible – for submarines to survive in a future naval conflict. The research, published in the peer-reviewed journal Electronics Optics & Control and led by senior engineer Meng Hao with the China Helicopter Research and Development Institute in August, unveiled for the first time an advanced AI-driven anti-submarine warfare (ASW) system capable of hunting even the quietest submarines through intelligent, real-time decision-making.

China successfully conducts first-stage propulsion system test for Tianlong-3 rocket

This aerial drone photo taken on Sept. 15, 2025, shows a first-stage propulsion system test for the Tianlong-3 liquid carrier rocket conducted on an offshore launch pad at the Haiyang Oriental Aerospace Port in east China's Shandong Province. A first-stage propulsion system test for the Tianlong-3 large liquid-propellant carrier rocket was successfully held here. Independent development of the Tianlong-3 rocket began in March 2022 by Chinese commercial aerospace company Space Pioneer. The rocket is 72 meters in length with a takeoff mass of 600 tonnes. Its first stage is equipped with nine "Tianhuo-12" engines operating in parallel. The rocket has a low-Earth orbit carrying capacity of 17-22 tonnes, and a sun-synchronous orbit capacity of 10-17 tonnes.

New Proofpoint research identified that China-aligned cyber espionage group TA415 has intensified its operations targeting U.S.-China economic relations, particularly within the

semiconductor sector. Between March and June 2025, Proofpoint observed multiple spear-phishing campaigns aimed at Taiwanese semiconductor organizations, including manufacturers, designers, and supply chain entities. The group employed job application lures, delivering malware such as Cobalt Strike and the custom Voldemort backdoor.

China bans tech companies from buying Nvidia's AI chips

China's internet regulator has banned the country's biggest technology companies from buying Nvidia's artificial intelligence chips, as Beijing steps up efforts to boost its domestic industry and compete with the US. The Cyberspace Administration of China (CAC) told companies, including ByteDance and Alibaba, this week to end their testing and orders of the RTX Pro 6000D, Nvidia's tailor-made product for the country, according to three people with knowledge of the matter. Several companies had indicated they would order tens of thousands of the RTX Pro 6000D, and had started testing and verification work with Nvidia's server suppliers, the people said.

Chinese naval researchers have detailed plans to construct a multilayered defence architecture designed to protect warships from saturation attacks by up to thousands of low-cost drones, responding to what they call an existential threat amplified by accessible commercial technology. The proposed "counter-swarm system", likened by some experts to a digital-age Great Wall, would integrate satellites, AI-powered sensors and radical new weapons – including hypersonic missiles, lasers and microwave beams showcased in Beijing's recent military parade – to detect, disrupt and destroy drone fleets before they reach their targets.

China conducts tethered balloon experiment, offering new insights into Qinghai-Tibet Plateau ecosystem

Chinese scientists recently carried out the "Jimu-1" tethered balloon atmospheric observation experiment in Lulang, Nyingchi, southwest China's Xizang Autonomous Region, which is expected to provide a new perspective for unraveling the mysteries of the Qinghai-Tibet Plateau ecosystem. The tethered balloon was equipped with 16 types of scientific payloads with a total weight of approximately 200 kilograms. It successfully ascended to an altitude of 5,500 meters. Through coordinated multi-payload observations, the experiment achieved a technological leap from single-point sampling to three-dimensional monitoring, according to the Aerospace Information Research Institute (AIR) of the Chinese Academy of Sciences, the major developer of the tethered balloon.

Donald Trump and Xi Jinping to meet in South Korea as US president hails TikTok deal

Donald Trump said he would meet Xi Jinping in South Korea next month and travel to China for a summit early next year, as the two leaders agreed their first meeting since 2019. In a post on Truth Social after a call between the leaders on Friday, Trump said he and Xi had approved a deal that would enable TikTok to continue operating in the US. Congress last year passed a law requiring ByteDance, the Chinese owner of TikTok, to divest the app to avoid a nationwide ban. China's Xinhua news agency said the call was "positive" but did not confirm that the leaders had struck a deal on TikTok, referring to "consultations between the two teams to properly resolve the TikTok issue".

How deadly is CJ-1000, world's first hypersonic plane killer? PLA war game gives hint

Amid the roar of China's military parade on September 3, a few trucks rolled through Tiananmen Square with camouflaged loads tagged "CJ-1000". The trucks were hauling surface-launched hypersonic cruise missiles also known as Long Sword-1000s – weapons designed for ultra-long-range strikes on "system-node targets on the ground, at sea or in the air", according to Chinese state media. China has not officially disclosed the detailed specifications of the CJ-1000. Though a new weapon must pass many rounds of field tests before entering service, no test results have yet been published by the authorities.

Parliament vulnerable to 'foreign actors' after China spying charges dropped, Commons speaker says

The UK parliament has been left vulnerable to "foreign actors" after charges against two men suspected of spying for China were dropped, the speaker of the House of Commons has warned. Christopher Cash, 30, and Christopher Berry, 33, had denied accusations of providing information prejudicial to the interests of the state in breach of the Official Secrets Act between December 2021 and February 2023. Cash worked as a parliamentary researcher and was director of the China Research Group. He was closely linked to then senior Tories, including the former security minister Tom Tugendhat and Alicia Kearns.
