The inbuilt flexibility and dynamism of modern democracies demand new roles for administrative officials. Further, constitutions are extending their mandates to meet the emerging challenges, thus helping citizens to maximise their potential. To this end, public administration is being revamped for achieving minimum government and maximum governance so as to fulfill the ideal of Good Governance, according to *Sudhanshu Tripathi*.

# BLACK SWAN EVENTS IN THE FOREIGN POLICY OF INDIA

India as an independent sovereign nation-state began its journey in August 1947 after being released from the yoke of the British Raj. In the more than seven decades that have elapsed since then, many ideologies have influenced the foreign policy of India. India takes interest in the region; its major concerns include energy, security, trade investment, infrastructure development, and the fight against Islamic fundamentalism. *Saurabh Dalal* shows how Central Asia is a geopolitical chessboard and which powers are playing a major role.

# DECOLONISING TECHNOLOGY A CRITICAL PERSPECTIVE FROM THE GLOBAL SOUTH

Digital colonialism is a looming concern in the compressed world of today, generating a complex array of disjuncture and difference. Globalisation of technology has disproportionately affected the population of least developed countries, including the Black, indigenous and female population. In the wake of the vertical flow of information technologies, technocratic imperialism is waxing in strength. Developing countries like India underscore the fact that the economy of the internet is increasingly dominated by the giant Western corporations, leading to an inequitable sharing of its economic benefits. The communication process should facilitate critical reflection to unveil the distortions. *Akanksha Singh* adopts a mixed method and a qualitative approach, based on a detailed contemporary analysis.

Yossef Ben-Meir describes the programme of Moroccan agricultural development through fruit tree planting that he is carrying out, as President of the High Atlas Foundation. This initiative relies on inter-religious and inter-cultural dialogue and cooperation to improve mutual understanding and raise living standards in underprivileged rural communities of the North African nation.

# ISRAEL AND PALESTINE IN WORLD TRADE ASSESSING THE ECONOMIC CONSEQUENCES AND OPPORTUNITIES

The Israeli-Palestinian conflict has not only maintained political tensions, but also had profound economic effects that have affected the development and integration of both entities into the global business environment. Israel and Palestine have strategic geographic locations, skilled labour and innovative industries that could drive economic growth and promote prosperity if effectively utilised. *Gedam Kamalakar* points out projects such as joint industrial zones, cross-border infrastructure development and regional trade agreements have the potential to strengthen economic interdependence, build trust between communities and create an enabling environment for sustainable development. By removing political obstacles, fostering dialogue and supporting inclusive economic development initiatives, stakeholders can unlock the economic potential of Israel and Palestine.

Indian sports and cuisine are often considered underrated tools of Indian soft power due to a combination of strategic oversight, cultural fragmentation, and the dominance of other global narratives according to *Kriti*. India's foreign policy has focused on economic growth, military strength, and technological advancements, sidelining the cultural potential of sports and food in shaping perceptions. While cricket is hugely popular in most Commonwealth member counties, especially through the Indian Premier League (IPL), it has not been effectively integrated into India's broader diplomatic strategy. Similarly, Indian cuisine, despite its global appeal, remains regionally fragmented with no unified approach to showcase it internationally.
